Dear Eddie,

Thank you for your very quick response to my inquiry. Much appreciated. I have printed out a membership application and plan to put it in tomorrow's mail with a check.

Regarding the information you sent, there is a mention in the Powell family section on page 95 of my maternal grandparents, Rufus Castles Jr. and Marian Louise (Mann) Castles, and of Marian's parents, Louise Powell and Lonnie Marion Mann, but there is a disconnect in information between these people and the Mann family mentioned on page 81. In the second column of page 81, however, there is mentioned a Samuel Lawrence Mann (1855-1927), and I feel almost certain that this is the same "Lawrence Mann" whose gravestone I have a photo of (somewhere, in my many digital photos), who was probably also the father of Lonnie Mann, which would be our connection between these two. However, none of Samuel Lawrence Mann's descendants are mentioned in the article, which only goes on to list his brother Thomas Mann's descendants. I had some information about a decade ago (now lost, unfortunately) showing that Lonnie Mann's mother (and Samuel Lawrence Mann's wife) was Puett Fridy Mann, so would you be willing to also send me some information on the Fridy family to see if we can connect Samuel Lawrence to Lonnie and thus (eventually) to me?

However, tonight, I saw your request and was able to send you this information immediately for Powell / Mann.


For our records would you please share any information you have updated on your family lines. The information will be filed and made available in our family files. This will expedite future request for research.

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Here is what I found on your Mann family.

Lonnie Marion Mann – Born June 30, 1898 and died March 9, 1958 is buried in Bethel Methodist Church Cemetery. He married Louise Powell, daughter of Mr. & Mrs. George Powell on June 30, 1921. His obit says that he was the son of Lawrence and Puett Fridy Mann (Fridy is often spelled Friday). He was survived by his wife Louise Powell Mann, daughter- Mrs. Rufus Castles, Jr. (Marion Mann) of Charleston and a son – Charles Leonard Mann of Walterboro and five grandchildren; three brothers-Floyd J. Mann, Kinard S. Mann both of Columbia, and Leon S. Mann of Winnsboro.

Louise Powell – Born May 10, 1903 and died April 24, 1981 is buried at Bethel, was the daughter of George Edward & Sallie Melton Powell. In her obit, she left the same children as Lonnie and 3 sisters-Mrs. Feriba DeAmicis, Mrs. Lula P. Nelson and Mrs. Mary M. Ball of Columbia, 2 bothers Durwood Reid Powell of Winnsboro and Thomas Lewis Powell of Columbia, 5 grandchild and 6 great-grandchildren.

Samuel Lawrence Mann – born September 2, 1855 and died June 10, 1927 is also buried in Bethel. For some reason his grave stone has Lawrence Samuel, I am sure this is your Samuel as his wife is buried next to him and every other record has Samuel Lawrence, his death cert. says that he is the son of James N. Mann and Mary Ann Friday Mann, both from Fairfield County.


James Mann – Born September 6, 1811 and died May 20, 1899 is also buried in Bethel. His obit states that he married Mary Ann Friday on July 3, 1845 and was the father of David N. Mann of Reddick, Fla.; Thomas F. Mann-who died before James and Samuel Lawrence Mann.

Puett Fridy Mann – wife of Samuel Lawrence Mann – Born July 26, 1858 and died February 22, 1944, is buried in Bethel beside Samuel. Her obit states that she was the daughter of Gabriel and Mary Ann Friday and wife of Samuel Lawrence Mann. She was the mother of Robert F. Mann, Edward d. Mann, J. Floyd Mann, Leon S. Mann and L. M. Mann all of Winnsboro and Kinard S. Mann if Columbia. Her death cert. states that her father Gabriel was born in Richland County and her mother Mary Ann Wessinger was born in Columbia and she was the wife of S. L. Mann.

Mary Ann Friday Mann – Born August 18, 1823 and died February 18, 1899, the wife of James Mann is buried at Bethel.

Sallie Melton Powell – born March 28, 1880 and died October 20, 1963 is buried in Greenbrier Methodist Church Cemetery. Her obit states that she was the daughter of L. H. and Margaret Cooper Melton and widow of Edward George Powell. She was the mother of Mrs. Louise P. Mann of Winnsboro, Mrs. Lila P. Nelson and Mrs. Mary P. Mann both of Columbia, Mrs. Vermelle P. Stewart of Fort Walton Beach, Fla. And Mrs. Feriba P. DeAnicis of Columbia, Lonnie Powell and Thomas Lewis Powell of Columbia, Durwood R. Powell and James B. Powell of Winnsboro and John E, Powell of Fort Walton Beach, Fla.

Edward George Powell, born November 22, 1868 and died April 1, 1936 is buried in the Greenbrier cemetery next to Sallie Melton. His death cert. says that he is the son of T. L. and Maggie Swatts Powell.
