Thank you for helping me with the questions about the Kennedy family. I am joining the Fairfield County Genealogical Society so I can learn more about this huge family. Enclosed is an application form with fee for membership.

I have tracked Alexander Kennedy and family from Ayrshire, Scotland to County Antrim, Ireland to Charleston, South Carolina in December 1763 or 1764. From there, they moved on to Fairfield County to settle and raise families. A Brief Outline of Benjamin Franklin, Kadar, and Creighton Kennedy

Benjamin Franklin Kennedy was born about 1806 in Georgia. I think his father may have been James Kennedy born 1775, but that is just a guess. This family seemed to follow the sun because as Indians were removed, white settlers such as the Kennedy family moved in as land developers and planters. My Kennedy family moved from Georgia to Alabama, to Escambia County, Florida, back again to Alabama and finally to Smith County, Mississippi.

Benjamin Franklin Kennedy married at least three times, maybe four, His wife, Harriet Dampier, was the mother of my great grandfather, Kada Hawthorne Kennedy.

Kada Hawthorne [sometimes shown as Kadar Herrington] Kennedy was born in Alabama. During the CIVIL War, he served in Company A, 8th Mississippi Infantry. He married Laura Potelear Ward in 1865 in Vicksburg, Mississippi. They had seven children one of whom was my grandfather, Creighton Kennedy

Creighton Kennedy was born 1879 in Smith County, Mississippi. He married Hettie Ann Word. in Smith County and they had six children. One was my father, William DeWitt Kennedy. Creighton worked for the Illinois-Central Railroad and was transferred to Tangipahoa Parish, Louisiana. It was here that my father and his siblings grew up in a happy home. They became teachers, civil engineers and a naval officer.

Creighton died in 1933 and Hettie Ann died in 1957. Both are buried in the Village of Tangipahoa Cemetery.

I have recorded all of my peer cousins and their immediate families... But, the list grows too long so I am leaving further record keeping to each family. I am willing to share my information.

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BACKGROUND

of

CRAIG – KENNEDY CEMETERY

The Craig Cemetery is thought to be the original homestead of Alexander Kennedy.

On July 2, 1769, Alexander Kennedy was granted one hundred acres in Craven County on a Branch of Cedar Creek. The land was probably near the present town of Ridgeway, South Carolina and in the County of Fairfield. At the time, Alexander Kennedy was about 26 years of age, having been born in County Antrim, Ireland on December 6, 1743.

At around the age of 31, Alexander Kennedy married Agnes Fears, age 20, in Fairfield County, South Carolina. Agnes Fears was the sister of Nancy Jane Fears who married Alexander Rosborough.

During the American Revolution, Alexander Kennedy, age 39, served for 86 days in the South Carolina Militia during 1781 and 1782. He was a private stationed at the Congarees. He also made saddles for the horsemen in the South Carolina Militia. Alexander served as a Private under Colonel Thomas Taylor, Captain James Craig, Captain John Miles, and Captain William Robertson. Alexander Kennedy received a payment for his service in the Militia on January 21, 1790 totaling 1,200 pounds, 15 shillings, and 5 pence.

Alexander Kennedy and Agnes Fears Kennedy had ten children.

Mary Kennedy (October 22, 1783 – April 4, 1853), daughter of Alexander Kennedy, married Robert Washington Craig (November 16, 1786 – August 1, 1836), on December 22, 1808. Robert Washington Craig was the second son of Captain James and Jenny Bell Craig.

Mary Kennedy and Robert Washington Craig lived on Mill Creek in Fairfield County where he farmed until the death of her mother, Agnes Fears Kennedy, in 1824. Upon the death of her mother, Mary Kennedy and her husband went to live with her father, Alexander Kennedy on Cedar Creek. Two years later, in 1826, Alexander Kennedy died.

At the death of her father, Alexander Kennedy, Mary Kennedy Craig and her husband, Robert W. Craig, came into possession of the Kennedy homestead.

Mary Kennedy Craig and her husband, Robert W. Craig, continued to live at the Kennedy homestead and farm the land until the day of his death, August 1, 1836.

