

A Sketch of the Descendants Of Joseph Mickle and Miss Hyde who married in Ireland and came to South Carolina and settled in Kershaw Co.

Written in summer of 1902 (page broken possibly 1907) (part of a signature on page) (Document attributed to L. M. Ford by Lucy Ford Mobley, My aunt, who provided the document. L. M. Ford is brother to Richard C. Ford, husband of Lucy A. Ford, both mentioned in this document) (Transcription by David P. Ford, October 20, 2003)

Page 1

Joseph Mickle married Miss Hyde in Ireland, and immigrated to South Carolina and settled in Kershaw County, probably in Camden, some time previous to the Revolutionary War. Their children were without regard to the order their birth, John, Johnathan, Robert, Rebecca, Mary and Joseph.

Joseph married Martha (Be)lton, who bore to him (Jo)hn Belton, Joseph, Martha, (Mar)y, Robert and Sarah. (John) Belton married Sarah (????) who bore to him

Page2

Sarah, Willis, Matilda, Jame(s) and Mollie.

Of John Belton Mickle's Family, Rebe@ca, John, Joseph, Belton and Sarah never married.

Willis married Hetti Niles, Camden S.C. They have several children.

Matilda married Ben Powell, Kershaw Co., S. C.

James married Mary E. Ford, Kershaw Co., S.C.

Mollie married Willie Brewer, (not sure of surname) Lancaster, S.C.

We now leave John Be(lton) and proceed to another.

Page 3

Joseph Mickle's first wife was Nancy Gandy, Columbia, S.C. and they had three children, William, Mary and Cornelia.

William became a Presbyterian and served a church in Mobile, Alabama. He married but nothing is known of his family.

Mary married and went to California, and her family is unknown.

Cornelia never married, she lives in Camden, S.C.

Joseph's second wife was Matilda Milling. She bore one child Nannie, who married William R.

Page 4

Nelson and bore to him several children.

This is all that is known of the family of Joseph Mickle.

Martha married Rice Doolan, and bore to him, Joseph, Martha, Rebecca, Janie, Arthur and Sallie.

Joseph went to California where he married and died. Nothing is known about his family.

Martha married James Cathcart and bore one child, Alice, who married Wright. Rebecca and Janie died unmarried.

Page 5

Arthur went to Mississippi and married, but nothing is known about his family. Sallie married in Sumter Co., S.C. where she lived, of her family nothing is known.

Page 6

Robert Mickle married Mary Ellison Peay, Who was the daughter of George S. Peay and wife Dorcas Rochelle, Chester Co. S.C. Their children were Lenorah, John, Martha, Joseph, Rebecca Rochelle, George, Lucy Ada and Robert English.

Lenorah married first James L. Haile, Kershaw Co. S.C. and bore to him James Rochelle (commonly called Chellie) Milton, Edward and James.

James R. married Lula Conley, York Co. So.Ca. and they reside near Fort Mill, S.C.

Page 7

Milton married Katie Philips who bore one child to him, Bessie. Milton died and his widow and child are near Fort Mill, S.C.

Edward and James died in childhood.
James L. Haile died in the Confederate Service. Lenorah his widow removed to Alabama with her father, while there she married a second husband, Henry Rutherford, they went to the Indian territory, where they lived many years. When Mr. Rutherford died their children were Laura, Minnie and William.

Page 8

Laura married Saylor and bore him one son, after Saylor's death in Indian Territory she married (name left blank), Rock Hill, S.C.
Minnie married George Ackley, Indian Territory, she died without issue.
William is with his mother in Texas.

*(written in in different ink) John Mickle served in the Confederate service as a member of Co (blank) Regt (blank) S.C. with bravery and much credit to himself. After the war was ended he went west to better his condition. He died in Indian Territory. John never married.

Page 9

Martha married Robert Boyles, Fairfield Co. So. Ca. And bore to him Robert, William and Frank Dangerfield.
Robert went to Texas where he married Janie Lee.
William married (blank) Columbia, S.C. He died without children.
Frank D. married Georgie Corley. They reside in Columbia, S.C. and have children.
Martha was burned to death by her clothing catching fire accidentally.
Joseph served in the Confederate service and was mortally wounded in the battle of Cold Harbor, and was

sent to the hospital in Richmond Va, where he died. He is burried in the Confederate Cemetery there.

Rebecca Rochelle married John Lewis Mickle and bore to him two children, the eldest died in infancy and John Lewis who is now is with his mother. (this is how it was worded)
George went to Mississippi where he married Mary Clifton, who bore one child, a son. They removed to Missouri, where George wounded himself while hewing with a broad-axe. He died of this wound.

Page 11

Lucy Ada married Richard Corneluis Ford, Fairfield Co, So. Ca. And bore to him Roberta, Mary, Estelle, Lucy Rebecca, Robert Mickle, Vitha Huger (Lily), Jeremiah Corneluis, Lenorah Dorcas, and John Lucuis. Roberta died an infant Oct 26, 1877. (she is burried Bethesda Cemetary Fairfield Co SC)

Mary E. married James W. Mickle. He died.

Richard C. Ford died July 20, 1893. And is burried at Ebenezer Cemetary.

Robert English married Fannie Price, Columbia S.C.

Mary E. Peay Mickle died June 3 1882. Robert Mickle died June 1882.

