deemed to be paid by R. H. Gladney of Newellton District in the State aforesaid have given  
him as my Agent and Relaxed and by these presents do grant, begave and released all  
the said R. H. Gladney a piece of Land containing four acres situate in Newellton District  
and aforesaid on the Branches of Rock Creek and water of Little River  
and bounded by land belonging to Joseph Gladney son and R. H. Gladney  
having, and further more which may be required and necessary for the use  
of the said R. H. Gladney in and by lot Clark #5. Together with all and singular the rights, considerations  
and conveniences and appurtenances to the said piece of land belonging, or in any wise incident or  
pertaining to his, and to hold all and singular the piece of land before mentioned unto the said  
R. H. Gladney his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and  
Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said piece of land unto the  
said R. H. Gladney his heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and against every person whom  
I may lawfully claim or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal at the  
first day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty four and  
with the sixtieth year of the Independence of the United States of America sealed  
and delivered in the presence of Thomas H. H. Barnes & Joseph Gladney. Read.  
The State of South Carolina, personally affirmed before me Thomas H. H. Barnes and made with  
the party testifying that the said Joseph Gladney has done this deal and delivered the  
above among other of him for the use and benefit herein mentioned and that he will do

 and fifty two acres bounded at the time of said Survey North west by John Robin  
 sons & John Morris land North East by John McWay land south East by Alexander  
 Bills land & south west by Thomas Robbs land the said tract or parcel of Land having  
 such form marks & boundaries as are represented in a plot drawn there of by the said  
 James Phelps & dated on the day of said Survey — To have & to hold the above bargained  
 premises & every part thereof with all the improvements buildings & appurtenances thereto  
 in any wise belonging to him the said R A Hallums & to his heirs & assigns  
 forever for his & their sole & separate use benefit & behoof in full ample —  
 I give and Willam et Martin for myself & my heirs executors & administrators do  
 sever out with the said R A Hallums his heirs & assigns to Robert et Martin  
 unto him & them the title to the above bargained premises against all claim or