After the death of Robert W. Craig, the division of the Kennedy homestead fell to his widow, Mary Kennedy Craig, and their son, Arthur Kennedy Craig, who later bought out his mother's interest of the homestead.

Mary Kennedy Craig's son, Arthur Kennedy Craig, was married to Margaret Emeline Rosborough who was the daughter of Alexander and Cynthia Neil Rosborough. He was one of the first elders of Aimwell Presbyterian Church in Ridgeway, South Carolina.

Mary Kennedy Craig continued to live at the homestead with her son, Arthur Kennedy Craig, and his family, until the death of her son in law, Alexander George Kennedy in December, 1852.

After the death of her son in law, Alexander George Kennedy in December, 1852, Mary Kennedy Craig, went to live with her widowed daughter, Mary Ellen Craig Kennedy.

Mary Kennedy Craig lived with her daughter, Mary Ellen Craig Kennedy, until the time of her death, April 4, 1853.

Arthur Kennedy Craig and his wife, Margaret Emeline Rosborough Craig, continued to live at the Kennedy homestead until January, 1854, when they moved to Ridgeway, South Carolina. At that time, Arthur Kennedy Craig was made agent of the Charlotte and Columbia Railroad which at that time had not been completed even as far as Charlotte.

In 1875, Arthur Kennedy Craig moved to Blackstock, South Carolina, where he lived until his death, December 3, 1879.

Both Arthur Kennedy Craig and his wife, Margaret Emeline Rosborough Craig are buried in the Craig - Kennedy Cemetery.

THOMPSON FAMILY NOTES

The three Thompson brothers of the Jackson's Creek Community in the early 1800's, namely James Thompson, Alexander Thompson and William Thompson, were sons of John and (Jane Young?) Thompson. The author has reviewed the will of John Thompson (undated but written around 1800). The will mentions the following family:

Wife: Not mentioned - must have been deceased.

Sons: James Thompson (oldest), Alexander Thompson, and William Thompson (youngest)

Daughter: Elizabeth Thompson

Grandson: John Alexander Thompson (son of Alexander)

The author believes (with apologies to a dear friend of my family, the late Rev. Ludwig A. Beckman, author of the "Thompson Family History") that the wife of Alexander Thompson was Isabella Cameron, not Isabella Campbell. She was probably the daughter of Simon and Isobel (Isabella) Cameron of Jackson's Creek. Simon Cameron was apparently the brother of James Cameron, Joseph Cameron, and perhaps Andrew Cameron, all early Fairfield County residents. The author believes Isabella Thompson was a Cameron for the following reasons:

- (1) She would have had her mother's name.
- (2) Simon and Isobel Cameron were witnesses to the will of John Thompson (father of Alexander).
- (3) James and William Thompson lived next to Simon Cameron in the 1800 census.
- (4) In 1810, Alexander Thompson was apparently living on Simon Cameron's place. (He was probably deceased).
- (5) The second son of Alexander Thompson was Simon Thompson (1807-1828).
- (6) Alexander Thompson's daughter, Jane Young Thompson, married Andrew Y. Hanna (noted previously). They had a son who died early named Simon A. Hanna (August 1826-September 13, 1836).
- (7) John Alexander Thompson (son of Alexander) and Sarah Rebecca (Yongue) Thompson had a son named Simon Leroy Thompson (June 30, 1840-September 28, 1875).

John Thompson willed his plantation in Laurens County (where the Thompsons first lived after immigrating from Ireland) to his oldest son, James Thompson. After Isabella Thompson died, Alexander Thompson married Dorothea (Herron) Thompson, widow of his nephew, Alexander Rogers Thompson. She survived him.

John Alexander Thompson (August 4, 1800 - September 18, 1875) and Sarah Rebecca (Yongue) Thompson are both buried at Bethsalem cemetery in Choctaw County, Mississippi. Also buried there are Andrew Y. Hanna and his first wife Jane Thompson Hanna, and his second wife, Catherine Delashama, who survived him. Jane Thompson Hanna, born August 14, 1804, died February 16, 1842, was the mother of all the Hanna children.

