from them a Black mare, which
said Mare was as your Petitioners
are informed taken by order of
the ~~Constitutional~~ Authorities, and
for the Service of the State Troops.
and that the said Mare was in
consequence thereof converted to
the use of the Government. That

The person who took the said Mare
from your Petitioners offered to give
a Receipt for the same; but owing
to the Ignorance of your Petitioner's
Mother, or to some other Cause no
receipt was taken for her

That your Petitioners are losers
on account thereof and that they have
never received any thing as compen-
sation for the same. They therefore
pray your Honourable Body to take
your Petitioners Case into consideration
and grant them such relief as
to your Honors shall seem meet
& they will as in duty bound pray.

the year of our Lord 1781 — during the late
revolutionary War, a Man of the Value
of Eighty Dollars was seized, taken from
the Estate of
Emmanuel Powell, the Father of your Petitioner
by the Order of Capt. John McCord, and
kept & applied for the use of the State
Troops of the South Carolina. And that
the said Man was never returned to the said
Emmanuel Powell, or to his Estate, or to your
Petitioner, nor Satisfaction or Payment
in any manner ever made for her.

Your Petitioner therefore
prays, your Honorable Body, that his
Loss may be taken in Consideration, and
on the proof & substantiation of the
same; He may receive such Payment
& compensation, as the Justice of his
Case may require, and as your Honorable
Body may see fit & proper to order &
direct; & your Petitioner as in duty bound
will ever pray & offer to — David Powell

South Carolina personally appeared before

pressed into the American Service;
during the revolutionary War; by
the said regiment of State Troops
commanded by Col. Middleton, in
the year either of 1781. or 1782. &
that he this Deponent four times
afterward, saw, the said Man, in
the American Service; and this
Deponent further swears, that
he believes, that no pay or remun-
eration whatever, has ever been
afforded to the said David Powell, or his
said Father - and that the said Man, was
worth about seventy Dollars.
