I think a reasonable preface is needed to set the stage for an account that often is a bit dull—Rion uses the same sort of sentence over and over—unless one just happens to be from Winnsboro and knows the people involved. This suggested preface needs more to be complete; this would include a discussion of the various types of businesses (about 88 counted, I recollect) and certain other types of information that would provide a town context. It might even pay to look in the 1860 census to determine how the people he names compare to the persons listed. I plan to make a list for you.

Drop a short note (no hurry) with your general thoughts about how you feel a preface should read.

More to come as I get things proofed, formatted, thought about, etc.

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Rimio Memoir

When I can first recollect Winnsboro, the corporate limits of the town extended from where Mr. George W. Crawford lives—to the corner above where George B. McMaster now lives. (This place was then occupied by Gen. John Buchanan)

That [southern] part of the town from McCants' Corner [at Congress and Moultrie streets] to Douglass' [at Congress and Buchanan streets] was called Clarkeville. Capt. James N. Shedd built the house now occupied by Mr. A. S. Douglass; [#1] the Prices lived in the house where the Obears live; [#2] and on the Walker lot was the saw mill, grist and flour mill of Osmund M. Woodward. [#3] The Rion house was built by James Phillips, the brother of R. W. Phillips, and was occupied by Mansel Hall.[#4] Where the Boylston house [now] is was an old field,[#5] and the Cureton house was Dr. Caleb Clarke's home. [#6] Mrs. Dwight's house was a store which came out to the edge of the pavement, [#7] and Robert Clarke of Maryland was the proprietor. The Connor house was occupied by Thomas Ligon,[#8] and his carpenter shop was at the rear end of the lot. [#9] The Frank Clarke house was occupied by Robert S. Ketchin, [#10] the father of T. H. Ketchin; and James B. McCants lived where J. G. McCants now lives.[#11] Campbell's flour mill [#12] was just north of where Creight's warehouse now is, and Levi Huntington dressed granite where the big oak stands by the Passenger Depot.[#13] Matthias Clark lived where the Hanahans now live across the Railroad. [#14] The Ketchin house was Mrs. C. Ladd's female school, [#15] and there was no house where G. W. Crawford's house now stands. The Mitchell's from Charleston lived where W. A. Beaty lives. [#16] Dr. R. A. Buchanan [was found] next,[#17] and G. A. White's house[#18] [once] was the home of Winnsboro [Masonic] Lodge No. 11. 1 John Phillips lived where Tom

Phillips now is.^[#19] J. O. Boag's [home] was the office of the *News and Herald*,^[#20] which [then] was published by Francis Britton and edited by Franklin Gaillard.

Osborne Jones had a store on the Corner, now occupied by S. C. Dunn.^[#21]

Osmund Woodward lived where Judge Osmund Woodward Buchanan now lives.^[#22]

L. W. Duval lived in the Macfie house.^[#23] Mrs. Sarah F. DuBose lived in Dr. J. C.

Buchanan's house,^[#24] and Dr. T. T. Robertson lived where the Tennants

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live.[#25]

The granite building that belongs to Lauderdale and Bryson how has a brick face, and the first story was occupied by [R. S.] Ketchin and [G. (?). S.] McMaster as a Drug Store and Dry Goods store. [#26] R. S. DesPortes and Middleton Armstrong were clerks, and the second story was the home of DeKalb Lodge I. O. O. F. [Independent Order of Odd Fellows]. Old man Frank Elder's furniture store and repair shop [#27] was about where the News and Herald office now is [located]. Next was Samuel Jackson's Tailor shop [#28] and Kremer's Shoe shop, [#29] then Aunt Matilda Rosborough had a small wooden building, where John Russell now lives, [#30] and [she] dispensed persimmon beer and gingers to such men as lawyers Dave McDowell, John B. McCall, R. B. Boylston and Judge James M. Rutland. D. R. Elkin occupied the Store of A. B. [?] Cathcart, [#31] and George W. Woodward lived in a brick house where Williford's Stable now stands.[#32] The Bank building [#33] was build by David Aiken, the grandfather of Dr. David Aiken, and the second story was occupied by Joseph D. Aiken.² A. D. Hilliard kept a grocery store where R. W. Phillips now has a store,[#34] and Agnew and McCully had a hardware store [#35] between Phillips' and the [David] Lauderdale's [home] where [his son] George now

