SUSANNAH DeRUEL of Fairfield County, S. C.

Edward Moberley, Sr., was born 1700 in 11 Apr. 1765? and died\* circa 1787 in Camden District, Fairfield County, South Carolina. He married Susannah DeRuel who was born 1702 and died circa 1761.

1781 or 1782 - note below

His ancestry is the subject of considerable research by family historians. It is stated\*\* that he was the son or a descendent of William Moberley...that Wm ran away from home and landed in Pennsylvania at the age of eighteen years. The story further states that he married Phoebe Lovejoy and settled at Point (Port) Tobacco, Maryland.

Susannah DeRuel's ancestry is unplaced and no clue of her origin is to be found. She apparently died in Fairfield County, (then Craven District,) South Carolina, soon after the family came to that country.

The first authentic record of the family shows Edward, his sons and sons-in-law, in the Tithe (Tax) lists of Lunenburg County, Virginia in 1748 to 1752. Between 1755 and 1760 the family moved to Craven County, S. C. Craven County, at that time, occupied most of upper Carolina. Later one of its subdivisions was Camden; and Fairfield County was a part of Camden District, (about 1785), and by 1868 it was designated "Fairfield County." In this work we use county and district, interchangeably.

The Moberlys, on their arrival, and for some years afterward, received land grants in South Carolina in northwest Fairfield County and in other parts of the state. William Moberley, Sr., Edward's eldest son, received the first Mobley grant in the new land.

The Cherokee War occurred soon after the Moberleys arrived in South Carolina. Edward and Clement Mobley are listed as having served in that conflict. Although the American Revolution commenced in 1775, it was 1780 before the war reached Fairfield County, to any extent. The Mobley's cast their lot with the Colonies and served with the Patriot Whigs in the South Carolina Militia.

\*\* See page 234. William Mobley, son of above Edward Mobley, Sr. applied for letters of adm. of Edward Sr. Estate - was bonded and served. The sale was 10th of Nov - 1782 - I have copies of this from Camden Court House - Got in Nov - 1944 - So Edward Sr. above died before 1782 as his sale was Nov. 10th 1782 - His wife Susannah DeRuel Mobley bought a number of articles, Edward Mobley, Jr. also William (his son) bought many things...

① WILLIAM MOBERLEY, Senior, son of Edward Moberley, Sr. and Susannah DeRuel, was born circa 1725-30. He married Ann Osborne before 1750. Their son, Eliaser, received a land grant in 1771, being 21 years of age at that time.

William Moberley, Sr., left the Lunenburg-Bedford County, Va. area and moved to South Carolina where he received a land grant in 1758. According to the records of the Historical Commission of S. C., both William Moberley, Sr., and Junior served in the South Carolina Militia. However, there were a number of William Mobley's in S. C. at that time and the Henry Chapman Bible record hints that he may have been deceased before the outbreak of the American Revolution. He received three land grants of 100, 200 and 150 acres in northwest Fairfield County in 1758-9. (Sec. of State Office - Columbia, S. C.) He sold 200 acres to Edward Moberly (his brother) and 150 acres to Benjamin Mobley, on the 9th and 10th days of May, 1762.

(1) Eleazer or Eliaser (Elias) Moberly was born circa 1750. There is no record of the date of his marriage to the Widow Ann Lyles. He received a land grant in Craven County, S. C., of 200 acres on July 9, 1771. The S. C. Militia records, shown by his indent, verifies that he accompanied Colonel John Winn on an expedition against Stono in 1779.

A deed in the Fairfield records - Book C, page 96, dated Nov. 7, 1775?, "Eleazer Mobley, of Camden District, State of S. C., ... to Ephraim Mabry, land on north side of Broad River, partly against the upper end of the Great Island...said land granted by His Excellency, the Rt. Hon. Lord Charles Granville Montague...to the said Eleazer Mobley the 8th day of February, 1773."

Another deed dated or recorded in 1787; Book B, pages 72-73.. "Eleazer Mobley of the state of S. C., and Camden District, Lyles and Ann, his wife, to George Godspeed and Hannah Godspeed...Land on a branch of Bever Creek. Witnesses: Thos. Cockrell, John Stone, et al.

Feb. 3, 1779 - Fairfield Records. "Eleazer Mobley of Craven County to Samuel Mobley, a negro slave." Book O, p. 442.

