Talking to you brought back so many
child hood memories. I only remember one winter
spent in + around Feasterwell but many happy summers
for I was brought to Winnsboro to stay with my
father aunts miss Mattie (Martha Ann) and Mary (Harriet)
Poole + his sister Mamie, who married Wm Bain-
well. President of the State Bank on Sept 19, 1917.
My father's other sister (Dorothy) lived
with us a while before she went in nursing train
she first nursed at Dr. Curbets Sanatorium - as
she did not have a nursing training
help her to get in at Pine Heights Sanatorium
where she received her diploma in nursing
after completing six months of her course
at the Augusta Hospital. I could just
listen to her for hours. Her patients in Greenville
were either there from dope or excessive
drinking. One tried to get her with a flat
pin another was always trying to catch
a little imp who was coming in the wind
to him or sitting on a trunk, another man
out on the street with only one of those
stiff collars, the men used to button on
their shirts and the man out with a blanket
+ with the help of the sideline caught him
Her experiences at Pine Heights was much
pleasant, it was a private sanatorium and
only the best people in Augusta were sent there
Dr. D. Douglas owned + operated it Mrs
Heatrledge from Paramah was superintendent
and Miss Maggie Stevenson who went to
school with Aunt Isabelle was head nurse
Aunt Isabelle did quite a bit of private

