It was a pleasure speaking with you earlier today. I am looking for info on my Little family. My goal is to find out where in South Carolina that they came from so I can continue my research.

My grgrgr grandfather was born in 1805 according to bible records that I found from a distant relative. His name is Robert Little. They appear in the 1820 Ohio census in Butler County Ohio but listed under his mother's name as Nancy. She writes her will in 1827 and then dies s in that time frame. I know the father is alive from approx. 1805 to around 1818 because she lists her sons with their name Little in her will. Their names are James, Thomas, David and Samuel. I know nothing about the father or his name possibly might be Robert as that is the name listed on my Roberts death info in 1892 from Butler county Ohio. Can't check the Ohio 1810 census for the family. It was lost due to a fire. The church records according to a local Butler county historian where she most likely attended church have been lost. Can't find her burial site either. They may have not had the money for a stone.

And should there Remain an overplus after paying my Lawful debts I leave and Bequeath my Watch or Time Piece to my Brother James's Son Robert and my Bible to my Sister Betsey, These Two Articles not to be Sold untill it is Known and Clearly ascertained whether or no there will be an Overplus or Balance after paying my Lawful debts

And Should there still Remain an Overplus or Balance in favor of my Estate after paying the debts and the Two Legacies just Mentioned, all such Overplus or Balance I leave and bequeath to my Loving and honoured Parents-----And lastly I do hereby nominate Constitute and appoint my Brothers Thomas Little and James Little Executors of this my last Will and Testament, In testameng of this being my last Will and Testament and my Act and deed I do hereby Set my hand and Seal, the Seventh day of December Anno Domini 1819

I Jonas Little of South Carolina Union District being of sound and disposing mind and memory, but weak in body, and calling to mind the uncertainty of life, and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased god to bless me with, do make and ordain this my last will in manner following that is to say

- first I give and bequeath unto Rebecca Little my dearly wife all and singular my plantation and tract of land whereon I now live, - to have and to hold during her natural life, and at her decease, it is my will that it should be sold on a credit of Twelve months, and the money arising therefrom to be equally divided among my Children
- second I give and bequeath unto my wife Rebecca one negro girl named Sussey to have and to hold said girl during her natural life and at her decease to be sold - and the money arising therefrom to be equally divided among my lawful Children.
- third I desire that my wife Rebecca should have one third part of my Estate for and during the term of her natural life; and after her decease, I give the same to my Children to be equally divided among them, to them and their heirs forever
- fourth I desire that after my wife has taken her thirds, that the residue of my estate (not heretofore willed) be sold upon a credit of twelve months, and the money arising therefrom be equally divided among my lawful children to them and their heirs forever.
- fifth I desire that my Son Jonas Little should have Thirty Dollars independent of an equal share with my other Children.
- sixthly and lastly I do constitute and appoint my Son Thomas and Anne Little executors of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other and former wills and testaments, by