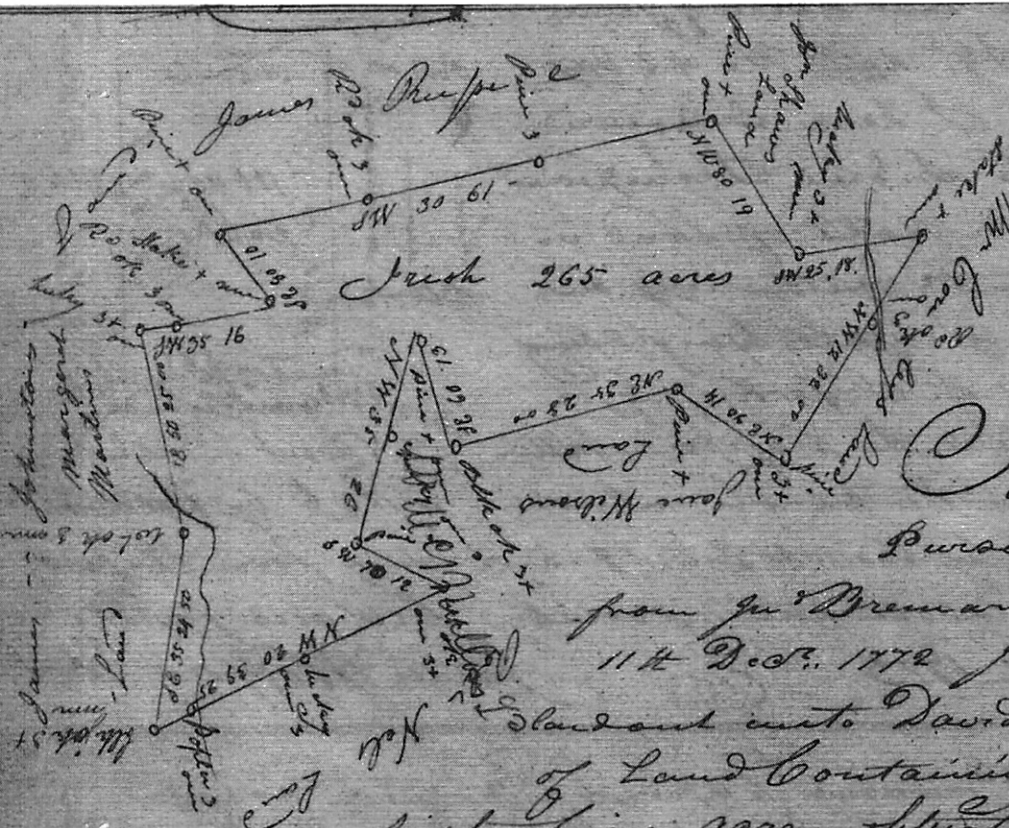
FAIRFIELD AND CHESTER COUNTY, S. C. KENNEDY'S

A group of people named Kennedy settled in Fairfield and Chester counties just prior to and shortly after the Revolutionary War. A partial list of these Kennedy's follows:

- (1) Alexander Kennedy - Born December 6, 1743 at Aoghill, County Antrim, Ireland. He died February 11, 1826 near Ridgeway, Fairfield County, South Carolina. He immigrated to South Carolina about January 24, 1764, and received a land grant on Cedar Creek in Fairfield County on October 4, 1768. Alexander Kennedy married Agnes Fears (Fair) around 1774. Agnes was born February 14, 1754, and died June 7, 1824. Both are buried at the Old Craig Cemetery near Ridgeway, S. C. They had 10 children, 8 sons and 2 daughters. Numerous descendants of this couple lived in Fairfield County in the 1800's.
- (2) William J. Kennedy - A brother of Alexander, above - born in 1751 in County Antrim, Ireland. He died in 1820 in Fairfield County, S. C., William Kennedy was probably married three times:
 - (A) Jennet Richardson - William Kennedy was listed as the son-in-law of (Thomas?) Richardson in his will in Fairfield County in 1786.
 - (B) Elizabeth Elliot - married about 1786.
 - (C) Nancy Freeman - a widow - married November 10, 1811. She survived him.William Kennedy had at least four children by one or both of his first two wives; two sons and two daughters. He received a land grant in Fairfield County February 6, 1773.
- (3) James Kennedy - Received a land grant on Beaver Creek in Fairfield county about 1772. This man is believed to have had a family, as his land grant was for several hundred acres of land, which was later partially sold to other people. The author has no more information on this man except a "hunch" that he may have been the James Kennedy buried at Old Purity Presbyterian Cemetery with the inscription "James Kennedy, died October 31, 1790, aged 73 years". (This would have meant he was born in 1717).