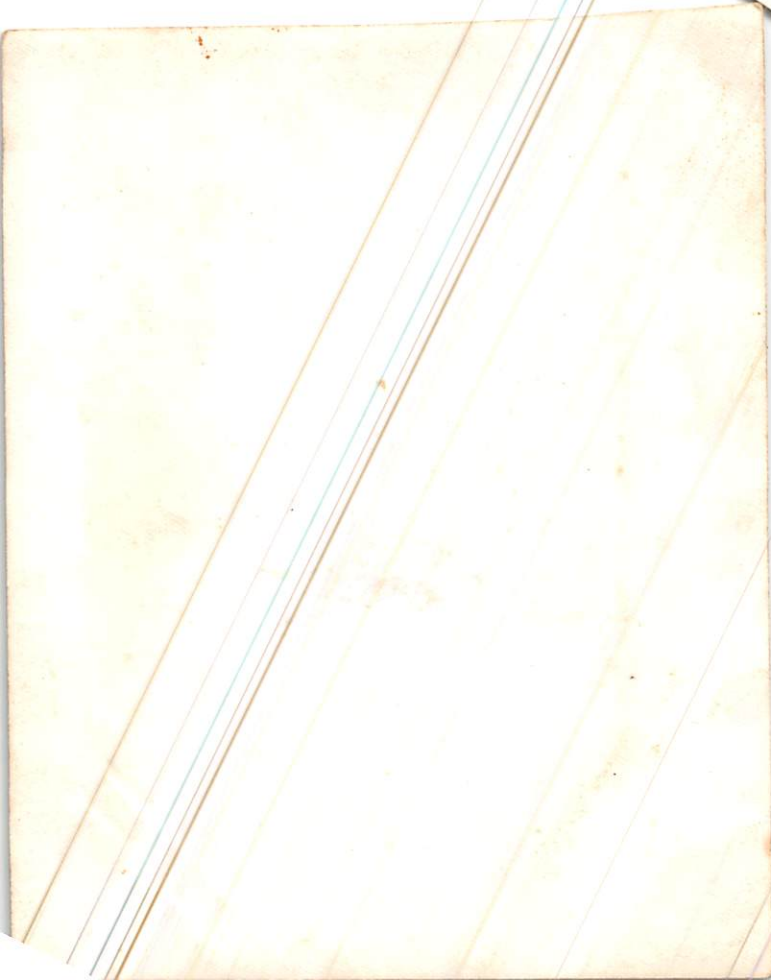

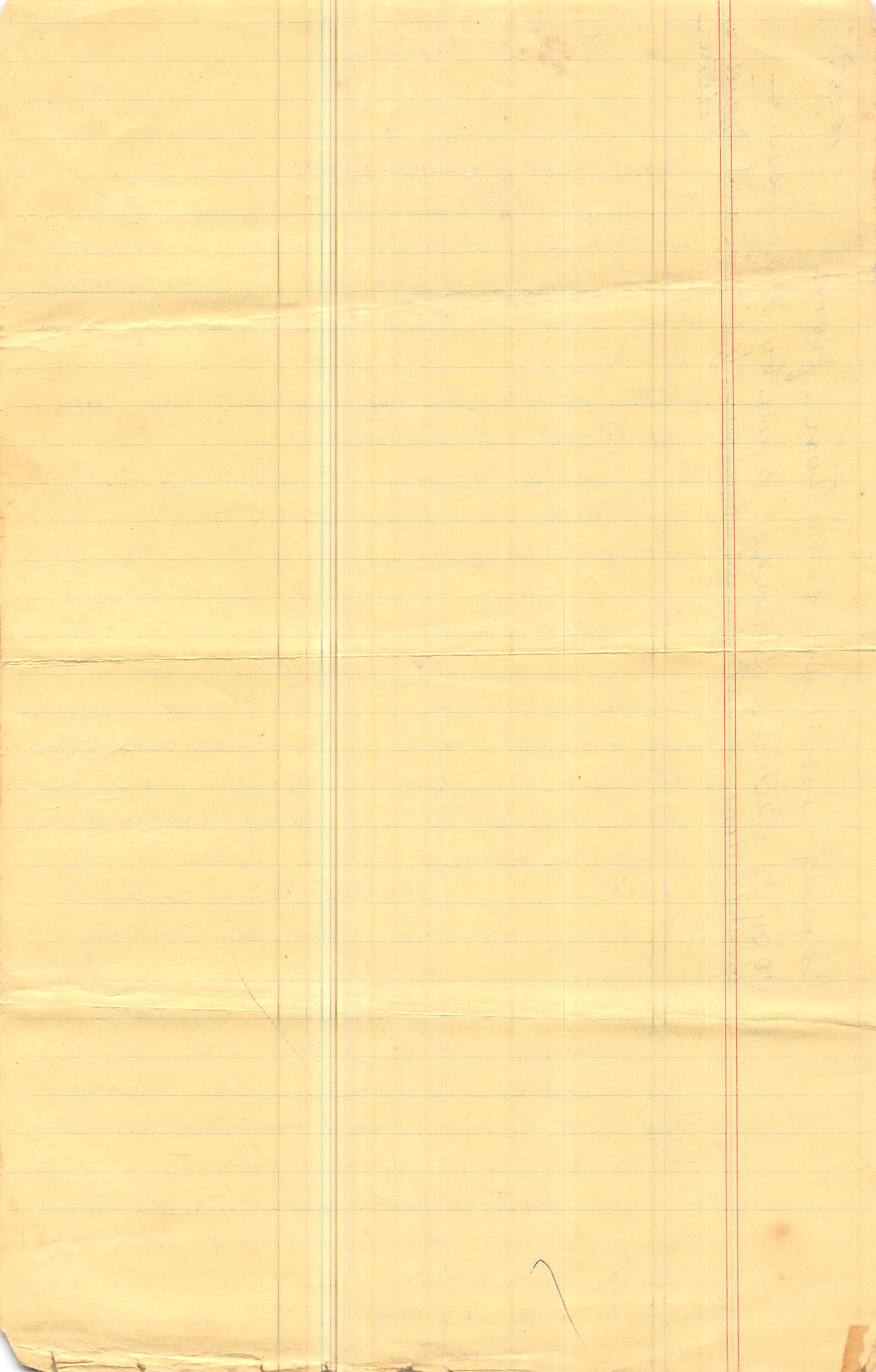

my grandfather, Christian Elias Leitner, stated that he often heard his father, Christian Leitner, Sr. say he was the youngest of fourteen children, but he knew very little of the older ones, who were all married and living across the river when he was a little boy. Henry Leitner Jr. #13 claimed that John George Leitner was twice married and that Barbara was the



