## Obituary

Minister David S. Mobley was born November 15, 1954, in Winnsboro, South Carolina. He answered his call to glory on July 2, 2005. He was the son of the late William and Sallie Hemphill Mobley. He attended Fairfield County schools.

He was employed with Rachlin Furniture Company for 17 years, where he was supervisor. He was also employed as a welder with the Hon Company for 9 years and Belk Distribution.

He gave his life to the Lord in the early 80's. He answered his call to Ministry on May 12, 1996 at Jesus Christ Church under Pastor Jeffrey J. Williams. He founded Jesus Christ Tabernacle in 1998.
