

McClintock Line of Jean Clawson Agee of Richburg, S.C.

Great great Great Grandfather was *South Carolina*
James McClintock of Bull Run, Chester, S.C.
He was an immigrant and filed papers of naturalization in Chester
County, S.C 1806; at which time he stated that he had been in the U.S.
18 years at least, which would have made him arrive by 1788
His will was made 1st of Feb. 1837. The names wife Elizabeth
She is found in 1850 Census as living in household of W.M. McClintock
(Her son) born in Ireland and 85 years old- This would have made
her born 1765-- My grandmother has pointed out two large field stones
that she had been shown as marking the graves of her great grandparents.
in Old Purity cemetery, Chester, S.C. Unfortunately there is no mark
on these stones so I have no proof-

Their children according to James' will were-
Robert McClintock * the 1850 census gives him 52 so born 1798
Catherine McClintock-- 1850 in home of Matthew M. McClintock, her
brother- age 47 years- so born 1803- This sister never married.
John McClintock- give 1850 Census as 45 so born 1805
Matthew M. McClintock- give 1850 census as 42 years so born 1808
Margaret Lathan-- *Robert Lathan* *16 June 1854 age 48 1806*

Elyse Lathan *James* *Robert Lathan* *Matthew Lathan* *Mrs. E. A. Cole*
Robert McClintock (son of the above) my great great grandfather
in 1850 census was 52 so born 1798- His wife was Elizabeth
Fullerton, who is given in 1850 census as 48 years old- so born
1802- She was the grand daughter of Robert Fullerton, Rev. soldier
of Rocky Creek- As is usual in this family there are no Bible Records
no tombstones. My grandmother had been told that they were buried
Fopewell A.R. P. Cemetery, Chester County, S.C. She had also been
told that they died prior to The War Between The States and that
their family was scattered-
The 1850 Census on this family reads-

W. M. female 23- so born 1827
E. McClintock female 21- so born 1829
Joseph male 18 so born 1832
Catherine female 16 so born 1834
James male 12 so born 1838
Mary female 10 so born 1840

There is suppose to have been a younger son John, who went to Georgia,
after the death of his parents and was raised by kinfolk, Uncle
James told that he saw him before the Battle of the Crater at
Petersburg, Va. He thought he was killed, however he is said to
have visited Mary McClintock, wife of Joseph Campbell after the
war. She is said to have wanted to notify the relations but he
wouldn't let her. His reason was that he had not been killed at
Petersburg but had taken the oath of allegiance and his brothers
would be ashamed of him. He must have been in the 14 years olds
that went to the war because if he was born after the census in
1850 he couldn't have been but 14 in 1864- That is totally possible
as many of the Confederate Veterans that I knew as a child went
to the army at 14.

H.M. McClintock- female 23 in 1850 census must have been Margaret who married John Sweatt and moved to Easley, S.C. and I know nothing of the family

Elizabeth McClintock 21 in 1850 married Jacob Ford- of Richburg section of Chester county, S.C. and They are buried Mount Prospect Methodist Churchyard, Chester county, no monuments-

Mary Jane Ford/ b-2 April 1859/died April 20, 1915 married James Madison McGarity/ Nov.3, 1859/ May 5, 1919

- A- Laura McGarity married Nelson McWaters- both are buried Clover, S.C.

I - Their only son was Cornel McWaters

B- Mary Elizabeth McGarity /B- Sept. 14, 1883/ Died Jan.3, 1945 married Samuel James McCrory/ b- June 15, 1885/

D- Sept. 17, 1969

C- Olin M. McGarity/ b- June 7, 1894/ D Oct.9, 1944

married Amy Collins/ b- June 23, 1882 / d- Dec. 26, 1966

There were no children of this marriage- Mrs. McGarity had a first marriage to Jessie Grant/ b- May 8, 1880/ d- Jan.2, 1914

D- Marion McGarity- is the youngest member of the family and is still alive- I have nothing on this man-

E- The Oldest son was James J. McGarity and I have nothing on this family See McClintock Reunion notes

Thomas Ford- about whom I have nothing- was another son of Mary Elizabeth McClintock See McClintock family Reunion

Robert Boyd Ford/ Oct 28, 1870/ died Oct. 25, 1936- Never married

Catherine D. Ford/ born Oct 26, 1865/ died May 29, 1961 - Never married-

Sally Ford married a McCullough- I know nothing of this family See McClintock Reunion notes

Catherine McClintock - married John W. Sweatt- This family moved to Louisiana- See McClintock Reunion papers-

Mary McClintock Married McCreight Chambers - they are buried Evergreen Cemetery Chester- -- See notes on Robert McClintock's daughters-

The only information I have on John son of Robert I have already given in a note at the beginning of this family-

James son of Robert- married a Sweatt and moved to Tenn- He left her with a young family and returned to S.C. His oldest son was 14 at the time- Uncle Jim served through out the War Between the States and was married after he returned so his marriage took place ca 1864 or 1865- More can be obtained by writing Mr. Clarence McClintock Clinton, Ky. There are some notes on this family in McClintock Reunion papers- From Tombstone B Oct 10, 1836 J Jan 20, 1912

Joseph Campbell McClintock- B- April 30, 1832/ died July 15, 1868 Served through out War Between The States- He was at the fall of Charleston- was captured at the Battle Of Missionary Ridge- Was taken to Ill. and transferred to Elmira, N.Y. Returned to S.C. a sick man and lived only four years after the war.
