

Rev. J. M. Lemmon Dies At Conway

**Brother Of Winnsboro Man
Passes Friday After Illness Of
Two Weeks. Heart Attack
Proves Fatal.**

Rev. John Mills Lemmon, 56, pastor of Ashpole Presbyterian church of Rowland, North Carolina, died Friday of a heart attack at the Conway, S. C., hospital after an illness of two weeks. Rev. Lemmon was spending a vacation at Myrtle Beach when he was stricken and was taken at once to Conway, where he had served as minister from 1915 to 1928. He had only two charges during his long service as a minister of the Gospel—first at Conway, later at Rowland, N. C.

Funeral services, conducted by Rev. Gardner, of Bennettsville, and Rev. Brearley, of Conway, were conducted Sunday morning at 10 o'clock at Rowland. Interment was in the Lakeside cemetery at Conway.

Rev. Lemmon is survived by his widow, the former Miss Fannie Dusenbury of Conway; one son, Ben Lemmon; two daughters, Talulah Lemmon, and Floride Lemmon, a daughter of his first wife, the late Mrs. Elizabeth Barron
