



**RABB CEMETERY** - At the Triangle below Winnsboro, S. C. where highways 321 and 213 meet, take 213 towards Jenkinsville and drive 7.4 miles. On the left a short distance in the woods is the cemetery. It is surrounded by a metal fence. If you come to a white house on the left with Sanders on the mailbox, you have gone too far. You have to cross a small ditch and crawl up an embankment. I have visited this place 3 times - first in 1975, 1978 and 1983.

✓ The little flat stones 6, 7, & 8 had no inscriptions on them. They are thought to be infant children of Eber (#3) and Martha C. Rabb (#4)

✓ The wife of Eber A. Rabb (#5) and also his brother are buried in the Episcopal Cemetery in Winnsboro, S. C. along with succeeding generations.
