#### ANCESTOR'S SERVICE.

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

The Southern Christian Advocate, published in Charleston S. C. under date of Friday May, 8th 1846, contains the following: "Died in Pike Co. Ga., Thomas Nelson, a Revolutionary soldier, on the 27th of Mch, 1846. He was born in Georgetown Co. N. C. on the 25th of Nov, 1745 making him one hundred and 4 years, and 2 days old at the time of his death. When a small child, his father moved to Fairfield district S. C. In 1776 he took the oath of allegiance to the state of North Carolina, and during the service continued faithfully to perform his duty during the war. He married Susan Woodward, and brought up nine children, six of whom are now alive, and about fifty grandchildren. In 1828 the State of S. C. granted him a pension of \$60.00 annually for his services in the war. In 1831 he moved to Pike Co, Georgia where he lived to the day of his death."
