
Fairfield County - 1895 - Chester County 1825

In later years, Elbert "Birdie" Roberts would live in Chester County near the New Hope-Armenia Community.

Many of our ancestors lived in or near the Halsellville Community around the Chester-Fairfield County border.

That community is still the home for many of our cousins.

### **INTRODUCTION**

When I was a student at the University of South Carolina in the 1960's, I had a friend named **Ben Mullins**. Ben was from Marion, a small city in a section of South Carolina my father called the 'lower country.' My dad (**Talton Clark Roberts**) said everything a person needed could be found in the piedmont and upstate foothills. He asserted there was no reason for an intelligent person ever to venture below Columbia and he jokingly ceded all of the land between the state capital and the Atlantic Ocean to gnats, mosquitoes, snakes, gators and Yankees. Ben's beliefs about our state were in direct opposition to my dad's. Ben saw little use for the 'upstate,' which he claimed was inhabited mainly by bootleggers, red necks and hillbillies who married within their own family. To Ben the low country of South Carolina was the cradle of American history and all the favorable aspects of Southern Culture. Ben's main complaint about his heritage in the low country was that he did not live SOB or South of Broad Street in Charleston. Being an SOB Charlestonian was the ultimate measure of 'Old South gentility and culture.'

To complement his low country snobbery, Ben also was interested in his family's history. At that point in my life, genealogy was about as appealing as staying in the dorm to study during the running of the Carolina Cup. But Ben was a good friend so I listened, although not very attentively, when he insisted on discussing a new piece of information he had discover. Ben knew I had no more interest my family's history than I did in his. Yet, he persisted in telling me that I should at least talk with my Grandparents about our family and record their stories. Ben warned me that someday I would want to know the family history my grandparents had stored in their memories. It was good advice, but I ignored it for a number of years until my last remaining grandparent, Granny Roberts, (Martha Lee Clark Roberts) became ill.

When I asked Granny Roberts about our family, she was pleased to talk about her childhood and her memories of our family. As I listened to her reminisce, I became more and more interested in our family's story. Both of us looked forward to the time we would spend together talking about our family. But Granny's old age, and the weakness it brought, stopped our conversations before she had told me even a small portion of what she wanted me to know. What I learned about our family from Granny Roberts was invaluable, but the most wonderful thing about our discussion was that it helped me discover that your Grandmother can also be a friend. We had far too little time together. Ben had been right. I should have talked with my Grandmother sooner.

These conversations started my obsession with genealogy. I began hanging around the Chester County Courthouse, investigating the stacks at libraries, talking with Aunt Lula (Lula Roberts Allen ) whenever I was in Columbia or visiting Auntie Marge (Margie Lee Roberts). Then along came the Internet and everything changed. Not all of the changes were good, but the amount of available data was unbelievable. I gained a lot of knowledge from Internet connections. Unfortunately, even with the mass of information available, I still have too little information about my direct Roberts ancestors. Many of

them live their lives without leaving a lot of public information.

This manuscript is the result of what I have so far uncovered from digging into the past. The information is incomplete but that's the beauty of genealogy there's always more to uncover. As you read it you may find errors and inaccuracies but none are by design. A few errors may be from my 'sloppy' research but most are inevitable from the nature of genealogical research. The quest for family information is frequently based on such questionable data as relative's faulty memories; inaccurate recordings in family Bibles or on tombstones; poor spelling and carelessness by census takers and other record keepers; and other questionable data. We also must contend with our ancestor's habit of hiding or obscuring information they believed would embarrass the family. The best we can do is to make assumptions based on this data and attempt to verify the assumptions. Our main source of verification is the public record, however even when the assumptions are based on documentary evidence they may still be wrong. Many of our ancestors were poor and uneducated and left few public records. Also, some of the public records that existed were destroyed during the Civil War or by courthouse fires.

By sharing our information we expand the total knowledge available to those interested in studying it, and we also start a process that ultimately makes the data more accurate for all of us.

A genealogical history has to be more than a recitation of research data, facts and records; it is also a collection of stories. Most of the stories in this genealogy are mine, but there is room for your stories too. This is but a start of the telling of our family's story. More will be added as we go along.

