

HILL & HILL-MOBERLY CONNECTIONS OF FAIRFIELD COUNTY, S. C.

After the conclusion of the Rev. War many of the Moberlys and allied families moved west to Georgia. Later some of these families moved on to Alabama and Mississippi. The 1790 Census records of the Fairfield Moberlys are found on page 251.

ADDITIONAL RECORDS OF FAIRFIELD MOBERLYS

NOLLY (NOTLEY) MOBLEY received a 15½ acre land grant in Fairfield County, June 1, 1818. Book No. 62, page 98. (Unless otherwise stated, all land grants shown are from S. C. Sec. of State Office.)

22 April 1818 - Notley Mobley to Henry Peeples, tract of land granted to Wm. Mobley in 1760. (Note: Notley's ancestry is unplaced - Compiler)

EDWARD AND NANCY MOBLEY - (Both Clement and Benjamin Mobley had sons named Edward and the names of their wives was Nancy. Records indicate that both may have moved to Kentucky. However the following is found in Fairfield Records:

22 Feb. 1799 - Edward Mobley of Fairfield Co., Planter, to Daniel Major tract of land bounded by William Mobley granted to Adam Effort.

19 Feb. 1799 - Edward Mobley and Nancy his wife to Jacob Minck, 70 acres bounded by Edw. Mobley's Spring Branch.
