THE NEELEYS OF FAIRFIELD COUNTY SC

SEVENTH-DAY BAPTISTS IN EUROPE AND AMERICA, volume 11, pp 672-675:

The third church of this group was Nantmeal, in Chester County, PA. This church has generally been mentioned as French Creek and is supposed to be the same as Canoqocheaque, which name is given in some correspondence with the brethren in Piscataway, NJ.

In 1754 a church of this order of Baptists was begun on Broad River, in the parish of St. Mark, South Carolina, about 180 miles from Charleston. The leading members in it were THOMAS OWEN/S AND VICTOR NELLY, from French Creek Pennsylvania, and JOHN GREGORY and his sons Richard and John from Piscataway, NJ. *** (see notes)

THE SOUTH CAROLINA BAPTISTS, Early Back-Country Churches, pp 172-173, 292-293: A group of Sabbatarians, also coming from Connecocheaque and from French Creek in Pennsylvania, settled near Broad River between 1745 and 1757. The leaders were THOMAS OWEN/S who arrived in South Carolina with his wife in 1752 or 1754, and VICTOR NALEY, who came with his wife in 1756 or 1757, both of whom had land on the east side of Broad River, the first on Conaway Creek and Wilkinson's Creek, the second on Little River and Rocky Creek of the Broad River. Membership was widely scattered between the Broad and Wateree near the rivers on each side, and a goodly number settled of the southwest side of Broad River along the Second and Cannons Creeks, whence John Pearson wrote his letters of exhortation.

"The history of the individual churches shows excessive drinking to have been the great sin of the times, with neglect of the church and its commands a close second. Amusement of every kind, but especially shooting matches and dancing, called forth severe condemnation and ex-communication. Harsh or erratic discipline occurred, and the hearing given to minority groups by associations or neighboring churches soon obviated the evil or isolated the erring church. In the main, the disciplinary measures of the churches were only expression of public indignation against cruelty, injustice, and immorality. In new communities, those little gatherings held in the houses of JOHN JONES or VICTOR NALEY or many others became dynamic nuclei of law and order. Public suspension and excommunication were powerful weapons against the truly religious, and even among the irreligious. The action of the churches established the local norm of conduct." The way in which this society had a beginning in SC was by emigrants from Conneococheague/Conocoheague. PA. *** (see notes)

John Winn, apparently at a later date, read: Whereas the bearer hereof of Mr. Richard Neeley, a Native and inhabitant of this place being disposed to remove to the western county. These are therefore to certify for him, that I have known him from his infancy to the present date, during all which time never had heard of anything alleged disrespectful to his character that he generally considered a good citizen and an honest and industrious well-disposed

person. Given under my hands this 30 Apr. 1807. On 23 Jul. 1810. Richard was a Capt. In the 28th Regiment. In 1812 he was a Capt. of the Militia in Bedford Co. TN.

PA) on 15 Oct. 1750. Description of neighboring lands in Lancaster Co PA seem to indicate that Victor owned land in Robeson Township on 26 Apr. 1751 but no longer show ownership on 29 May, 1751. This Victor is said to have had a brother Richard who married Mary Dunkley, sister of Ann.

ANN DUNLEY is believed to be the daughter of Richard Dunkley and Esther Savage of Amity, PA. Richard died IN 1734 where his estate was administered to his wife Esther of Amity. Their son, Oliver Dunkley, died intestate before Mar. 1748 in Philadelphia. A series of deeds traces ownership of 150 acres of land that link kinship to the names Savage, Dunkley, Neeley, Vanread and Ewule.

Dower Renounced by Elizabeth Neeley, wife of Richard Neeley, Jane Neeley, wife of John Neeley, Sarah Neeley, wife of Victor Neeley.

Martha Neely of Fairfield District, widow of Victor Neely, deceased, for the love and affection which I have and bear towards my four children, Richard, John, Victor and Jerusa Neely.....100 acres originally granted to Victor Neely 3 Nov. 1762 on a branch of Broad River called Little River, also 150 acres granted to Alex. Neely 18 May 1771 on the N. side of Broad River on a branch thereof called McCray's Creek bounded NW by Victor Neely, E. by Jacob Gibson......9 Mar, 1799. S/ Martha Neely. NOTES

(1) THE RANGE: The Neeley and allied families owned and farmed land on the present site of Fort Jackson. Their homes were located near what is now the firing range. I was told when the government came to build the fort, they told the families to get off the property or else they would burn them off. The fort was built in 1917 but most of my Neeley family had left the range by then. It is to my knowledge that people were not monetarily compensated for property in those days. I also have copies of 23 family cemeteries located on Fort Jackson.