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WILL OF ALEXANDER KENNEDY

In the Name of God. Amen.

I Alexander Kennedy Senior, of the State of South Carolina, and District of Fairfield, being weak in body; but of perfect mind and memory, (thanks be to Almighty God for this) do make and constitute this my last Will and Testament, in the manner following Viz.

First. I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it, and my body to the silent grave, to be buried after the manner of a decent Christian burial, desiring that my Executors do furnish decent Head and Foot stones for mine, my beloved wife's, and son Arthur's Graves, out of my Estate.

2. I give and bequeath unto my son James Kennedy a negro girl named Hester, with all her future increase. Also two tracts of land, one containing fifty--six acres, lying in said District, on Persimmon Forke, waters of Cedar Creek, binding on lands of William Kirkland dece., waters, and Thomas Howel. The other on waters of Crane Creek, containing fifty acres more or less, binding on Solomom Knipper's land.
3. I give and bequeath unto my son Henry Kennedy, a negro woman named Affa, and her boy child Jack.
4. I give and bequeath unto my son John Kennedy, a negro girl named Fanny.
5. I give and bequeath unto Alexander Kennedy my son, a negro girl named Maria. Also, one hundred and thirty seven acres of land, Situate on the waters of Cedar Creek, binding on lands belonging to the Estate of John Rofs senr. deced.
6. I give and bequeath unto my son William Kennedy, a negro boy named Charles, and a girl named Susy.
7. I give and bequeath unto my son Robert Kennedy, a negro woman named Phebey and her son Joe.
8. I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel W. Kennedy, a negro girl named Choley, and a boy named Lewis.
9. I give and bequeath unto my sons John, William, Robert, and Samuel W. Kennedy, twelve hundred and forty-seven acres of land, Situate on waters of Rice Creek, Crane Creek and Cedar Creek which lands, or the net proceeds of the sales thereof, to be equally divided between them.

10. I desire that whichsoever of my children, my old negro woman, Betty, chooses to live with, shall be her right owner.
11. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Jane Craig, a negro girl named Becca, to be held by the said Jane and the lawful heirs of her body forever.

12. It is my will and desire, that my negro man Tom, and woman Amy, together with all my stock, Plantation tools, House and Kitchen furniture, and in short every other article of which I am or may be possessed, not otherwise bequeathed, be sold after my decease, and that the following Legacies be paid by my Executors, out of the moneys arising from such sale, to the following persons, being my Grand Children Viz: To Alexander Craig, son of Robert W. Craig and Mary his wife, five hundred dollars.

To Alexander Kennedy son of William Kennedy, one hundred dollars.

To Alexander Kennedy, son of John Kennedy, one hundred dollars.

For the Tuition of Osburn and James Kennedy, sons of Henry Kennedy fifty dollars each.

And the residue of said moneys to be equally divided between all my children.

13. I give and bequeath unto seven of my children, Viz: John, William, Robert, Henry, Samuel, and Jane, the moneys Alexander, arising from four notes of five hundred and seventy-six dollars, three and three-fourth cents, due me by Robert W. Craig, each note to be equally divided between said children as it becomes due.

14. I give and bequeath unto my Grandson, Arthur Kennedy, son of Alexander, a negro boy named Anthony.

15. I give and bequeath unto my Grandson, Arthur Kennedy, Craig, son of Robert W. and Mary Craig, a negro boy named Frank.

