The only South Carolina governor from Fairfield County, John Means, is buried in the cemetery. Fairfield County Historical Society and the S.C. Department of Archives and History collaborated on a historical marker to honor Means about 15 years ago.

"The work done Saturday is another example of wonderful volunteerism on the part of citizens who are concerned about preservation issues," said Fairfield County Museum director Pelham Spong.

Buckhead - Fairfield County (Rd 18)

Note: The iron gate from the cemetery was given to the Dogwood Garden Club in Columbia and is located on Pickens St. near Blossom at the east end of the garden in the corner of the USC campus.