### ELDER NICHOLAS AND ELBERT 'BIRDIE'

I am starting this history with two very different men with the last name of Roberts. They don't appear to have been related and there are few similarities between them. Nicholas lived in Fairfield County and Elbert lived in Chester County. Nicholas was a Baptist and Elbert was a Methodist. Nicholas Roberts was a prosperous landowner, a farmer and a preacher in the Baptist Church. Elbert was a small landowner known as the "Watermelon King" and nicknamed "Birdie" because he could imitate bird sounds. Nicholas was literate while Elbert was functionally illiterate and had limited ability to either read or write. Nicholas was born in 1747 and Elbert was born in 1825 over three generations later.

Nicholas would be my 5<sup>th</sup> Great Grandfather and Elbert would be my 2<sup>nd</sup> Great Grandfather. Nicholas' great, great Grandson was Wade Oscar Roberts. Elbert's daughter was Catherine Sarah Roberts. They met; fell in love and in December 1878 they married. My grandfather was one of their children.

For me these two men have one haunting similarity. They both have been barriers in my

research. I have been unable to determine who their parents were or how they came to be in South Carolina and particularly how they came to be in Chester and Fairfield Counties. This story then focuses on these two men. Their descendants now cover most of the country and many of them are still prominent citizens in Chester and Fairfield counties.

I am convinced that there is an old family bible or an old letter stuck in the back of someone's sock drawer that will unravel some of the mystery surrounding Nicholas and Elbert. This history might inspire all of us to look for more clues to our history.

Our Roberts relatives came to this area either through Charleston or from Northern states, but at this point we do not know which; however family tradition states that Nicholas Roberts originally came to this country from Wales. We don't know if this is true, but there were many Welsh Roberts. As for the origins of Elbert Roberts we only know that he reported on the census that he was born in South Carolina and that his parents were both born in South Carolina. **Wade Oscar Roberts'** side of the family jokingly referred to Granny Kat's (**Catherine Sarah Roberts**) family, as the West Chester Roberts or 'those other Roberts.' They poked good-natured fun by saying 'those other Roberts' were run out of England for stealing horses.

### ABBREVIATIONS AND NUMBERS

The abbreviations used in this document are standard with the exception of Bnu, which is a personal notation to indicate that the Birth Name of the individual is Unknown (Birth Name Unknown). It is usually used for the surname but it can also be used to indicate that the individual's given name is unknown.

Each person has a number. There is little significance to this number, except it helps to follow the individual in which you are interested. The numbers for an individual are unique for the section the individual is in. For the descendents of Elder Nicholas Roberts each of his known children has their own section. Children are listed with small case Roman Numerals. If there is a number in front of the child's name that indicated that there is more information on the family that child established. This information on the child will follow in a later portion of the section.

Here is an example of the numbering system and other information:

**6. MOSES WISEMAN<sup>4</sup> ROBERTS** (*WILLIAM "BILL SPROUT"*<sup>3</sup>, *WILLIAM "DOGWOOD BILL"*<sup>2</sup>, *NICHOLAS*<sup>1</sup>) was born April 17, 1813 in Fairfield County, South Carolina, and died December 22, 1888 in Union County, Mississippi. He married **NANCY JANE YOUNG** 1844, daughter of **WILLIAM YOUNG** and **DOLLY YOUNG**. She was born March 13, 1816 in Fairfield County, South Carolina, and died June 5, 1902 in Union County, Mississippi.

### Children of MOSES ROBERTS and NANCY YOUNG are:

- i. **WILLIAM<sup>5</sup> ROBERTS**, born January 4, 1834, Fairfield County, South Carolina.
- 20. ii. **JOHN ROBERTS**, born April 10, 1836, Fairfield County, South Carolina; died April 24, 1918, Union County, Mississippi.
- 21. iii. **ELIZABETH JANE ROBERTS,** born August 8, 1838, South Carolina; died about 1861, Mississippi.
- 22. iv. **MARY ANN ROBERTS**, born March 28, 1841, Fairfield County, South Carolina; died April 12, 1912, Union County, Mississippi.
  - v. **NANCY JANE ROBERTS**, born November 29, 1843, Fairfield County, South Carolina.
- 23. vi. **MOSES YOUNG ROBERTS**, born October 12, 1846, Fairfield County, South Carolina; died October 19, 1930, Union County, Mississippi.
- 24. vii. **HEZEKIAH CLARK ROBERTS**, born August 1, 1849, Union County, Mississippi; died February 11, 1928, Union County, Mississippi.