Lastly. I constitute and appoint my friend John Rosborough and my two sons, James and Alexander Kennedy, Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all other and former Wills and Testaments, by me heretofore made.

In testimony I hereto set my hand and affix my Seal, this Tenth day of August A.D. One thousand eight hundred and twenty four. Signed, Sealed, published and declared as and for the last Will and Testament of the above named Alexander Kennedy, senior in presence of us.

wonder if this is not the original home site of Alexander
Kennedy. Of the nineteen tombstones, all are Kennedys except
for four Craig relatives. The cemetery is located south-west
of Ridgeway. From the present Aimwell Presbyterian Cemetery
continue east on the highway by the Cemetery. Turn first
paved road to the right. Continue several miles. Turn right
at dirt road. Cemetery is on the left not far from the
paved road.

John Alexander Thompson (August 4, 1800 - September 18, 1875) and Sarah Rebecca (Yongue) Thompson are both buried at Bethsalem cemetery in Choctaw County, Mississippi. Also buried there are Andrew Y. Hanna and his first wife Jane Thompson Hanna, and his second wife, Catherine Delashama, who survived him. Jane Thompson Hanna, born August 14, 1804, died February 16, 1842, was the mother of all the Hanna children.

FAIRFIELD AND CHESTER COUNTY, S. C. KENNEDY'S

A group of people named Kennedy settled in Fairfield and Chester counties just prior to and shortly after the Revolutionary War. A partial list of these Kennedy's follows:

- (1) Alexander Kennedy - Born December 6, 1743 at Aoghill, County Antrim, Ireland. He died February 11, 1826 near Ridgeway, Fairfield County, South Carolina. He immigrated to South Carolina about January 24, 1764, and received a land grant on Cedar Creek in Fairfield County on October 4, 1768. Alexander Kennedy married Agnes Fears (Fair) around 1774. Agnes was born February 14, 1754, and died June 7, 1824. Both are buried at the Old Craig Cemetery near Ridgeway, S. C. They had 10 children, 8 sons and 2 daughters. Numerous descendants of this couple lived in Fairfield County in the 1800's.
- (2) William J. Kennedy - A brother of Alexander, above - born in 1751 in County Antrim, Ireland. He died in 1820 in Fairfield County, S. C., William Kennedy was probably married three times:
 - (A) Jennet Richardson - William Kennedy was listed as the son-in-law of (Thomas?) Richardson in his will in Fairfield County in 1786.
 - (B) Elizabeth Elliot - married about 1786.
 - (C) Nancy Freeman - a widow - married November 10, 1811. She survived him.William Kennedy had at least four children by one or both of his first two wives; two sons and two daughters. He received a land grant in Fairfield County February 6, 1773.
- (3) James Kennedy - Received a land grant on Beaver Creek in Fairfield county about 1772. This man is believed to have had a family, as his land grant was for several hundred acres of land, which was later partially sold to other people. The author has no more information on this man except a "hunch" that he may have been the James Kennedy buried at Old Purity Presbyterian Cemetery with the inscription "James Kennedy, died October 31, 1790, aged 73 years". (This would have meant he was born in 1717).

Alexander Kennedy, born 6 Dec 1743 in Antrim, Ireland and died 11 Feb 1826. BIOGRAPHY: During the American Revolution Alexander Kennedy was 38, served for 86 days in the South Carolina Militia during 1781 and 1782. He was a Private stationed at the Congarees. He also made saddles for the horseman in the S.C. Militia. He served as a Private under Col. Thomas Taylor, Capt. James Craig, Capt. John Miles, and Capt. William Robertson. They all certified his services. Alexander received payment for his militia service on January 21, 1790 totaling 1 200 pounds, 15 shillings and 5 pence. Apparently Alexander was not wounded in the war because he did not apply for a pension. He was married to Agnes Fears and had several children, one of whom was also named Alexander. There are parts of this area that have at times been in Richland District/County and at other times Fairfield District/County. The earliest plats refer to them as Craven County and later as Camden District. It really just depends on the time period.

