1)Wm McCreight's daughter, Lucinda (Lucy) Rachel McCreight (8/30/1812-4/21/1865) married abt 1839 my g-g-g-grandfather, Samuel Andrew Jackson

(12/29/1804-9/11/1869)

She was his second wife. They had 8 children. Their main home was 4-5 miles south of Winnsboro in the old Oakland community.

2) Their oldest son, Wm Floyd Jackson (3/22/1843-12/1/1910) married on 6/10/1869 Mary Eliz. Milling (1848-5/8/1895). Wm Floyd Jackson's youngest sister was named

Inez McCreight Jackson

3) Their daughter, Florence L. Jackson married John Oscar Durham Allison. These were my father's grandparents.

My father, John E. Allison, Sr. (1930-2004) told me that as a child he would accompany his grandparents several times a year to Winnsboro for large Sunday dinners in the old McCreight house. I don't remember who lived there then, but I do remember that it wasn't a McCreight(?).

I believe this would explain why there are Jackson photos in the McCreight box of photos that Pelham has. There must have been a fairly close relationship between the McCrieghts and Jacksons in Winnsboro.

I have a photo of a portrait of Saml Jackson. The portrait is in a private home in Raleigh, NC. Just let me know if you need a copy of the photo.

Hello Pelham,

I have been to Ireland and collected a mass of information about the Sullivans and am right now working on organizing it into a coherent picture. I found the ruins of 15 of the 32 Sullivan castles. Some were deep in moss covered boggy woods and hard to find from a few yards away. I noticed one by seeing some rocks high in the air. The remains of the tower was so vine covered I did not see it from no more than 15 feet away.

I have been able to find documentary sources in Ireland to document all that I found. The next step is in Virginia, but the Virginia archive will not look up and copy documents, even if I know the volume numbers. I sent a check to a Virginia genealogist, the archive recommended, three months ago and asked him to copy the documents I want, but have so far not heard a word from him.

I have two questions:

I got so many E-Mails from Steve Beaty before I went to Ireland, that I cannot sort out exactly what your direct line of descent is from Hewlett Sullivan. Could you please send me that direct line again? Also may I use the Pelham pictures you sent in what I am writing about the Sullivans?

The other question is with regard to your appended E-Mail to me. You were getting ready for an exhibition when I asked the question and you were very busy. My was great-great-grandfather was Robert Jackson McCreight from Winnsboro, but nobody seems to know what the connection to the Jacksons was. I noticed when I was at the Museum last year that the McCreight pictures you showed me had something to do with the Jacksons. One of them was of my great-great-grandmother Mary Randolph, wife of Robert Jackson McCreight and called her grandmother. Jackson was on some of these pictures. I think whoever donated those pictures must know what that connection is.

You said you asked Eddie Killian to look into it. He did send me an E-Mail to say he was going to the office, but I never heard back from him.

Could you find an E-Mail address for the donor? I have already asked Doug and Bill Pooler. It is not in Doug's book and neither knows anything.
