THE NOLAND FAMILY

The Nolands came into Virginia from Maryland. When we find the family of Susan and Stephen Noland, they were in Frederick County, Virginia. Shadrach was born in 1752 and Stephen in 1753.

The Nolands moved into Fairfield, Camden District, South Carolina later and William was born 10 March 1759. Then we find George and Isaac and I believe a daughter was born.

Shadrach, William, Stephen and George served in the Revolution. Shadrach served from Georgia and South Carolina; William and George from South Carolina; and Stephen from Fairfield County.

Shadrach married Ann ?. William married Mary Ann Cockrell, daughter of Moses Cockrell, a neighbor, about 1784. Stephen married Mary Smith; George married Jennie Rogers; James married ?; David married ?; and Mordicai m. ?

William and George are mentioned in a land sale made by father Stephen, Sr in 1819 when he conveyed land in Fairfield County to James G. Brice. In 1805 and 1816, William Noland and wife, Mary Ann (state of Virginia, Russell

County) conveyed land in Fairfield to Will Pickett and James Gladney.

In 1817, Will Noland and family moved from Russell County, Virginia to Floyd County, KY. One son, George, married about 1803, Nancy Hardin, daughter of Will Hardin of Frederick County, Maryland. She was born in Frederick County, Maryland and her father was a Revolutionary soldier.

In Carter County, Kentucky in 1854 we find the Nolands. Will died 11 May 1857 and is buried at a farm in Big Sinking. Wife died ???

Will Noland is mentioned in First Census 1790 in Fairfield County, South Carolina. Son George moved to Louisville, Kentucky about 1820. He served in the War of 1812. Enlisted 7 September 1844 (?). His daughter, Mary Ann, was born in Stevensburg, Virginia on 22 January 1812. George was wounded in the Battle of Lundy's Lane and died 2 January 1828. Nancy, his wife, died 3 February 1834. Both are buried in Louisville, Kentucky. Mary Ann married Will C. Dodge in Louisville, KY on 14 October 1830. They had nine children. She died in Bowling Green in 1881 and W. C. Dodge died there in 1886. She was 68, he was 78. The date of his death was 5 May 1886 and hers 12 June 1881. Only two daughters of their

family of children lived to rear families.

James Noland was born in 1750 in Frederick County Virginia and died between 1840 and 1850 in Forsyth County, Georgia. He married ?? He made application for pension record.

Shadrack Noland, born 1752 in Frederick County Virginia, died between 1840 and 1850 in Hardin County, Tennessee, aged 89. Married Ann??. He received a pension in Tennessee.

Stephen Noland II, born in 1753 in Frederick County Virginia, died 26 October 1846 in Chambers County, Alabama. Married in 1775, Mary Smith. Served in the Revolutionary War.

William Noland, born 10 March 1759 and died 11 May 1857 in Carter Co Kentucky at Big Sinking. Married in 1780 to Mary Ann Cockrell, daughter of Moses Cockrell. William born in Fairfield County, South Carolina.

George Noland, born between 1745 and 1765; died between 1810 and 1820, probably in Fairfield County, South Carolina; married between 1770 and 1790 to Jennie Rogers.

David Noland, b. ?; d.? m. ?; in 1785-1790 witnessed a deed of Shadrach (Deed Vol G, page 55)

Mordicai Noland, b. ?, d. ?, m. ? (Family tradition says one son named Mordicai.)

(Note: These were listed as brothers and sons of Stephen and Susan Noland.)