second wife. To prove his contention he
traveled back to Florida to visit relatives who had
taken the family Bible with them. And it is
on that authority that the name of the first
wife ^{was} established, John George Leitner. The first
Barbara as his wife in 1820 is ^{well named}
I have ~~not~~ been able to find ~~proof~~ ~~proof~~ ~~proof~~ in
my father's notes.
Barbara's ~~middle~~ ^{maiden} name was Leitner although
he gives it as such, the parents of Carl Kähler -
una Leitner is also tentative. Tradition
states that John George Leitner bought
land next to his father-in-law, but it
may be that the Hans Michael Swygert who
owned land next to the Leitners might
have been Kähler's brother. See page 80 -
E. L. Green's "History of Richland County",
which gives plat book records that show
that Hans Michael Swygert had a bounty
grant of 450 acres as of May, 2, 1752 -
lying north of the Broad River, opposite
Saxa-Locha (now Columbia, SC); page 73 shows
a grant of 200 acres to John George Legner (note
spelling) on March 25, 1753 - lying opposite
Saxa-Locha. The listing of deeds by Green
is incomplete, however, so that a complete
check of all Leitner deeds in Columbia Court
house is needed.

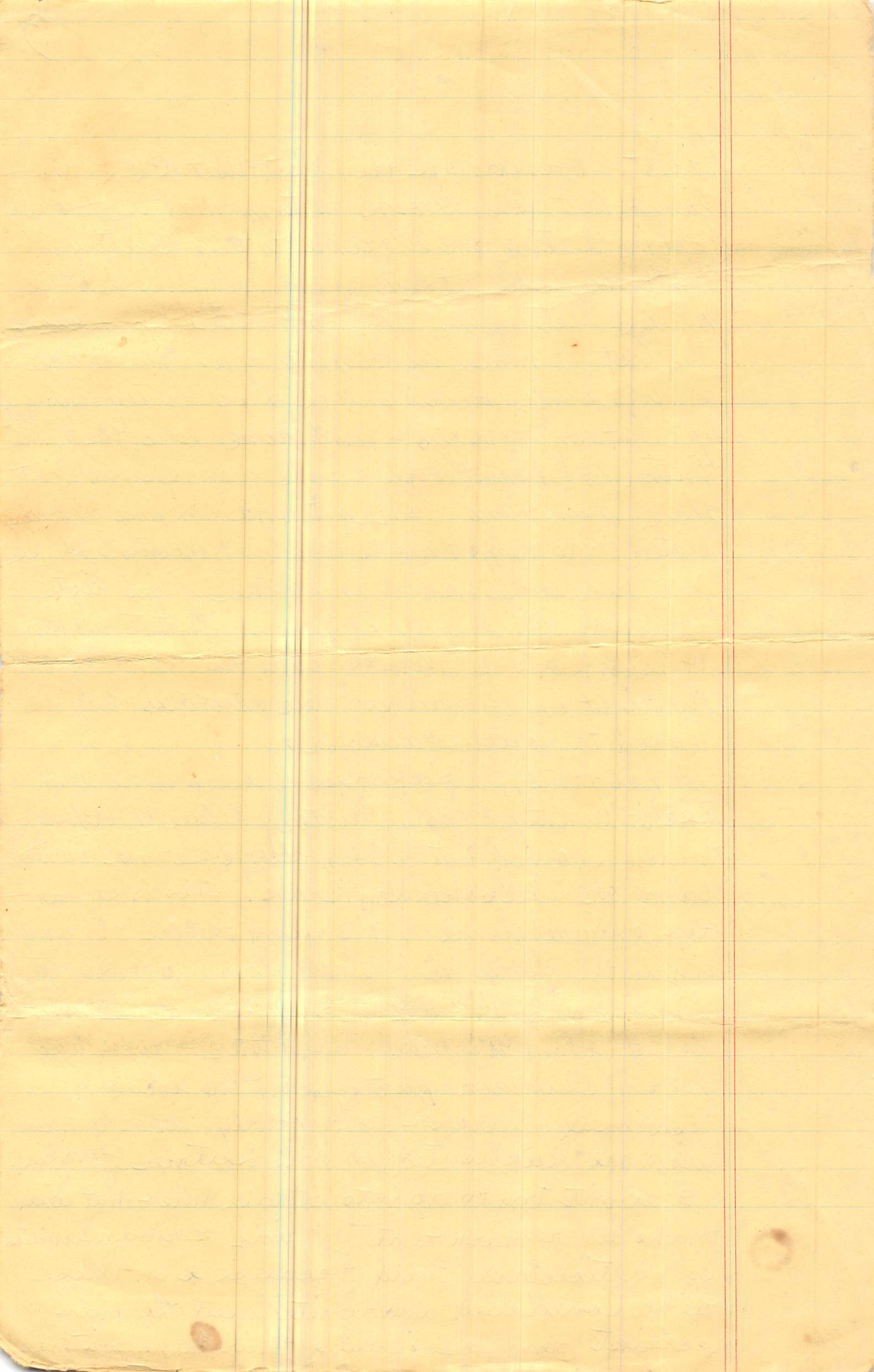
The date of birth given for John George Leitner
is not proven in the records of Claude Clifton
Leitner - nor is the source of said date mentioned.
ed. in some places he gives birth date as



