

was proven Edward Mobley, Sr. died in 1765, ten years before the Revolutionary War. I found in Roster of South Carolina Patriots by Bobby Gilmer Moss where Edward Mobley, Sr. served in 1781-1782, and Edward Mobley, Jr. served in 1781. I feel that after the death of Edward, Sr. in 1765, Edward, Jr. became Sr. and Edward III became Jr. The same book names William Buford as a patriot in the American Revolution. My family spells the name Burford. I have a copy of his will.
