

Two Die In Accidents

Accidents claimed two lives in Fairfield County; one early Sunday morning and the other on Monday morning.

Kathy Wilson Lewis, 31, of Rt. 1, Blair was killed in a one car accident about 12:10 a.m. Sunday morning, at the intersection of Hwy. S-31 and 215.

According to Highway Patrolman Cpl. J.M. Lark, Mrs. Lewis lost control of her 1974 Dodge and went off the road. The vehicle turned on its side and struck a tree. Mrs. Lewis was thrown from the car, which spun around and landed on her.

There were no passengers in the car with Mrs. Lewis.

On Monday Edward Stevenson Sims was killed in an accident at the V.C. Summer Nuclear Plant at Parr, where he was employed by Daniel Construction Company.

Coroner Joe Silvia reported that Sims was operating a switch engine at the time of the accident, pulling four boxcars on a slight downhill grade on a railroad spur. The brakes on the switch engine apparently failed and the boxcars' weight pushed Sims' engine until it hit a track switching device and Sims was thrown from the engine

and under the boxcars.

Mrs. Lewis, wife of James C. Lewis, was born in Chester County on March 28, 1945, a daughter of James E. and Mary Lou Osborne Wilson. She was employe of Fairfield Manufacturing Company and a member of Beaver Creek Baptist Church.

Surviving are her husband; her parents of Great Falls; two daughters, Misses Bonnie and Tammie Price of Charlotte, N.C.; two sons, Johnny Price of Charlotte and Chuckie Lewis of Blair; three sisters, Mrs. Gail Dixon of Blackstock, Miss Emmie Wilson of Great Falls and Mrs. Wanda Capps of Marshall, Texas; and a brother, Jimmy Wilson of Great Falls.

Services were held Monday in Bethlehem Methodist Church, conducted by the Rev. Joseph Walker, the Rev. Doug Adams and the Rev. Mr. Jenkins. Burial was in the church cemetery.
