Dear Pelham,

At the urging of my dearest cousins I am trying to do some background search on a young man, John Watt Rabb, killed at Gaines Mill, Va on or about June 30, 1862. My cousin father was a Rabb from Fairfield which sparked my cousin's interest. My cousin's inquiry was sparked by an article she read in the Post & Courier. This same young man, according to this article, was a cadet at the Citadel prior to his enlistment in the Confederate Army.

I have yet been unable to locate this article nor confirm he was a cadet by the Citadel own web site. In any case I am looking to you for guidance and suggestions on what you might be able to suggest in furthering my search regarding John Watt Rabb.

I also noticed on an old map of Fairfield County there was once a store called Rabb's Store, as well as a home site named Rabb. Can you tell me where this store might be located or if there is any road sign depicting the name Rabb?

I have enclosed what little I have been able to locate; hopefully for your trained eye you might be able to guide me. My cousin provided four names all total, but for some reason this young man's story also greatly interests me.

AS you can see from the enclosed my printer is not the best nor is the software for my desktop computer. As of yet I have not been able to copy and print the account of a former slave on the Rabb plantation, a one Anne Bell.
