Death At Blackstock.

Blackstock, June 21.—On last
ay, June 15, Mrs. Roxann
Dixon Mobley passed away at the
home of her daughter, Mrs. G. L.
Kennedy. Mrs. Mobley was eighty
four years old. For three years she
has been partially paralyzed, but has
been able to be about the house in
her rolling chair. Two days before
the end she suffered a second stroke
and in less than two days, in the
silent watches of the night, her spirit
it slipped away. She was laid to
rest in the old Concord Cemetery at
Woodward. The funeral was con-
ducted by her former pastor, Dr.
Mayes, of Winnsboro, six grandsons
acting as pallbearers.

Mrs. Mobley was a daughter of
Col. Tillman Lee and Eliza Barnes
Dixon. She was born at Liberty
Hill, Kershaw county, August 10.

1837. December 6, 1854, she was
married to Edward D. Mobley.
Since his death some years ago she
has made her home with the chil-
dren, of whom the following reside
in or near Blackstock: Mrs. G. L.
Kennedy, Mrs. Daniel Hall, Miss
Martha Mobley, Messrs. S. D. Mob-
ley, J. D. Mobley, D. B. Mobley, E.
W. Mobley. The other living chil-
dren are Mrs. D. A. Crawford, of
Winnsboro, Messrs. E. L. Mobley, of
Columbia, D. M. Mobley, of Birming-
ham, A. L. Mobley, of Barry, Texas.
Besides these eleven children there
are thirty-seven grandchildren and
thirty-one great-grandchildren to
inherit the blessings of her long and
useful life.

Mrs. Mobley was a life-long mem-
ber of the Presbyterian church.
She was a woman of faith and pray-
er, and exemplified in her life the
substantial virtues of the ancient
mother in Israel. In her affliction
she was patient and cheerful.