Dec. 5, 1789 - Fairfield deeds. "Eleazer Mobley of Richmond Co., Georgia, to Thomas Burns of Fairfield Co., S. C., conveyed by Martin Haile to William Mobley 12 February 1764 and whereas the said Wm. Mobley died intestate and whereas the said Eleazer Mobley as his eldest son and heir hath sold the sd. 100 acres therefore he makes deed to Burns for same. Wit: Francis Coleman, Job Meador and Armenus Liles. Deed Bk. N, pp 25, 27, 28".

From the above record, it seems that Eleazer Mobley moved to Richmond Co., Georgia and that is our last record of him.

William Moberly, Sr. and Ann Osborne. continued.

(2) William Moberly, Jr., son of Wm. and Ann Moberly, married Fanny (Francis) Rogers. Her ancestry is unplaced. She could have been related to one of the several Rogers families who lived in northwest Fairfield county about that time. His birthdate is unknown but he probably was born in the 1750's. He may have served in the Revolution with the S. C. Militia. In the list of "Soldiers of S. C. who applied for Pensions in 1836 whose claims were suspended...." Francis Moberly, Widow of William Moberly of Fairfield County...

(3) Samuel Moberly, son of Wm. and Anna Moberly died single. <sup>OSBORNE</sup>

(4) Isham Moberly, son of Wm. and Anna Moberly, married his first cousin, Susannah Moberly, daughter of Clemet and Mary Fox Moberly. His name was not listed in the 1790 census of Fairfield County. We have been unable to find his Rev. War record, if any. However, it is clear that one Isham lived in the county after the Rev. War. The name appears as a witness to the will of Thomas Moberly (his brother) in 1807. One Isham Moberly lived into the 1820's in Fairfield. Mills "Statistics of S. C." states... "Wm. Coleman, Robert Shirley, Isham Moberly and several others average in their ages upwards of 90..." In the local Census of 1829, Isham Moberly, Sr. is listed with five in his family and Isham, Jr. with seven in his household. *Isham Moberly, Sr. was living in Fairfield Co. in 1829, also his son Isham Jr.*

About the time some of the Moberlys removed to Kentucky, Isham sold land as follows: Book A, page 309, 1787, Fairfield records.. "Isham Moberly and his wife Susannah, to Lowery Conrad.. tract of land granted to Henry Funderburgh."

(5) Jemima Moberly, daughter of Wm. and Anna Moberly, married Edward Lovejoy. 1790 census of Camden - Fairfield District... Edward Lovejoy.. 2 males over 16 years; four males under 16 years; and five females. (one list shows Edward as a Rev. War Veteran). <sup>OSBORNE</sup>

(6) Captain Thomas Moberly married Mary Funderburg, daughter of Henry and Mary Funderburgh of Fairfield County. 1790 census: Thomas Moberly... 1 male over 16 years; 1 under 16 years and two females. "Salley's Stubs to Indents", Book Y, page 79; "Thomas Moberly, to pay for mare furnished state troops - ordered to pay to Capt. Anderson Thomas, Aug. 26, 1786." /Signed/ Thomas Moberly. Appraisal of the horse by Edward Lovejoy and Henry Funderburg." He is shown on one of the family lists as a Rev. War veteran. It is not clear whether his title of Captain was won in the war or afterwards in the State Militia.

Daniel A. Mobley may have married Temperance (Tempsey) Chapman, daughter of William Chapman (d. 1841). Mentioned: "Tempsey Mobley..daughter and wife of Daniel Mobley of Walton County, Ga." The census of 1850 for Walton County, Ga.: Daniel N? Mobley, 62, wife, Temperance Mobley 55 F., Henry 21; Rebecca 24; John 18; and William Mobley 16, all born in South Carolina.

Nancy Mobley married her first cousin, Henry Funderburgh, and they lived in the Walton-Jackson and Gwinnett County Area, Ga.

(7) Dorcas Mobley, daughter of Wm. and Ann<sup>OSBORNE</sup> Moberly, married William Hill, Jr., son of Wm. Hill, Sr., of Fairfield Co., S. C. (see page 10) William Hill Junior was shown as a Rev. War Vet. in the Mobley lists but this is unconfirmed. *It is true - I have the list. Hill.*

(8) Mary Moberly, daughter of William Moberly, Sr. and Ann Osborne, married Richard Hill of Northwest Fairfield County. (see page 15).

(9) Keziah Moberly, daughter of Wm. and Ann<sup>OSBORNE</sup> Moberly, md. a distant cousin, Colin (Cullen) Mobley. See page 228.

(10) Elizabeth Moberly, daughter of Wm. and Ann<sup>OSBORNE</sup> Moberly, married Micajah Mobley, a brother of Colin Mobley. He was known as "Cage" Mobley. See page 229.
