Joe Kirkpatrick Passes Suddenly 1955

Heart Attack Proves Fatal To Winnsboro Man. 49.

Joseph Leslie Kirkpatrick, 49. died at his home in Winnsboro Thursday morning about 4 o'clock following a heart attack. He was the youngest child and only son of Walker L. and Margaret Pope Kirkpatrick and had lived all his life here.

Mr. Kirkpatrick was manager of Dixie Home Stores for a number of years, was later manager of the Freezer-Locker Company in Winnsboro. For the past few years he had been in the cattle and livestock business.

He was married to the former Miss Mamie Annie Kinard of Ninety Six, and she with two children survive: Bennett Kirk-patrick, a reserve army officer, now with the Purina Feed Company, of Roanoke, Virginia, and Miss Dorothy Kirkpatrick, freshman at Winthrop College, Rock Hill. Also surviving are two sisters, Mrs. M. C. Cathcart of Winnsboro and Miss Lucille Kirkpatrick, supervisor of elementary schools Thomasville, North Carolina.

Mr. Kirkpatrick was a member of the Lions Club, and an active member and a past deacon of Sion Presbyterian Church.

Funeral services were conducted at 4:30, Friday afternoon, from the Harden Funeral Home in Winnsboro by the pastor, the Rev-erend Robert E. Smith. Interment followed in the family plot in Sion Presbyterian Cemetery.
