THE KELLY CEMETERY By Mark J. Lynn

Situated on a knoll, overlooking Lake Katherine in one of Columbia's most exclusive residential neighborhoods, is the Kelly Cemetery. For nearly two hundred years it has been the burying ground for the descendants of Thomas Harwell, an eighteenth century Richland County pioneer. On July 16, 1784, he purchased a 640 acre tract, containing an area of land that presently consists of the Deaswood Subdivision, the entire northwest shore of Lake Katherine, along with parts of Forest Acres and Fort Jackson. Harwell settled his family on this land, and created a homestead. Some time later, according to family tradition, he accidentally shot and killed his sister, whom he then buried on a part of his land. Thus began the Kelly Cemetery.

The name of Kelly became associated with this cemetery when, following Harwell's death in 1808, the portion of his land that contained the cemetery was inherited by his daughter, Sarah Harwell Kelly. The early graves are located in the southwest comer, below three large trees. They are all unmarked, as the earliest original marker in the cemetery dates only to the 1860's. This small plot of land soon grew into the common burial ground for the rapidly expanding heirs of Thomas Harwell. Sarah Harwell Kelly died in the 1840's leaving this part of the land to her son, James Kelly. He would build a home and raise his family about a hundred yards north of the cemetery, on what was called Kelly Hill. He later divided up his land between three sons. The cemetery, as well as the home, was given to the youngest son, Benjamin E. Kelly in 1876. There he would also raise his children and some grandchildren, until his death in 1914. On October 21, 1913. shortly before his death, Benjamin separated the cemetery from the rest of his property, and deeded it over to three trustees; James J. Devereux, Patrick Devereux, and Claudius B. Dreher. The cemetery was also expanded at this time, growing in size from a half acre to three fourths of an acre. By the 1930's, Dreher was the last surviving trustee. He would then appoint three successors in, his son. Claudius B. Dreher, Jr., William Henry Bowers H. and Bennie B. Daniels. During the 1950's, the surrounding area was transformed from rural woodlands into an upscale neighborhood. A brick wall was erected around the cemetery at this time, replacing an old wire fence that had been put up in the 1920's. The following decades of the 1960's and 1970's, saw several attempts to do away with, or move the cemetery. Vandalism also struck during this time, with many of the old tombstones being broken, knocked over, or stolen. An iron entrance gate to the cemetery was also stolen. Metal Confederate Crosses disappeared in the mid-1980's. The cemetery fell into neglect, and several disputes over control occured over the past two decades. By 1997, Claudius B. Dreher, Jr., like his father before him, was the last surviving trustee. When another dispute occured early that year. Dreher called a meeting of family members to discuss the future of the cemetery. A second meeting was held a month later, when Dreher appointed three new trustees; Mark J. Lynn, Wyman M. Looney, and Douglas K. Pratt. The thirty two family members present endorsed this choice, and then voted to make several other decisions, including one to hold annual meetings. Since that time great efforts have been made to restore and maintain the cemetery. Several massive cleanups were conducted, as well as efforts to locate, identify, and mark previously unmarked graves. Eighteen new markers have been placed in the past year and a half. Interest within the family has also increased, as fifty three members attended the 1998 cemetery meeting. Finally, it should be noted that this is indeed a family cemetery, and that every person buried there, except the Reed / Walker Family buried together on the eastern side, are descendants of Thomas Harwell by blood, or marriage. There are several stories about a few other non-family members buried in unmarked graves, but these are hard to substantiate. The Kelly Cemetery remains today as it was two hundred years ago, the burying ground for the heirs of Thomas Harwell.
