THE OBITUARY

MISS PEARL H. MOBLEY, daughter of the late John G. Mobley and Mrs. Emily Nettles Watson died peacefully at her home October 19, 1983.

She was a retired school teacher who taught in the Fairfield County Schools for forty-six (46) years.

At an early age she joined Greater Mount Zion Baptist Church and worked there continuously throughout her life.
