The State of South Carolina of Her most Excellent Majesty King George the Fourth
 of Her Majesty's District of the aforesaid State in consideration of forty dollars to me here
 shown to be paid by Mat R Hallum of Fairfield District in the State aforesaid to me
 here shown to be paid and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release
 the said Mat R Hallum a piece of Land containing four acres Situate in Fairfield Dist
 and State aforesaid on the Branch of Backhouse Creek and waters of Little River
 and bounded by Land belonging to Joseph Gladney Sen and Mat R Hallum
 having first further marked the same and Boundaries as well as more fully set out
 by the plat thereof made by J. S. Clark Esq. Together with all and singular the rights and
 appurtenances and appurtenances to the said piece of Land belonging or in any way incident or
 pertaining to have and to hold all and singular the piece of Land before mentioned unto the said
 Mat R Hallum his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs and
 assigns to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said piece of Land unto the
 said Mat R Hallum his heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and against every person whom
