Mrs. Pearl Irene Peay was born in Fairfield County, December 3, 1890. She was the youngest of several children born to Louis and Adeline Johnson.

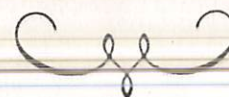
Upon early conversion, she became a member of Wayman A.M.E. Church, Winnsboro, S. C. and remained active until failing health.