1725 - based on the fact that CCL believed that John George Leitner was the Hans George Leitner who came to this Country in September 1733 at the age of 8 years. The ship's list gives him as mentioned - among the list of males under 16 yrs. The male and females over 16 are also listed separately - not by families - and none bear the name Leitner as Hans Georg's name was spelled, but there was Hans Leonhart and Sabina Leher listed who may have been his parents. There are, however, so many other ships lists that have not been examined that it would be erroneous to suppose that this family is the right one, - unless their activities can be traced to South Carolina.

I recently, I picked up a lead in an old Berks County Penn., history while in Albany which showed that a John George Legnoz owned land on Tulpshocken Creek. This is so far - the only reference I've found where the spelling is the same as on the land records at Columbia, S.C. Right near him - in Penn. - lived John Wilhelm Lightner - who had seven children baptized in the local Episcopal church - and oddly - all the names used are duplicated in S.C. Leitner families.

I won't try to go into detail here - but will make the remark that tracing German families is particularly hard because even those who could read and write used German script and deciphering their hand writing



for spelling the name for spelling is almost impossible for 100% accuracy - even for a language scholar. When the records were written by English speaking clerks, secretaries, etc. they depended on spelling the name as they heard it. The spoken German language is very queer and consequently the listener often got varied ideas about how to spell what he heard.

A study of German names is necessary in order to know the right person. John George Leitner is the English spelling of Hans Jurig, Johannes Georg, Hans Jury, Hans Jerry etc. also - it was customary for each of the sons of a man to carry one of his father's names so that John George's sons are correctly - John Henry, John George, John Jacob & John Christian. However, in actual practice the family would only use the name which distinguished one from the other when speaking to them, however as is often the case - when they ~~legally~~ had to sign their names - the first name was required - they all then were legally according to English practice - John Leitner. This leads to a lot of confusion when trying to sort them out.

I might also point out here that it has been erroneously assumed that there was only one Leitner family in S. Ca. from whom all present Leitners are descended. This however has not been proved - and several documents have come to light that show other Leitners males living and of the same age as known members of our line



Witness that George Leitner's will which is enclosed was witnessed by a John Leitner but as George Sr. did not name any one of his sons - John - in the will - we do not know whether this was one of the sons using his legal first name - or a member of another ~~Leitner~~ Leitner family.

It would have been ~~easier~~ easier for us if the person signing had used ~~both~~ both his names. Incidentally - this is one reason why ~~it~~ even today - it's better to write out in full a middle name - rather than use an initial.

Many names which now seem English in origin actually were German, French, Italian etc. You all doubtless know of the Turnipseed family but when searching for their original members around Fairfield County you'll have to remember that Rebsome, Repson, Rapson, Reppimon is the original name. Literally meaning Turnipseed. You'll find variations in spelling in practically all the names now familiar to you - so it is easy to overlook them when you are trying hardest to spot them.
