NALY, RICHARD, Kittery, disfranchis. 1669, as a Quaker.

NANEY, or NANNY, ROBERT, Boston, sent by Robert Cordell, a goldsmith of Lombard street, London, in the Increase, 1635, aged 22, was first at Dover, perhaps, or Saco, had good charact. bef. com. in 1652, to B. by w. Catharine, d. of Rev. John Wheelwright, had John, b. 16 Feb. 1654, d. soon; John, again, 12 Aug. 1655, d. soon; John, again, 12 Aug. 1656; Joseph, 1 June 1658; James, 27 Aug. 1659; Mary, 22 June 1661; and Eliz. 2 Jan. 1663; and he d. 27 Aug. foll. His will, made 5 days preced. names w. and ch. only Samuel, who was b. bef. his f. came from the E. and Mary, and one anticip.; so that prob. Joseph, James, and Eliz. beside the three Johns d. early. He was a merch. own. est. in Barbadoes, perhaps in comp. with Richard Hutchinson of London, wh. he calls uncle, and by inv. shows £1089, 14, 1¼; and his wid. m. Edward Naylor.

NARRAMORE, RICHARD, Mass. master of the ketch Sparrow, in Aug. 1687, brot. persons from the Bahamas, suspected of piracy by Sir E. Andros, our Gov. See 3 Mass. Hist. Coll. VII. 185. THOMAS, Dorchester 1664, a fisherman, perhaps br. of the preced. rem. to Boston, where w. Hannah join. the sec. ch. 29 May 1681, by her had Hannah, b. 23 Sept. 1671; Sarah, 26 Sept. 1672; James, 4 May 1674; John, 10 Sept. 1676; and Sarah, again, 10 Aug. 1686. Prob. he rem. to New Hampsh. and early in 1690 pray. for jurisdic. of Mass.

NASH, DANIEL, Northampton, s. of Timothy, m. 1 June 1710, Experience, d. of John Clark, had Sylvanus, b. 11 Jan. 1712; Zeruah, 2 Nov. 1713; Daniel, 13 Sept. 1715; Experience, 26 Dec. 1716; Joseph, 23 Apr. 1718; rem. to Hadley, there had Onesimus; Jonathan, 3 Dec. 1721; Rebecca; Josiah; and Phineas; was deac. rem. a. 1739, over the mountains to Housatonic, now Great Barrington, and d. 10 Mar. 1760, aged 84, says the gr. stone. EDWARD, Norwalk 1654, in 1672 had two ch. in his fam. but prob. others. He is not in the list of freem. 1669, tho. accept. conditionally 1664, yet had good est. EBENEZER, Suffield, s. of Timothy, m. July 1701, Mary, d. of John Scott, had Jonathan, b. 30 May 1702, d. at 2 yrs.; Mary, 29 Oct. 1704; and Miriam, 27 Jan. 1710. EPHRAIM, Hadley, youngest br. of the preced. m. 10 Jan. 1705, Joanna, d. of John Smith, had Timothy, b. 26 Jan. 1707; Ephraim, 16 Jan. 1710; Aaron, 23 Feb. 1712; Joanna, 4 July 1715, d. soon; Joanna, again, 28 Aug. 1716, d. at 2 yrs; Martin, 19 Jan. 1718; Eleazer, 10 Feb. 1720; and Elisha, 8 Oct. 1729. FRANCIS,

Braintree, a soldier of capt. Johnson's comp. Dec. 1675. GREGORY, Charlestown 1630, came prob. in the fleet with Winth. and he and his w. d. in Feb. foll. ISAAC, Dover 1657, perhaps rem. to York, there d. bef. July 1662. His wid. Phebe m. John Pierce. * JACOB, Weymouth, s. of James, by w. Abigail had Joseph, b. 11 Oct. 1669; John, 8 Oct. 1671; Abigail, 7 Aug. 1673; Thomas, 11 Jan. 1682; Alice and Benjamin, tw. 24 Mar. 1685; Sarah, 7 June 1688; beside Alice, and, perhaps, more, of wh. the rec. is imperf.; was freem. 1666, rep. in 1689 and 90. JACOB, Weymouth, prob. s. of James, was freem. 1686. * JAMES, Weymouth, fondly thot. to have been a sett. there in 1628, but very prob. may have been of 1638, freem. 1645, had James, Jacob, and, perhaps, other ch. was rep. 1655, 62, and 7. JAMES, Boston, carpenter in 1651; prob. s. of the preced. went to Weymouth, was freem. 1666. † * JOHN, New Haven 1642, s. of Thomas, b. in Eng. had by w. Eliz. (d. prob. of Edmund Tapp of Milford) wh. d. 1 May 1676, Eliz. bapt. 3 Jan. 1647; Sarah, 29 July 1649; Mary, b. 13 Dec. 1652, bapt. prob. 16 Jan. foll.; Hannah, 24 July 1655, bapt. 4 days aft.; and prob. no s.; was lieut. 1652, rep. 1665, at the first Ct. aft. the union, and in 1672 chos. an Assist. in wh. place he was cont. acc. the custom of ann. elect. to his d. 3 July 1687. Eliz. m. 2 Dec. 1676, capt. Aaron Cook, and d. 3 Sept. 1687; Sarah m. 8 Feb. 1689, Thomas Yale; Mary m. 1679, Philip Paine; and Hannah m. 13 Feb. 1673, Eliphalet Ball, and next, 2 Apr. 1689, Thomas Trowbridge. JOHN, Branford, prob. s. of the first Joseph, m. 22 Aug. 1677, Eliz. wid. of Anthony Howe, had Joseph, b. 1 Aug. 1678; Thomas, 28 Jan. 1680; and Eliz. 15 Apr. 1681; and he d. next yr. JOHN, Norwalk, perhaps s. of Edward, said to be the first Eng. ch. b. in the town, m. 1 May 1684, Mary, d. of John Combs of Boston, not (as the valua. Hist. of Hall says) of Thomas Barlow, or Barley, of Fairfield, whose wid. had m. Combs, had John, b. 25 Dec. 1688; Nathan, 26 June 1693, beside Joseph, and four ds. who are not ment. in Hall's Hist. Hall makes the ws. dec. 2 Sept. 1711, but ano. acco. says 1698. JOHN, Salisbury 1660, had prob. been 8 yrs. bef. at Newbury. JOHN, Boston, cooper, m. Rebecca, d. of Laurence Smith of Dorchester, had Mary, b. 26 Nov. 1667; and John, 9 Mar. 1672. JOHN, Hadley, s. of Timothy, m. 29 Mar. 1689, Hannah, d. of Samuel Porter, who d. within 2 mos. and he m. 27 Nov. 1691, Eliz. d. of Joseph Kellogg, had Rebecca, b. 27 Feb. 1693; John, 2 July 1694; Moses, 2 July 1696; Eliz. 15 Dec. 1698, d. in few days; Timothy, 13 Nov. 1699; Abigail, 10 Apr. 1702; Stephen, 20 Sept. 1704; Daniel, 8 Dec. 1706; Samuel, 29 Jan. 1709; Phineas, 18 Jan. 1713, d. at 2 mos.; and Enos, 21 Apr. 1714. JOSEPH, New Haven, s. of Thomas, by w. Mary, wh. d. 25 Dec. 1654, had John, b. 12, bapt. 14 July 1650; Hannah, 21
