Hopewell Church--- Peedee was organized 1770-- In 1772 Rev. Robert McClintock, as yet but a licentiate, came from Ireland to serve as it's pastor. He was born of highly respectable and pious parents, His father being Timothy McClintock and his mother Eleanor Hamilton. He returned to Ireland 1775

John McClintock I- 1728- 1796 married Margaret Simpson 1733- 1796 or 1817 -

He was born in Ulster County, Ireland, and she was born in County Antrim, Ireland- They were married in Ireland and came to America Oct 1772- and to Laurens County sometime between 1770- 1790- Both are buried Old Fields Cemetery in Sh- Scuffletown (now called Ora) Scotch Irish Descent-

Samuel was taken up by a scouting party near the close of the Revolution and by threats of hanging compelled to tell where his brother James was gone, then released to go.

married Jane Law . She was born in 1769 in Antrim County Ireland , the daughter of Samuel Law and Elizabeth Adger Law. Her parents later migrated to America and lived on Gilder's Creek , Newberry County, S.C. Jane Law McClintock died 1839 .

Next- It is my will that at my death the whole Estate shall be
valued or Appraised by three men or more to be chosen by my son
and daughter and--- that portion of Property to which I am entitled
which is one third of the Estate, Excepting a tract of land bought
of Elizabeth Copeland with all its improvements. Be so divided
that my son Robert Shall have Eight Hundred dollars worth which
is over and above that portion given to my daughter Mary and
Provided my daughter Mary Shall never marry or have children
then at her death that portion which I have bequeath to her Shall
go to my son Robert- Shall Robert die without heirs at his death shall
go to Mary or her children if there be any. Signed in the presence
of William Thompson-- Mary Bryson- Elizabeth Thompson in the
year of Our Lord 1836 and in the ----- year of the Independence
of America

Mr. Crawford's letter

Dear Mrs. Richard,

Thank you so much for your letter regarding The McClintock Family. Actually my wife is descended from the McClintock family, but I work on both our lines--

My wife's Third great grandmother was Lemintine B. McClintock and was born Aug. 13, 1826 in Tenn and died March 20, 1901. She married Jasper G. Rutherford. They were in the vicinity of present day Jasper County, Miss. 1850-- their children all born in Miss were: Lindsey (12-1-1846)-- James Shelton (6-24-1851)-- Newton 1863, Georgia Lou and Martha

Lemintine had a brother James, who was living with them in 1850-- the story goes that Lemintine and Jasper ran off to get married since her father was strong against the marriage. They vowed never to return home and they moved from Tenn to Miss. One day her brother James rode up into their yard finding his sister that he had not seen for 4-- four years. There was a James McClintock in Lincoln County Tenn by 1830 (Samuel in census). I would appreciate any information you might have tying Lemintine to some nice McClintock, gentleman and his wife-- wife--

The following is from Miss Louise Flemming

Between 1856 and 1865 E.L. Holmes compiled a record of Simpson and related families of Laurens County, S.C. We copy from Part IV-- Margaret Simpson McClintock, Of County Antrim Ireland.

First Generation: Margaret Simpson, of County Antrim, Ireland, born about 1735, married in Ireland John McClintock, who was born 1728. John McClintock had a sister Mary, who married William Mills in Ireland. John McClintock died Aug. 9, 1796, age 68 years. His home was near Scuffleton, Laurens County, S.C. His wife Margaret died 1817, age 82 years. Both are buried in Warrior Creek Pres. Churchyard (This churchyard is now known as Old Fields at Ora, S.C.)

Children: 1- James McClintock, born about 1755, married Margaret Hutchinson.

2- Margaret McClintock, born in Ireland 1758, married John Hunter son of old John Hunter who married a Bryson. Came from County Antrim, Ireland and settled near Milton, Laurens County, S.C.

3- Martha McClintock, born 1765 married 1796 Rev. Robert McClintock a relation

4- Mary McClintock, born 1770 married Alexander Mills.

5- John McClintock, born 1771 married Jane Law

6- Elizabeth McClintock, born 1775 married "Big" Robert Flemming

7- Nancy McClintock-- born 1777 married James Flemming, brother of Robert- (J.A. I wonder if these two could have been brothers of Sidnah Flemming , who married Matthew McClintock of Chester)

8- Samuel McClintock died at age of 15 .Was taken up by scouting party toward the close of Revolution and the threat of hanging use to make him reveal place brother James had gone-

9- William McClintock died while a child

Second Generation- : Children of John Hunter, who married Margaret McClintock:

1- James Hunter, born 1786, married April 13, 1814, 1st wife Rebecca Mills, who died July 4, 1821: 2nd wife Mrs. Mary (Caldwell) Young

4- Elizabeth Hunter died at 14 years

5- Margaret Hunter, born 1795, married April 14, 1818 John McClintock

Third Generation: Childre of James Hunter, oldest son of John and Margaret McClintock Hunter and his first wife, Rebecca Law Mills, daughter of James and Nancy Glenn Mills-

1- John Bryson Hunter moved to Mississippi and married there.

2- Nancy Mary Hunter married Laurens Calhoun

3- James Mills Hunter died single

Col. James Hunter and his wife, Mary Elizabeth Caldwell (Young) Hunter and two children are buried in old Hunter burying ground in the Beesewood section, near old Rehoboth Church (Greenwood County); not New Rehoboth Church. His son William Caldwell Hunter and his wife Beulah Elizabeth ----- Beattie are buried at Damascus Baptist Church at Phoenix. Mrs. Hunter, wife of the

Colonel, had much land left her by her father (Caldwell), so she and the Colonel built and lived on this land.

Colonel James Hunter served in the War of 1812 and his sword is in the Parks Family at Woodruff- The Park's father used it in the War Between The States.

" Margaret Simpson, County Antrim, Ireland was, according to best accounts received, the second, if not the oldest, of four sisters mentioned on the title page. The nearest approximation obtained fixes period of her birth about 1735. She must have married about 1753 or 1754, John McClintock, in Ireland, who was born in 1728 or one year earlier than William Simpson of Ireland (Part 1) Mr. McClintock died Aug. 9, 1796, age 68 years but the author finds no record of either birth, marriage or death of Mrs. McClintock, except from the recollection of Mary McClintock a granddaughter. She died 1817, age 82 years and is he informed they were both buried in the same grave at the cemetery of Warriors Creek Presbyterian Church. The following are the documents as far as ascertained:

 James McClintock, eldest son of John and Margaret Simpson McClintock was born, according to a companion with the age of his son, -John McClintock, -now-living-in the year about 1755- In the year 1805 , or when his son was ten years old Mr. James McClintock was drowned , near his residence on Warrior Creek, in an attempt to was and swim his horse. He was thrown off in deep water and so entangled as to be able unable to swim out, being then 45 or 50 years of age. They had only one son to survive him . He married in 1793 or 1794 Margaret Hutchinson, sister of James Hutchinson who was born 1765