This Alexander Kennedy had children John, William, Robert, Samuel, Jane, Mary (married Robert W. Craig), Henry, Alexander, Arthur and James. The Craig Grant (2290 acres) was clearly in Fairfield, so there was an obvious marriage connection between this Kennedy family and the Craigs of Fairfield County. The other families associated with these people were an Ingram (or Ingraham) family (Samuel and James) and the family of James Massey, who is buried on my family's former homeplace, Rose Cottage on 321 at Owen's Road. I have not found the graves, but I know they are there from the writings of my grand uncle who grew up at Rose Cottage. He wrote about the remains of an old stage coach inn on the property that was falling in in the nineteen teens and the three graves nearby. He identified one of them as James Massey's. I believe that the building was originally Ingraham's Tavern referred to in the Mills Atlas of 1815-1825.

I copied and pasted this from a public story published by another Ancestry.com member. I apologize for not remembering and providing the name of the member here. The story published had a number of typographical issues and thus was difficult to read. I have tried to clear those up here and provide the story in larger print. The information is interesting and some of it matches information I have already gathered. However, the information on my ancestor, William Kennedy (son of Andrew Sr. and Agnes), does not match. I have not yet checked to see which information is accurate so I offer this to you with that caveat.



Alexander Kennedy, Senior, born 6 December 1743, County Antrim, Ireland; died 11 February, 1826, aged 83 years and 2 months, in Fairfield County, S.C. Buried at the Craig Cemetery, Ridgeway, S.C. This cemetery, containing nineteen legible tombstones, is located on what once was Craig property near Cedar Creek. It is thought that this might be the location of the original Aimwell Presbyterian Church building. This may also be the original homesite of Alexander Kennedy. Of the nineteen tombstones, all are Kennedys except for four Craig relatives. The cemetery is located southwest of Ridgeway. From the present Aimwell Presbyterian Cemetery, continue east on the highway by the Cemetery. Turn on to first paved road to the right. Continue several miles, Turn right at dirt road. Cemetery is on the left not far from the paved road.

Alexander Senior married Agnes Fears in Fairfield County, S.C, around 1774. Agnes was born on 14 February, 1754, County Antrim, Ireland and died 7 June, 1924, Fairfield CO., S.C., "aged 70 years." She is buried beside her husband at Craig Cemetery. Children of Alexander and Agnes Fears Kennedy:

by A.F.DuBard, John H. Smith and Wesley Turnipseed. His wife, Nancy, was named executrix and his sons, Levi and Henry were named his executors.⁶⁹

NANCY TURNIPSEED, widow of George Turnipseed, made her will on July 16, 1840, and it was proven on October 14, 1840. To her son, Adam Frederick, she left a Negro boy named Squire; to her son, Reddick Washington, she left a Negro boy named George; to her daughter, Susan Adeline, she left a Negro girl named Charlotte and a trunk; to her daughter Barbara Ann, she left a trunk. The rest of her property to be used to adjust inequalities in the will of their father. Her sons, Levi and Henry were named her executors.⁷⁰

LEVI TURNIPSEED, son of Georgē. and Nancy Hamiter Turnipseed, married Harriet E. Nipper Kennedy, widow of Alexander Kennedy. They had no children but Harriet by her marriage to Alexander Kennedy (his second marriage) had a daughter, Ann Caroline, who married James S. Beard. Ann Caroline Kennedy Beard died on November 15, 1847, at the age of 18 years, and 12 days. She left an infant daughter, Harriet R.C. Beard. Harriet Nipper Kennedy Turnipseed named this infant her chief heir. If this child should die, then the children of Alexander Kennedy by his first wife were to inherit her property. (Alexander Kennedy had six children by his first wife). She left James and Mary Kennedy \$400 each. The remainder of her estate to be divided so that Jane E. Ruff (married to Daniel Ruff, who had died on October 1, 1840, leaving his wife, Jane, and nine children) to have two-thirds of the remainder, and Margaret Hinnant to have the other third.
