SOUTH-CAROLINA.

PURSUANT to an ACT of the GENERAL ASSEMBLY passed the 16th of March, 1783, We, the COMMISSIONERS of the TREASURY, have this day delivered to

Messrs. Josiah Sorrell & Henry Wood. this our INDENTED CERTIFICATE for the Sum of Seventy three pounds nineteen Shillings and four pence Sterling for two hundred bushels of corn for the year 1785. And for forty one gallons and three Quarters Irish Brandy for Militia use in One thousand seven hundred eighty one & paid for two accounts audited &c.

The said Sorrell and Wood his Executors, Administrators, or Assigns will be entitled to receive from this Office the Sum of five pounds seven Shillings and six pence at the first of April last for one Year's Interest on the Principal Sum of Seventy three pounds nineteen Shillings and four pence and the like Interest Annually & the resolution of General Assembly 1783.

The said Sorrell and Wood his Executors, Administrators or Assigns will be entitled also to receive, and shall be paid, if demanded, the principal Sum of Seventy three pounds nineteen Shillings and four pence on the first of April next & the resolution of General Assembly 1786.

And the said Sorrell and Wood his Executors, Administrators, or Assigns, may make any Purchases at any Public Sales of Confiscated Property, (except such as shall be ordered by the Legislature for special Purposes;) and this INDENT shall be received in Payment.

For the true performance of the several payments in manner abovementioned, the PUBLIC TREASURY is made liable, and the FAITH of the STATE pledged by the afore said ACT.

GIVEN under our Hands at the TREASURY-OFFICE, in CHARLESTON, the 16th Day of September one thousand seven hundred and eighty three.