James Phinney, the father of Miss Nannie Phinney, kept store about where R. A. Buchanan's store [now] is, [#39] and Madison Stuber was next door. [#40] Geo. W. Parker had a tailor shop where Turner's store is, [#41] and John H. Propst had a Dry Goods store where L. Landecker's is. [#42] Saling Wolfe lived where C. M. Chandler's Store is and had a store in [the] first story. [#43] Leaventritt and Oxner kept [their store] where Seigler [now] holds forth, [#44] and Clarke's store was the law office of R. B. Boylston; [#45] Toliver Oxner lived upstairs. Mark Doty's store [#46] was built by David Aiken and was the store of the town in that day. Lucy, a free negro, lived in a frame house where K. R. Hugh Miller [#50] lived next to [the] Fairfield Hotel, and David Campbell, [#51] the grandfather of W. S. Weir, lived on [what is now a] vacant lot next to W. H.

Willingham's, and had a [cotton] gin shop under the white Oak tree, opposite to the James R. Aiken lot now owned by W. H. Flenniken.

The Winnsboro Hotel was run by James Gamble and had a long Piazza the whole length of the front.[#52] The office of the Hotel was in the Northern part of [what became] Caldwell's store, [#53] and the Dining room was in the rear of McMaster's Drug Store. [#54] [W. B.] Creight and Simonton had a hardware store where Caldwell now has [a] Dry Goods Store. [#55] Mason Chandler lived where M. W. Doty's store now is.[#56] [Francis] Gerig and Chandler's harness shop was where Owens Live Stock Co. now is. [#57] George Schorb occupied the house Mrs. J. R. McMaster lived in, [#58] and [he] had a marble yard in the rear. Dr. J. R. McMaster, Sr., also had [a] Drug store, where J. H. McMaster now is. David Aiken's barn and [cotton] gin house were [near the] Corner, where [the Winnsboro Town] Power house now is.^[#84] Baker McCreight's school house was where Mrs. Polly Williford lives.^[#85] Dr. W. E. Aiken lived where John Harden [now] does.^[#86] John H. Propst lived where the Presbyterian Parsonage now is.^[#87] Samuel Johnston lived in the present Seceder [A. R. P.] Parsonage,^[#88] and John B.

McCall, who married Gen. John Bratton's sister, lived where J. L. Richmond now lives, [#89] and Miss Libby Smith lived where the Dickey's live. [#90] Where the Episcopal Church now stands was the stable of Samuel Johnston. [#91]

[#104] Sheriff Aleck Young, father of Whorter and William Young ([William being] the father of Mrs. J. C. Buchanan), lived where James A. Brice now lives. [#105] Lawyer Moore [resided] where J. C.'s [H. H. Caldwell] now lives. [#106] Rev. J. D. McCullough, the father of Mrs. E. F. Pagan lived in the present Methodist Parsonage, and it was then the Episcopal Parsonage. [#110] The old Methodist Church was a brick building [#111] East of the present Church. [#111] Luke Rowe, father of William Rowe, lived back of the church. [#112]

Robert Bentham Boylston lived [until 1856] where Mrs. Cattie Mobley now lives. [#113] Charles Laughlin, the father of Mrs. Joel Ashford, lived where John P. Matthews now lives, [#114] and his [Laughlin's] shop was where the front of the Hotel Duval now stands; and the Murphy's lived in [a] brick house that stood in the Center of [the] lot where [the] hotel now stands. [#115]

Boyleston Soyleston James H. Rion lived in the house now occupied by W. A. Hood, [#116] and Rion moved [in 1858] to the Rion house [#4] [later] occupied by L. A. Bye; and the [Robert B.] Boylston house, [#5] now the Colonial Inn, was built that year [in 1858] George W. Parker, the tailor lived where Robt. Crawford now lives. R. E. Ellison, Sr. was Sheriff and lived in the Jail.

W. R. Robertson was Commissioner in Equity; O. R. Thompson was Clerk of Court; and James Johnston, grandfather of T. L. Johnston, was Ordinary.

Rev. C. B. Betts was Pastor of [Bethel] A. R. P. Church; James Douglass [was pastor] of the [the] SionPresbyterian Church.

The building now used as a pool Room and Restaurant was David Aiken's blacksmith shop, and Simon Black was his blacksmith.

Dr. James H. Carlisle [who was so prominent in the Methodist Church and education in Spartanburg] was born in [a] house now occupied by Mrs. J. C. Mobley [#113].

Woodward and Randolph occupied the Store house where John P. Matthews now has a store, and John P. Matthews was their Clerk.

Mr. O'Hanlon had a carriage shop where Refo's store now stands.

the last column in any single section gives the percentage of all slaves within a District that are held by those persons owning "x" number of slaves—as presented in any one section.
