C.

The Reverend W. Harry Chandler, pastor of the bride, performed the double ring ceremony assisted by the Reverend Robert E. Smith, pastor of the bridegroom-elect.

Mrs. Turner finished high school at Mount Zion Institute, Winnsboro, and was graduated from Winthrop College in 1958 with a B.A. in English, minoring in fine arts. At Winthrop, she was a member of Sigma Epsilon Kappa, honorary English fraternity, and of the Granddaughters' Club, and associate editor of the Tatler, the college yearbook. The bride is a former Fairfield County maid-of-cotton and taught English at Camden Junior High School. Mr. Turner is also a Mount Zion High graduate and attended Clemson College, receiving his B.S. degree in Animal Husbandry in 1954. While at Clemson, he was a member of Mu Beta Psi, honorary music fraternity, and the Clemson and Concert bands, and served on the council and cabinet of the YMCA. The bridegroom is a former first lieutenant in the U. S. Army, and is now budget manager for the Goodyear Service Store in Camden.
