Elizabeth Edwards "Betsy" Rabb, wife of THOMAS ALEXANDER⁶ CRUMPTON, was a daughter of John Rabb - b. 5-6-1781; d. 10-1-1844 buried in Rabb Family Cemetery - west side of Little River in South Carolina. On August 9, 1978 (after searching 3 days in the woods) we found this "Rabb Cemetery" west side of Little River, SC; about 1/2 mile from the river. It was on Doty's land at least 1/4 mile down the slope from the old road (through Rabb and Crumpton land); and was about 1/2 way between "Old Brick Church" on highway 213 and highway 205 (3 1/2 or 4 miles north and parallel to 213). Tombstone with dates identical to genealogy notes. In 1808, married Renthea Glazier - b. 7-27-1793; d. 2-22-1858; daughter of Captain John Glazier (veteran of Revolutionary War of 1776) and Elizabeth Edwards. Issue of John Rabb and Renthea (Glazier) Rabb:

1st - Elizabeth Edwards "Betsy" Rabb - b. 5-6-1809 in Fairfield District, SC; d. 6-3-1886 in Winston County, MS; buried in Betheden Cemetery; m. THOMAS ALEXANDER⁵ CRUMPTON - b. 1803; d. 11-1863. She moved to Louisville, MS before 1870 U.S. Census, after death of her husband and six (6) sons in Civil War.

2nd - James P. Rabb - b. 6-17-1810; d. 8-29-1841.

3rd - Patience Rabb - b. 12-30-1811; m. Daniel Danby.

4th - John Glazier Rabb - b. 10-1-1813; d. 2-26-1872; on 3-12-1840 m. Nancy Kincaid Watts.

5th - Harriett Rabb - b. 4-26-1815; m. James David Montgomery - b. 8-13-1809; moved to Starkville, MS; descendants are still there.

6th - William B. Rabb - b. 2-4-1817; d. 9-25-1839.

7th - Martha C. Rabb - b. 5-26-1817; m. John Holly.

8th - Sarah A. Rabb - b. 2-2-1820; m. Henry English.

9th - Robert A. Rabb - b. 4-26-1822; m. Susan Proctor - 1848.

- 10th - Louise Rabb - b. 7-26-1825; m. Harrison Kinard - 1849. Moved to Louisville, MS on 12-11-1852.
- 11th - Mary E. Rabb - b. 7-5-1827; m. Elisha Ragsdale.
- 12th - Calvin W. Rabb - b. 10-15-1829; d. 8-8-1864; m. Malisia King.
- 13th - Thomas W. Rabb - b. 7-6-1833; m. Keziah Robinson.
- 14th - Joel F. Rabb - b. 6-17-1836; m. Charity Crosby - b. 1-14-1848.

John Rabb was the son of James Rabb, a veteran of the Revolutionary War of 1776 (will dated 6-18-1806, recorded 1814) a son of Lt. William Rabb, Sr. also a veteran of the Revolutionary War. James Rabb married Hannah Barnett, a daughter of William Barnett. Issue of James Rabb:

I went to South Carolina in July, 1974. I worked in Fairfield County except for the time I spent in Columbia, South Carolina in the History and Archives Building, Secretary of State Building, State Library, University Library and Confederate Museum. For I knew that five generations of my ancestors were born or had lived in old Fairfield District, South Carolina (from 1730 - before the Revolutionary War - until 1870 - after the Confederate War). But I never found a trace of them (my line) after the U.S. Census of 1860 in Fairfield.
