ISAAC PERRY

In the name of God, Amen

I Isaac Perry, of the District and State aforesaid, being of sound, disposing mind and memory, do make ordain and constitute this, as and for my last will and testament, in manner and form following, that is to say

1 I give and devise to my Son Jacob Perry, eighty acres of wood-land, lying around Harmony Church, and bounded on the South, by lands of Dudley, Stewart and Anthony Elkin, on the East by Killing's land, on the North by lands of Allen Perry and David Montgomery, and on the West by other lands of mine; to him the said Jacob Perry, his heirs and assigns forever.

2 I give and devise to my son William Perry, the one-half of the residue of my lands; a negre slave named Cynthia; one bed and furniture and the one half of my kitchen furniture; to him the said William Perry his heirs and assigns. Provided, that if the said William Perry shall die without issue living at the time at his death, I give devise and bequeath the said land, slave and her increase, to Lewis Perry in trust for my Son Daniel Perry as in the next clause is provided.

3 I give devise and bequeath to Lewis Perry, his heirs executors and administrators the other half of the residue of my slaves- lands, and the following slaves, Lizzy Major and Luke and their ^{future} increase. In trust nevertheless that he shall hold the said land, slaves and their increase, to and for the sole use benefit and behoof of my son Daniel Perry for and during the term of his natural life, and at his death to such issue of the said Daniel as he shall leave living at the time of his death. But if my said son Daniel shall die without leaving issue living at the time of his death, then upon trust that he shall convey and deliver the

same to my son William Perry, to be held by him as in the next preceding clause provided.

4. If my Sons William and Daniel shall both die, without leaving issue living at the time of their respective deaths, then I give devise and bequeath, all my lands (except the eighty acres devise to Jacob, as above) and all the said slaves and their increase to my daughter Mary Abbot and my sons Lewis, Jefse, John, James, Allen and Jacob Perry, share and share alike.

5. I give and bequeath to my son Daniel Perry, one bed and furniture, one horse saddle and bridle, two cows and calves and ten head of hogs, and the other half of my kitchen furniture

6 I give and bequeath to my daughters Elizabeth and Rachel, each the sum of five dollars(\$5.)

7 I will and direct that all the rest and residue of my estate, be sold by my Executors at such time and upon such terms as to them may seem expedient, and that the proceeds thereof, (after all my just debts shall have been paid therefrom), be equally divided among and between my daughter Mary Abbot, and my Sons, Lewis, Jefse, John, James, Allen, and Jacob Perry

8 I especially request and enjoin it upon all my children, that in Consideration of her past faithful services, my negro woman Tyra shall in no event be sold or disposed of, out of the family, but that they shall one and all, and especially my Executors, see to it, that she is always well taken care of and provided for.


Lastly, I nominate, Constitute and appoint my Sons Lewis Perry, and William Perry to be Executors of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills, by me heretofore made.

In witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand and seal this Seventh day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand, eight hundred and fifty four, and in the Seventy ninth year of American Independence.
