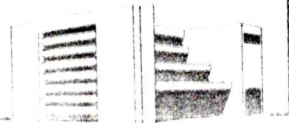

**W**ILLIAM PRESLEY NEALE, M.D., of Point Pleasant, Virginia, *b.* 30th March, 1849, at "Ben Lomond" Mason County, West Virginia; *d.* 22d August, 1912; *m.* 10th December, 1873. Helen Virginia WAGGENER, *b.* 12th November, 1848, dau. of Col. C. B. and Margaret Skillin (LEWIS) WAGGENER.

WILLIAM PRESLEY NEALE, M.D. was reared on a farm and received his early education in the common schools; later took a collegiate course in Bethany College, Brooke County, West Virginia, when he graduated in 1868; began the study of medicine at Malden, Kanawha County, West Virginia, which was kept up for two years alternated with school teaching; in 1869 studied at Point Pleasant under Dr. Andrew R. BARBER, and in 1870 entered the University of Pennsylvania at Philadelphia where he graduated M.D., 12th March, 1872, was a Director of the West Virginia State Hospital for the Insane; Past Master Minturn Lodge, No. 19 A. F. & A. M.; Past High Priest of Pt. Pleasant Chapter No. 7 Royal Arch Masons; Member Franklin Commandery Knights Templar 32nd Degree A. A. S. Rite.

## Lineage

NEALE or NEILL is a Celtic word meaning champion, or "Victory of the people." The derivation is NEALE, or NEILLE, or NIUL, from NIADH, meaning champion.

Neill of the "Nine Hostages" is one of the greatest of ancient heroes. The last but one of the pagan kings of Ireland, he was by chance the means of introducing Christianity, for he carried off by piratical descent upon a Roman Colony a young boy who afterward was the apostle of Ireland (St. Patrick). Neill was of the family of the Clan Neill, one of the leading sept of the north of Ireland. Romantic and thrilling are the stories told of him. When going to settle on the Ulster coast he resolved to take possession of the new country by touching the shore first, and find-



ing that he was to be outstripped by his companions, he tore out his dagger, cut off his right hand at the wrist, and threw it on the beach, so that his fingers were first laid on the domain. Such is the tale that accounts for the O'NEILL'S War Cry, "Lamhdearg Abou" (Red hand set on) and for the Red hand on the shield of the O'NEILLS of Ulster.

The first mention of the NEALS in Virginia is in 1630, when John NEALE "Gent" was granted fifty acres in Accomac County. Nine years later he was Member of the House of Burgesses. His wife was Elizabeth SOUTHEY. Other Members of the House of Burgesses were Capt. Richard and Christopher NEALE. The latter was Justice of Northumberland County, from 1685 to 1719. Representatives of the family were living in King William, Fauquier, and Mason Counties.

This branch of the Virginia family is descended from Lieut. Daniel NEALE, *b.* 1620; *d.* 1671; one of the two "forfeiting" proprietors of Ireland who settled in Northumberland County, Virginia and was appointed in 1659 Constable; from the county records we learn that his wife's name was Eleanor ———.

CHRISTOPHER NEALE of Northumberland, Virginia; *b.* 1664; *d.* 1696, was a Burgess of the Virginia Assembly and a Civil Officer of the County from 1680 to 1685; *m.* Hannah RODHAM, dau. of Matthew and Elizabeth RODHAM.

DANIEL NEALE, III, of Cople Parish, Westmoreland County, Virginia, *b.* in Northumberland County, 26th July, 1673; *d.* December, 1713; his will is dated 19th December, 1713; and probated same year; was a Member of the Virginia House of Burgesses; removed to Westmoreland County; *m.* Ursula PRESLEY, dau. of Col. William PRESLEY, and sister of Capt. Peter PRESLEY of "Northumberland House" Northumberland County, Virginia; she *m.* (2d) Wharton RAUSDALL, by whom she had issue.

CAPT. PRESLEY NEALE, *b.* in Westmoreland County, Virginia, *d.* in Fairfax County, 1749; was at one time sub-sheriff of Westmoreland County; *m.* circa, 1734, Margaret ——— probably a dau. of Moore and Margaret (MICOU) FAUNTLEROY; removed to Fairfax County, Virginia, where his will was probated in 1749, in which he names his wife Margaret.
