It is a Mobley old home place, but I believe it was another Biggers Mobley and his family, graveyard is there. Old home is gone. Part of the family of Mobleys. Trying to remember the road number, it's in Chester Co above Fairfield Co. SC

Mother, VABrannon (Victoria Pickrell Brannon) knows more than myself.

I remember going there when we attended a Lyles Reunion. I will look for the old photos taken of the family graves.

The large two storey home of Biggers Mobley sat several hundred feet west of the Rev. Samuel Mobley cemetery, which is described in NOTES on Samuel Mobley. The home was demolished several years ago. Photo of the house is on file. See Scrapbook.

There is a writing somewhere about Biggers, that I cannot find at the present time. It tells of the suffering Bigges endured after mistreatment of some kind while he was imprisoned for mistreatment of a negro woman (I believe), and afterward he was a broken man. I shall try to find it. This information was written in the book, History of Fairfield Country, SC. by Hugh McMaster.
