1 I desire no part of my property to be inherited by Ella R. Wright - otherwise known as Ella R. Mubley - to whom I was unfortunately married when a mere boy.

2 I bequeath to Emily Watson - three thousand dollars to be invested and the interest paid to her annually - and at her death to be equally divided between her five children namely Mand Watson - Lilly Watson - Pearl Watson - Daisy Watson and Rowland Watson

3 I bequeath all my house hold goods and furniture in Fairfield County to the said Emily Watson

4 I bequeath my house hold furniture and the picture of my mother and father - which is now in the City of Columbia to Moses H. Mubley

5 I bequeath two hundred dollars to pay for the tomb now being made for my mother's grave by Lewis G. Bye of Wimsboro and one hundred and forty dollars to pay the said Lewis G. Bye for a coping which is to be erected around my square which is Number one hundred and forty eight in the 1st Presbyterian Church Yard

6 I desire to be buried by the side of my mother in the said square and church yard and that a monument be erected over my

gram at a cost of not over two hundred dollars.

7 I bequeath my violin - gun and watch to David C. Means

8 I bequeath all of my family portraits to my Cousin David H. Means other than those given to Moses H. Mubley

9 I bequeath a portrait which my mother had made of my self and my horse Salem to my friend W. S. Pope.

10 I bequeath to Emily Watson - my maid mare and give her such as she may select.

11 I bequeath to Edward McCray and Wyatt McCray one hundred dollars each.

12 All the rest residue and remainder of my real and personal estate I devise and bequeath to be equally divided between my Cousins - Brattin Davis - Beverly W. English David C. Means - Fannie A. Means - Fannie C. Gillespie - Hazard Means Jr - Sons of J. H. Means and Marion Mubley

13 Any insurance on my life that I may leave will go direct to the party to whom it - is left - by instructions in the policy without affecting any bequests that have been made herein.

14 I have become impressed with David W. Robinson Esq as a lawyer a man of character and above all as a Christian and I appoint him the executor of this my last will and testament and

I desire him to take immediate possession of any and all property that I may die possessed of - immediately on his being informed of my death for the purposes herein stated.

I also desire the said David W. Robinson Esq to have the said square No 148 in the Presbyterian Church yard - well cased for by the Sexton of the said church, on account of its containing my mother's grave - as long as he the said David W. Robinson lives - and if I do not live to have brick laid over the square above described and said brick cemented (except over the graves) that he will have the work done - and I hereby bequeath to him a sufficient amount of money to have it done as his judgment may suggest.
