My husband (whose family on mothers and fathers sides are from Fairfield County) and I have visited the following cemeteries where relatives are buried in Fairfield County - Owens, Rock Hill AME, Mt. Moriah, Lebanon Presbyterian, White Hall, Cedar Creek Baptist and White Oak Baptist Cemeteries and an unknown cemetery in Alston, SC (those are the ones we know of). On another note, we are fascinated by Camp Welfare, and were wondering if there is information about the original owners of the small houses in the camp. My understanding is that they were passed down through families. That is the only brush camp we know of in Fairfield County. Thanks.

The Pearson and Mayo Family Cemeteries (both attached) are the only two that we are aware of that you still have to obtain permission to visit.

Generally, someone with the Nuclear Power Plant will guide you there and back.

All of the other graves/tombstones that would have been under the lake have been moved to one of the following cemeteries:

Shiloh Methodist; Monticello Methodist; Little River Baptist; and Salem Presbyterian.

These church cemeteries have been photographed by our FCGS Cemetery Committee and put on FindAGrave.com.