William Noland had three boys and one girl, born previous to 1790. (Heads of Families, Fairfield County, South Carolina census, Camden District). His father, Stephen, in same census had one son under 16 and four daughters or wife and

three daughters. In 1805 we find a sale of land from Will Noland, Russell County, Virginia and wife, Mary Ann, to William Pickett (Book P, page 116). In 1816 in Russell County, Virginia, they conveyed land in Fairfield County, Carolina to James Gladney (Book X, page 221). Both pieces of property were in Fairfield County, South Carolina. William Noland and famiy moved to Russell County, Virginia in 1795, according to pension testimony. In 1816 the family moved to Floyd County, Kentucky. (Note: In 1822, part of Floyd County, Kentucky was taken to form Lawrence County, and in 1838, part of Lawrence County was taken to form Carter County Kentucky)

Mary Ann Cockrell, wife of William Noland and daughter of Moses Cockrell was a neighbor to the Nolands in Fairfield County, South Carolina. Moses Cockrell made a will in 1788 and it was probated in 1798. He had children: Jeremiah, Nathaniel, Mary Noland, Sarah Martin, Leah Neel. His wife was Jane Cockrell. In his will, Moses Cockrell writes: Mary Noland to have all that parcel or tract of land joining John Richmond and Samuel Armstrong, which at the time of Gunnung was vacant land. Also share of movable property. Part of the original Cockrell is still used and was remodeled at White Oak, South Carolina (Note: not sure when this paper was written). William Noland mentions the Cockrells in his pension testimony.

George Noland, son of William Noland, married Nancy Hardin of Frederick County, Virginia in 1806. Her father had 13 slaves (First Census 1790). He lived until 1810 in Frederick, Maryland, but did not die there. Had

one son and two daughters (1790 census).
George Noland enlisted 7 September 1814 in Captain Henry Coryell's Company of Alert Riflemen, First Regiment, Southerland, Pennsylvania Volunteers. Discharged 3 January 1815. No pension record. This Regiment organized near Philadelphia. Children of George and Nancy (Hardin) Noland:

1. Henry Noland, b. 1804, McConnellstown, Pennsylvania
2. Mary Ann Nolan, b. 22 January 1812, Stevensburg, Virginia; died 1881, Bowling Green, Kentucky
3. Isaac Noland, b. 1807, McConnellstown, Pennsylvania
4. William Augustus Noland, b. 25 December 1813, McConnellstown, Pennsylvania; died 189?, Paducah, Kentucky
5. George Noland, went west

William Augustus Nolen, born 25 December 1813 at McConnellstown, Pennsylvania, married in 1836 to Huldah Becker. She was born 13 September 1818. In 1886, they celebrated their Golden Wedding. She was the daughter of Catherine Hagie Becker and her grandfather. Hagie came to the United States with LaFayette. He was one of LaFayette's personal guards. Huldah Becker was from Huntsville, Alabama. She died 2 November 1901. William Augustus Noland had nine children: (1) Joseph, (2) Isaac, (3) Catherine, (4) Mary J., (5) Will P., (6) Robert I., (7) Lillie, (8) Anna A., (9) Nancy.

Jillson's Land Grants of Kentucky - William Noland was given 50 acres on Four Mile Creek in Floyd County (P 1563, Book 33, page 33) 8 January 1849. In 1853 this land was sold. Mrs. Noland was

buried there. In 1853, the family moved to Carter County, Kentucky, but William's name is not listed as paying taxes for land. His death record reads: William Noland died at his home on Big Sinking Farm and was buried there. Date: 11 May 1857.

Jillson's Land Grants of Kentucky: Nancy H. Noland obtained 156 acres of land on 19 January 1860 in Carter County, Kentucky (Book BK 61, page 204). Also in 1855 in Carter County, she was taxed for 183 acres of land on Big Sinking Creek. She had two children under 16, also some livestock.

Floyd County, Kentucky marriages:

Isaac Noland married Polly Music on 14 June 1818

Stephen Noland married Nancy Reynolds on 22 July 1820

Nancy Noland married James McCoy on 8 March 1827.

