Madison Stark Perry was Governor of Florida before the Confederate War and later became a Brigadier General during the War, he was a cousin of John Sykes Perry; therefore my conclusion is that Richard Perry who came from England and Benjamin Perry were brothers.

a At this time I will make a conclusion and try to prove myself right or wrong as the case may be. Note in 53 that Benjamin Perry had 4 sons and 3 daughters - then look in 25 a, it has a Benjamin Perry with 3 sons and 4 daughters. Could the family tradition be wrong and actually it was 3 sons and 4 daughters? I do not like to pay too much attention to family tradition. It does give clues as to where to look but the facts are incorrect very much of the time. Benjamin Perry who died before March 1815 could be a brother to your Zadock Perry who died Jan. 1815.  Note that he is a son of Benjamin Ferry who was an Earl and came to S. C. by way of Virginia and he married Gov. Wilmot's daughter. This Earl left England and a portion that was very high in the English standards to come to the Colonies to work the soil, does this seem possible to leave large amounts of land and one or more Castles and a position that was close to the King, and come to the Colonies? Or did he abdicate his position? I am not being critical, I am just asking to find out if it is true, then when facts are known they can be stated without question and the people can be proud of, whether they were Kings, Lords or whether they were tillers of the soil. My question here is did this Ezekiel have a son that fought in the Mexican war and if so what Mexican war? Was Ezekiel the youngest son in his family and if so was 'Fat Ferry' 50 or more to fight in the 1846-1847 war with Mexico, or was it a war before 1846-1847? Facts in this case would be of benefit to the descendants and not to others, therefore I imagine not too much attention should be paid to this paragraph. However, I have something else on an Ezekiel Ferry which is food for thought.
