THOMAS WARING, gentleman, of Charleston (late-ly co-partner with BENJAMIN VILLEPONTOUX, gentleman), & MARY his wife, to ANDREW LORD, merchant, of Charleston, attorney for WILLIAM GREENWOOD & WILLIAM HIGGINSON, merchants, of London; as security for 12 bonds issued by WARING & VILLEPONTOUX to GREENWOOD & HIGGINSON, for £ 1021:17:4-1/2 currency each; 4 Negroes & his plantation of 500 a. in Craven Co., on the branches of Cedar & Dutchmans Creek, bounding NE on ARCHIBALD McNEIL; SE on JAMES SAUNDERS; other sides on vacant land. Witnesses: WILLIAM HASELL GIBBES, TIMOTHY GREENWOOD. Before WILLIAM RUGELEY, J.P. Recorded 27 Mar. 1773 by HENRY RUGELEY, Register.

FRANCIS WEAVER, labourer, & MARY (her mark) his wife, to WILLIAM CATES, labourer, both of Craven Co., for £ 300 currency, 200 a. in the fork of Broad & Saludy Rivers, on a branch of Enoree, called Kings Creek, not 5 ft. broad & 1 ft. deep; bounding NW on MARY FROST; other sides on vacant land. Witnesses: CHARLES COATS, WILLIAM SPARKS, ZACHARIAH SPARKS. Before JOHN JOHNSTON, J.P. Recorded 27 Mar. 1773 by HENRY RUGELEY, Register.

RICHARD BROOKS, planter, of Craven Co., & LUCRETIA (her mark) his wife, to JAMES WILSON, son of the JAMES WILSON who died in Nov. 1769, for £ 20 currency, 200 a. in Craven Co., on Headly Creek, a branch of Indian Creek, bounding on all sides on vacant land; granted 12 Dec. 1768 by Gov. CHARLES GREVILLE MONTAGU to RICHARD BROOKS; beginning at a post oak, then N 50 W 44 chains 72 links to a corner pine; S 40 W to a corner pine 44 chains 72 links; then S 50 E 44 chains 72 links to a corner red oak; then to beginning (Sec. Book D.D.D., p. 17). Witnesses: WILLIAM HUNT, JAMES RANDOLPH, SARAH (her mark) BROOKS. Before THOMAS FLETCHALL, J.P. Recorded 28 Mar. 1773 by WILLIAM RUGELEY, Pro. Register.
