dred and Ten pounds Sterling money of the State aforesaid to  
me in hand paid by Charles Montgomery of aforesaid County  
in the state aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released  
and by these presents do grant Bargain sell and Release unto  
the said Charles Montgomery all those two parcels enclosing  
the premises whereon I now live which make in the whole  
a plantation or tract of land containing one hundred and  
seventy five acres (viz) one hundred and fifty acres granted  
to the said William Nelson by his Excellency Charles Greenville

Montague the second day of February Anno Domini 1773  
situate in Fairfields County on a small branch of Broad  
River near Owens's mill creek bounded at the time of  
Survey Southwest by part of land surveyed for David and Ann  
James on the north by Jacob Ingelmans land the other sides  
vacant and Referenced being has to the original plat and grant  
will more fully appear And Whereas His Excellency  
Charles Pinckney Governor &c did give and grant to James  
Ogilvie on the Fourth day of April 1791 a certain Tract of  
land containing Twenty six acres situate in Fairfields County  
on a branch of Wilkinsons Creek waters of Broad River and  
hath such shape form and marks as are represented in a  
plat to the original grant annexed reference thereto had  
will more fully appear And Whereas the said James  
Ogilvie and Penelope his wife by a deed of conveyance bearing  
date the second day of April in the year 1800 for a sum

Give on the fourth day of April 1791 a certain tract of  
land containing twenty six acres situate in Fairfield County  
on a branch of Wilkinsons Creek waters of Broad River and  
hath such shape form and marks as are represented in a  
plat to the original grant annexed reference hereunto had  
will more fully appear And Whereas the said James  
Ogilvie and Penelope his wife by a deed of conveyance bearing  
date the second day of April Anno Domini 1792 for a  
consideration therein mentioned did convey unto the aforesaid  
William Nelson Twenty five acres of land being part of the  
said tract of twenty six acres Bounded as follows begining at  
a Stake near a Branch a corner of Samuel Proctors land  
formerly Lowells running a southwardly coarse to the afore  
said Branch then down the Branch to a hickory corner on  
Joshua Derhams land thence along the said Derhams line  
due West to a pine corner of the said Nelsons land thence north

Formerly Lovells running a southwardly course to the aforesaid Branch then down the Branch to a hickory corner on Jacobs Durhams land thence along the said Durhams line due West to a pine corner of the said Jacobs land thence north eastwardly back to a pine corner whence Northwardly to a stake by a post bounding on Curries land thence East along the said Curries line to the beginning corner which two tracts parcels of land containing in the whole one hundred and seventy five acres as described and respectively mentioned being contiguous and adjoining each other together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurts to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or pertaining I do have and to hold all and singular the premises above written unto me before mentioned unto the said Charles Montgomery his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators

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to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said Premises  
unto the said Charles Montgomery his heirs and assigns against  
myself and my heirs and against every person whomsoever  
lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof  
Witness my hand and seal this sixth day of January  
Anno Domini 1790 and in the nineteenth year of American  
Independency.