Page 12

Mary married James Lyles, Columbia S.C., and bore to him John B., Martha, Sallie and Mary.

John B. Lyles married Susan Patterson, Liberty Hill S. C. who bore children. They now live in Abbeville, S. C.

Martha married Dr. Todd, Sumter Co. S.C. and bore one son. Martha died in the Asylum, Columbia, S.C.

Sallie married Dr. Charles Hughes and bore two children to him. They live in Camden So. Ca.

Mary never married.

Page 13

Sarah married Capt John J. Nelson, Kershaw Co. S.C. and bore to him James, John J. Jr, Mollie, Mattie, English, Maggie and William R.

James married Ella Capers, Camden, S.C. who bore one child, a daughter, Abbie. She married Dr. Weinburg, a dentist of Camden, S.C. James and his wife are both dead.

John J. Nelson Jr. married Nannie Hoffman, Fairfield Co. S.C. They have no children and reside in Kershaw Co. S.C. not far from Sawney Creek.

Mollie married Frank P. Baird, Columbia, S.C. and bore to him several children.

Page 14

Frank P. Baird died suddenly while traveling on the train.

Mattie married Henry Baird, Columbia S.C. and bore several children. They reside in Camden, S.C.

William R. married Miss. Nannie Mickle, daughter of Capt. Joseph Mickle, Camden, S.C. She bore several children to him. She died 1902.

Maggie Nelson, a most beautiful girl died in young womanhood.

English, "a non composmentis" reached manhood before he went the way of all the earth.

Page 15

The decendants of Joseph Mickle the son of Joseph Mickle, who came from Ireland, and the Joseph who married Martha Belton are given on pages(1) to (14) inclusive. We shall now take up Jonathan, another son of Joseph who came from Ireland.

Page 16

Jonathan B. Mickle married Sallie Montgomery, daughter of Green B. Montgomery, Chester, Co. S.C. the first marrige. They had three children all daughters, the youngest died quite young but it is (not) known what became of the other two. Their names are not known.

Jonathan B. Mickle's second wife was a York Co. S.C. lady. She bore some children but their names and whereabouts arr not known, but it is supposed they live in York Co. as Jonathan spent many of his last years in that County.

Page 17

Jonathan B. Mickle first studied law, and practiced for some time in Winnsboro, S.C. from there he drifted to Chester, S.C. where he edited the "Chester Reporter," the County paper, from there he removed to York Co. where he farmed and taught school, and finally became a minister in the Methodist Church, and as such it is supposed he died.

This is all that is known of the family of Jonathan B. Mickle, son of Joseph Mickle who came from Ireland. We will now take up Robert Mickle another son of Joseph Mickle, and brother of Jonathan.

Page 18

Robert Mickle married Miss (blank) Salmond, Camden, S.C. who bore two children, Robert and Katie.

Robert became a Presbyterian Minister, married Kate Eigilberger, and went to Florida. Nothing is known of his family.

Katie never married, she died in the Asylum, Columbia, S.C.

Page 19

Rebecca, daughter of Joseph Mickle, who came from Ireland, married Henry Ballard. Rebecca died without issue.

Mary the other daughter of Joseph Mickle and sister of Rebecca mentioned above married Bagnall, Sumter, Co. S.C. and bore some children to him, the number, names, whereabouts of their children is not known among their kin here.

Page 20 is a blank page.

Page 21

John, another son of the original Joseph Mickle, who came from Ireland, married Charlotte Fleming, Lancaster Co. S.C. who bore to him John Lewis, Robert, Martha, Mary, Elizabeth, Rebecca, Josephnie, Joseph, Caroline and Thomas.

John Lewis Mickle married Rebecca Rochelle Mickle daughter of Robert Mickle and her family is noted among the descendants of Joseph Mickle. John Lewis Mickle died April 28 1902.

Robert Mickle died unmarried.

Martha married William Neal. She was the second wife to Mr. Neal and bore to him one child, William.

Page 22

William is a practicing physician somewhere in Florida,

Mary married John Minton and bore one child to him, Mary. She married Willis Huckabee, Camden, S.C.

Elizabeth never married.

Rebecca married Charles Chatten, and bore to him Charlotte, John, Belton, Joseph and Maud.

Charlotte married Edward Gerald.

William Neal has three sons.

Page 23

Josephine's first husband was James Stevens, and bore two children to him. Her Second husband was Henry Stevens, a brother of James her first husband, she bore no children to Henry. They reside in Waycross, Georgia.

Joseph went to Florida, where he married, and two children were born to him. Nothing else is known of his family. Joseph himself was assassinated. Since the above was written it is learned that it was Joseph's wife that was assassinated and not Joseph.

Page 24

Caroline's first husband was Dr. Dunning, her second was Dr. Catoe, both of Florida. She died without issue.

Page 25

Thomas married Jane Price, Fairfield Co. S.C. who bore to him... (nothing else on page)

Page 26 is a blank page.

Page 27

Thomas Mickle married Jane Price, daughter of Abner and Mary Price, York Co, S.C. They first resided on Grannys Quarter, Kershaw Co. S.C. where their first two children were born. After the close of secession war they went to Marion Co. Florida where George F. and Robert T. were born. After spending four years in Fla, they returned to S.C. and resided in West Wateree, Kershaw Co. S.C. until the death of Thomas Mickle April 19 1895.
