  Mr. Perry is descended from Ladock Perry who was born 10 November 1754 and died
  18 Jan. 1815 in Lancaster Co. S. C. and is buried at Rich Hill on the north
  side of Hess Branch of the Wateree River. This Ladock Perry had a son named
  Ladock Perry who went to Yalobusha Co., Miss. and died there in 1850. He md
  Dorcas Clance Duren, daughter of Thomas Duren of Lancaster Co. S. C.
- a Mr. Perry would like to have the Perry line traced back as far as it is possible and to know the names of Zadock Perry, Jr.'s brothers who went to Texas and to Florida. Also, but not necessary, to see how the other Perry lines are related to Zadock Perry I.
- Plats of land before the Revolution in Craven County, S. C. Land was applied for, in Charleston, and a plat was issued, Many times plats were issued but the grant was never taken.

The King of England granted in some years 50 acres of land and in some years 100 acres of land to the head of the household and 50 acres to each person in the family, this includes the wife, children, slaves and others, like nephews and nieces.

- Memorial Tax Returns were made on land which were original grants. The Crown required a tax to be paid from 2 to 10 years, and in some 2 years, others 4 years and as long as 10 years. Often the original owner did not go to Charleston to make this return but sent the return by a neighbor.... The following abstracts may give valuable data.
- Jacob Perry, 150 acres in Craven Co. on 25 Mile Creek near Isaac Ross's Saw Mill. All of the other sides were vacant land. This Creek is in Kershaw Co. and it goes into the Wateree River on the western side. The saw mill is actually 13 miles away, Survey certified on 17 March 1767, granted on 2h Nov. 1767 and the memorial was sg on 16 Feb. 1768 by Joshua Wombwell. J. Francis Butlett D. S. Vol 9 p 437
- John Perry, 150 acres in Craven Co. on N E side of Wateree River. This land is Bounded by McDaniel and now belongs to John Bates, and vacant land, this is to the NE. On the SW this land is bounded by Joseph Payne, and George McConnell, NW on the river. Survey certified 2 April 1765, granted 23 Oct. 1765, and sg on 25 Nov. 1765 by John x Perry. John Belton D. S. Vol 9 p 20.
- o John Perry, 150 acres in Craven Co. on the East side of the Tateree River and bounded NW on John Beats land, SE by William Nettles and John Perry and vacant land. Survey certified 3 November. 1767, granted 1 Feb. 1768, and sg on 15 March 1768 by Joshua Wombwell who was the D. S. Vol. 9 p 459.
- John Ferry, Jr. 100 acres in Craven Co. on the N side of the S fork of Black River bounded SE by Thomas Scurry, NW on John Perry, and vacant land. Survey certified 13 Feb. 1771, granted 10 April 1771 and sg on 23 May 1771 by John Perry, Jr. Isham Moore was the Deputy Surveyor. Vol 10 p 1166.
- e John Perry, 100 acres in Craven Co. for Silas Perry. Land on the S prong of Black River bounding SE on Nathaniel Pace and vacant land. Survey certified 15 Feb. 1771. Silas Perry was probably a minor. Also, John Perry 200 acres on E side of S fork of Black River, bounded NV by Nathaniel Pace and vacant land. Survey certified 14 Feb. 1771, both granted 10 April 1771.... see 4 under John, there was no Silas Perry. Sg on the 23 May by John Perry. Isham Moore D. S. Vol 10 p 446
- f John Perry, 200 acres in Craven Co. on Beaverdam Branch of Broad River bounded S. W. by Reyderees Clark and vacant land and on all other sides by vacant land. Survey certified 4 Oct. 1763, granted 17 April 1764 and sg on 23 May 1764 by James willer, del to him on the 29 Sept. 1772. John Wade D.S. Vol 6 p 278.
- g Josiah Perry, 1000 acres in Craven Co. on Rocky Creek and waters of lateree River, bounded NE by Rosey and Alexander Miller, SE and SW on James Stuart, Hugh McDonald and Robert Harper. Survey certified 22 Dec. 1772, granted 21 April 1774 and sg on 2 Aug. 1774, by Josiah Perry, Alexander Kennedy was the D.S. Vol 12 p 530.
- black River bounding SE on Benjamin Scurry and vacant land. Survey certified June 1772 and granted on 14 Aug. 1772 and sg on 17 Oct. 1772 and del to John James Gibson on 19 October 1775. James Rembert D. S. Vol 11 p 471.
