Overview

Thirty-five persons are known to be buried at the Henry Moore Burying Ground near Winnsboro, Fairfield County, South Carolina. The grave yard is on property owned by the heirs of Henry Moore and his son, William when the last burial there occurred in 1852. A complete ownership history of the land on which the graveyard is situated is not available to me.

The first burial at the Henry Moore Burying Ground was Agnes W. Robertson in 1779. She was a younger sister of Henry Moore's future wife, Jane Robertson. At this point, I cannot say that the first burial occurred when Henry Moore owned the site.

Two more children of Alexander Robertson were buried there: Janney Robertson in 1792 and in 1841 Jane Robertson Moore was buried there without a grave marker. The father of all the Robertsons, Alexander himself, was buried in 1796.

The first Moore to be buried there was Henry Moore, Junior, in 1808. The last Moore to be placed there was a great grandson of Henry Moore, unnamed, who died in 1852, the offspring of Jane Sterling Kersh nee Moore. All together, 15 Moores are buried there, including Henry Moore the antecedent of them all. He, like his wife, Jane, was buried without a grave stone. See item 4 above.

Friends of the Moores were permitted to bury their family members in the graveyard. A total of 16 other persons are buried there.

Two surveys of the Graveyard have been carried out and recorded.

The first was by Eliza R. Wylie of Richburg, South Carolina, a descendant of Henry Moore. Her report was found at the NSDAR Library: "Arkansas Genealogical Research Records, Vol 27, Arkansas DAR, 1945-46", pages 204 through 208. The survey and the report appear to have been prepared in 1920's although no sure dates of survey and report are anywhere to be seen. This estimate is based on a paragraph in her report, see item 4 above.

The second was prepared by John H. and Gail Weldon of Micanopy, Florida in March 1994. This report was obtained from the Fairfield Co., SC, Genealogical Society in Winnsboro, SC. I think that John is a descendant of Samuel and Nancy Weldon who are buried there.



Additional information from a Survey by Eliza R. Wylie

In addition to the notes and footnotes added to the Survey by John and Gail Weldon, I offer the following item of interest from Mrs. Wylie's report as presented in the referenced DAR volume.

"Between Caroline Moore on right and Sarah Juliann Smart left are two unmarked graves which are Maj. Henry Moore and his wife. The son of Major Henry Moore's overseer, (Robert R. Crawford) went to the graveyard with me. He said that his father, Robert R. Crawford told him that Major Henry Moore requested no marker be put to his grave, but to plant a cedar tree there. At the foot of one of the unmarked graves was a large cedar tree which had just died. Without a doubt I think that is his grave. The large 8-room brick house was torn down by a party who bought the land and carried to Winnsboro to build his home. Mr. Crawford showed me the spot where Major Henry Moore's house stood there were some scattered brick."

Mrs. Wylie's first sentence quoted above describes a layout of gravestones which does not appear to match the map drawn by John & Gail Weldon. The gravestone for Caroline Moore nee Smart is Map Key number 11. The gravestone for Sarah Julian(n)(a) Smart Moore is Map Key number 9. Mrs. Wylie places two unmarked graves between them. The gravestone for Wm. Alexander is between them on the map.

The map shows two large fallen trees. One rooted near the solitary foot stone, Map Key number 21A and Number 21, the grave of Ester Mary Herron. The second lies diagonally across a bordered plot containing most of the permitted families' graves. Neither can readily be identified as the cedar tree requested by Henry Moore as told by Mrs. Wylie. I do not doubt that a cedar tree was planted. If in Mrs. Wylie's survey in the early part of the 20th century, she viewed a fallen cedar tree, it might have rotted completely away by 1994.

It is also a mystery how she observed an unmarked grave; was it a depression?

Additional Remarks by Stewart Whittle

Thinking that the map might reveal clues if the dates of death were superimposed on the gravestone layout, I entered the death dates and found little of interest. The succession of gravestones was not translatable into much useful information. The Moore line graves are lined up and the first grave is dated 1808. The Ellisons' graves are clustered in the small yard, the earliest is 1793, and the two Adger graves are mingled. The Robertson gravestones are isolated from the others.

Based on the engraved death dates, the oldest gravestones are Robertson childrens'. The stone is described as small and dark. The engraving is described as "script". Two Robertson children who died 13 years apart are presented on one stone. It is notable that the gravestone of their father, Alexander Robertson, is of the same stone and engraving style. These circumstances suggest that both stones were manufactured at one time and not as the individual deaths

⁴ A rough estimate of the date of this visit is based on age range of a son who lives 70 years beyond his father's employment by Henry Moore. I estimate that it took place in the 1920s.

occurred. When that singular time was, is not known other than the creation of the two similar gravestones occurred after Alexander Robertson died 1796. If this is true, then the earliest gravestone placed in the Henry Moore Burying Ground may be that of Elizabeth Ellison, who died in 1793. The burial of the first person remains Agnes W. Robertson, deceased 1779.

I am unsure that it needs to be said because it must be obvious to the reader, but to bring closure to this research document, the gravestones of the Henry Moore family are literate affirmations of faith in the Lord Christ, hope of salvation everlasting and charity.

The Map Key numbers for Moore descendants are bold. The Map Key numbers for Robertson family members are bold italics. Mrs. Wylie was principally concerned with the Moore family which was her ancestral family. Therefore, many of the gravestones for other families were omitted from her report as presented in the DAR volume. In the List, the bold Map Key Numbers are gravestones reported by her as Robertson and Moore family members. A few others do occur in her report. She was explicitly uncertain whether or not they were her relatives. Variations in the reported data between the two Surveys are annotated or footnoted in the display of the John & Gail Weldon Survey Report.