(2) RICHARD LAWRENCE NEELEY: It is a mystery as to why my great grandfather William W. Neeley and his brother Farr are living with another family in Gadsden, SC, Lower Richland Co. I believe Richard had a first wife who may have died or else he just left the family. I think there were more children but they were scattered by whatever transpired. The time frame is right for Richard to be William W. and Farr's father. My grandfather's sister said Ruben Trezvant Neeley was a cousin to her father William W. Neeley. Ruben is the son of Victor Neeley and Jane Rebecca Jane Evans. Richard Lawrence Neeley was Victor's brother. Therefore, I am a descendant of Victor and Christina, parents of Victor and Richard Lawrence Neeley. Likewise, a genealogist, now deceased, told me I had to be a descendant of Richard L., Victor, or Charles. I have the names of all of their children and Richard seems to be the one.

(3) ELIZABETH "LIZZIE" (BLIZZARD) NEELEY: The 1920 Richland Co. SC census shows "Lizzie" as a widow and a proprietor of a grocery store [located on the corner of Gervais and Huger Streets in Columbia]. The 1920 Fairfield Co. SC census shows her husband, William W. Neeley, as widowed and living with my grandparents Will and Lizzie Neeley. William was a Seventh - day Adventist.

(4) VICTOR NEELEY WHO MARRIED CHRISTINA: Victor and Christina are buried on Russ Brown Road on private property in Blythewood, SC, Fairfield Co. along with his father John. Victor was born 16 Jan. 1796 – 6 Mar. 1875, age 79. Christina's headstone does not show a birth date but it shows she died 21 Apr. 1851, age 55, so she would have been born about 1796. John's headstone does not show a birth date but shows that he died 7 Jul. 1841 as age 73 so he must have been born about 1768. He married Jane C._____. *The DAR and all researches accept that John Neeley was born in 1758 in VA and married Lucretia Jane Broom/e. Research was done by Oliver Joyner, deceased, of Blythewood, SC. His research is in possession of a woman in Blythewood.

(5) CLARKEY (NEELEY) (DOLAN) (GATES): Her death certificate shows date of birth as 1868. The 1860 Richland Co. SC census shows her as age 3. The 1880 Richland Co. SC census shows her as age 21. It appears that 1857 is closer to the correct date of birth rather than 1868. Clarkey's 1st husband died and left her 40 acres of land. Clarkey died intestate and the land went to her next of kin....her 1st cousins. Victor E. Neeley was a recipient of a parcel of that land. He sold it to Johnnie Caldwell Neeley who donated it to Columbia Collage. I have made no connection to Johnnie Caldwell Neeley accept that he is related to the Neeley family in Denmark, SC. I read the book entitled A FAIRFIELD SKETCHBOOK by Julian Stevenson Bolic in which he names a number of Monticello-Jenkinsville settlers. The Neeley family was not included. As you can see by the articles I quoted on Seventh-Day Baptists and Sabbatarian Baptists, the Neeleys were an integral and unequivocal part of the settlement in the Monticello-Jenkinsville area, and they were definitely instrumental in forming the churches Bolic refers to.

Victor Neeley was one of the leaders of a group of Sabbatarian Baptists in Fairfield Co. They arrived before the Gibson family. Victor, Richard and Alexander Neeley's land was adjacent to Jacob Gibson's vacant lot. Burley's original land plats show a Neckley's Creek. There is a possibility that it is Neeley's Creek because it is located below Victor's land. Likewise two creeks ran through his property. I don't think there were any Neckleys in St. Marks Parish, Craven or Fairfield or any area of SC that I am aware of. REFERENCE FOR NEELEY'S CREEK: See Vol. NN, pages 305-306 on Fairfield Co. There is a connection to the Fairfield and York County Neeleys. Cynthia Ann Neely was born Feb. 1836 in Boon Co. MO. – Aug. 1913 in Camden Co. MO. She was the daughter of Robert Neely and Elizabeth Russell of Rock Hill, SC. Cynthia married Greenberry/Green Berry Scott who was born about 1834 in Indiana. Simon Scott, son of Greenberry/Green Berry, gave a shaving mug to his son George H. Scott. The mug has the name of Victor Neely on it. The Scott family of Linn Creek, Buckner MO said they were not aware that there was a Victor Neely in their family but assumed so since they have his mug.