William Nolen, an old settler of the Purchase, was born in McConnellstown, Pennsylvania on 25 December 1815. He was the fourth child and the only one now living of four boys and one girl, born to George and Nancy Harden Nolen, natives of Virginia and Maryland, respectively. The grandparents of our subject were William Nolen, of Irish descent, a Revolutionary soldier and William Harden of English decent. The father of our subject was a soldier in the War of 1812, and was wounded in the Battle of Lundy's Lane. He was a potter by trade. In January 1834, he went to New Orleans, where he worked at his trade

two years; thence to Paducah, Kentucky, where he opened a shop of his own, and carried on the business until 1868. In 1857, he opened a hardware store. After 1868 he worked in Cairo, Illinois; thence he came to Fulton, Kentucky, in the year 1873 where he worked for W. L. Ellison & Company. Later he and a son formed a partnership when he moved his family to Fulton. In the year 1880, he opened a shop of his own in Fulton where he still carries on the business. Mr. Nolen has honorably filled the position of chairman of the Board of Trustees of Paducah and frequently has been chosen councilman. He was appointed surveyor of the port of Paducah by President Pierce. He is a member in good standing of the I.O.O.F. He was married to Huldah A. Becker of Paducah, on 15 August 1836. She is a native of Huntsville, Alabama and a daughter of Joseph and Catherine (Hagie) Becker, of German descent. Her grandfather Hagie came to the United States with General LaFayette. During the Revolution he was one of LaFayette's body guards. After the war Mr. Hagie remained in the United States and on General LaFayette's visit to the States in 1824, he visited his old Commander at Nashville, Tennessee. To Mr. and Mrs. Nolen were born 9 children: (1) Catherine (now Glass); (2) Isaac, deceased; (3) Mary J. (now Phillips); (4) W. P.; (5) Joseph, deceased; (6) Nannie, deceased; (7) Robert I.; (8) Lillie (now Adams); (9) Anna A. (now Hughes). Mrs. Nolen is a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church.

Female Noland, b. 4 Sep 18??, Madison Co KY (Vital Statistics); d/o Joshua Noland and Rosanna (McCoy) Noland

Male Noland, b. 17 Sep 18??; s/o James Noland

A. F. Nolan married M. F. Gordon; had a daughter born 22 Dec 1859 (Vital Statistics) in Buena Vista, Logan Co KY

Albert Noland married Alla Winhorst; had a daughter born 1904, Louisville, Jefferson Co KY

Colleen Nolan-Wilson was born 14 Oct 1946, Harlan Co KY. Siblings included: (1) Roy Gene Nolan, b. 22 Sep 1944; (2) Merita Nolan, b. 10 Apr 1949; and Bobby L. Nolan, b. 25 Mar 1959

Albert Nolan was born 6 Apr 1910. He and Sabery Burkhart were married in 1933, Harlan Co KY (101-91). Sabery Burkhart-Nolan was born 18 Jul 1916, Leslie Co KY.

Her grandparents were Adron Nolan H. and Susannah (Harris) Nolan as well as ?/Martha (Whitehead) Burkhart. Adron H. Nolan was born 5 Oct 1878 and died 17 Aug 1959. He and Susannah Harris were married 23 Mar 1894, Harlan Co KY (A-130). Susannah Harris-Nolan was born Mar 1876.

Great-grandparents were Leonard Nolan and Vicy (McIntosh) Nolan. Leonard Nolan was born 11 Jan 1854. Vicy (McIntosh) Nolan was born Mar 1856 and died 2 May 1937, Harlan Co KY.

Great-great-grandparents include: Joseph Nolan and Louisa (Farmer) Nolan as well as Peter and Jane (Gross) McIntosh. Joseph Nolan was born in 1831 and died 20 Apr 1888. He and Louisa "Eliza" Farmer were married 22 Mar 1853, Harlan Co KY (1-322). She was born 9 Dec 1834 and died in 1913. (Note: several compilations have noted that Joseph's wife was Elizabeth Farmer, probably because in some census records the name was spelled "Eliza" and they ASSUMED that the name was Elizabeth - it has never been seen as Elizabeth, but rather as "Eliza" or "Louisa". In those days sometimes the pronunciation was "Lou-l-za".)

Great-g-g-grandparents were: Joseph Nolan and Mary (Marsee) Nolan