The small number between a person's given name and surname indicates the generation of the individual from the original ancestor.

The information that follows the individual and is in parenthesis is the direct ancestors of the individual. In this case, Moses Wiseman is the son of William (Bill Sprout), the grandson of William (Dogwood Bill) and the Great-grandson of Elder Nicholas Roberts

The 1st child of Moses Wiseman and Nancy Young is William. William is designated with an "i" There is no additional information on this individual.

John Roberts is the second child listed for this family group. He is designated "ii." The "20" in front of his name, indicates there is more information about John. This particular John Roberts will always be noted with a 20. Since there are many, many individuals with the name John Roberts, this number lets you be certain you have the information for this specific John Roberts. Remember however that the numbers are specific for the section of the report in which the person appears. (See cousins below)

### COUSINS

In the first portion of this history, I am following the descendants of each of Elder Nicholas' children and the families they established. All the information I currently have on the descendants of each of his children is listed in a separate section for that particular child. These children are: William 'Dogwood Bill' Roberts, John Roberts; Sarah Roberts and Lewis E.P. Roberts. Many of our ancestors married one of their cousins. That means that some people will appear under more than one group of descendants.

### NAMES

It is often difficult to follow the names in any genealogy. Not only did our ancestors frequently marry one of their cousins, they also gave their children family names. For example, there are many William Roberts in our families history. Sometimes one of our relatives would give his children the same names as one of his siblings had given his children. The problem is compounded by the use of nick names and the problem is truly compounded by the various spellings given the names.

In this history the Halsell surname is recorded as Halsey, Holsey, Halsel. The Wages surname is frequently recorded as Wagers. The Wages/Wagers name is particularly confusing because sometimes within the same family some siblings used the Wages name and some the Wagers name. Even the surname Roberts is recorded as Roberds or Robberts,

Given names are frequently problematic. Not only is the same given name used over and over from generation to generation but frequently the name is spelled differently. The given name of Hezekiah is recorded as Hesekiah. Lewis is spelled Lewis or Louis, occasionally within the same document. Within this history, given names for our Roberts ancestors are re-used frequently. There are 6 Elizabeths; 13 James; 30 Johns, 26 Marys, 23 Williams and 2 Willies

Nicknames also confuse our search. Many females in with the name Mary are simply recorded as Polly and Elizabeth's are recorded as Betsy. Sometime the given name is a nickname. Some of our ancestors actually named the children Polly, Betsy and even Bill as a given name.

Some of the given name help us identify an ancestor because they are so unique. For example, the Malone family had two daughters who married into our family one of them was named Phenella Bronzolla Malone the other sister was Tallulah Zuela Malone. Our ancesters who migrated from South Carolina picked up many unique given names for their children in their new home states.

In the recent past all public records were hand written and often the handwriting is illegible.

### **Nicholas Roberts**

The history of our Roberts family begins with Nicholas Roberts or more accurately it begins with the Beaver Creek Baptist Church. Although many of the early records of the church have disappeared we do know that it was founded in 1797 near the headwaters of Beaver Creek. Prior to the founding of the church the main religious center in the area was the Mobley Meeting House. Edward Mobley with six sons had emigrated from Maryland to South Carolina and settled in Poplar Ridge on the east side of Beaver Creek in Fairfield County. With the help of **Hans Waggoner**, a Hollander who also migrated to this area, they built a house of worship, which became know as the Mobley Meeting House. All denominations congregated in that house to worship God in the Christian faith. (During the Revolutionary War, the Patriots, under command of Major Winn, defeated a body of British and Tories who had assembled at Mobley Meetings House in June 1780.)

As the number of attendees grew they broke away and formed their own churches. The original Beaver Creek Baptist Church was constructed near the Mobley Meeting House. Later, in 1840, the church was moved to its present location on a hill in Fairfield County near the Chester County border. The church is sometimes referred to as 'Red Hill" to distinguish it from the original Beaver Creek Baptist Church. One of the first preachers at the church was our direct ancestor, **Nicholas Roberts**.

Although I was born and grew up in Greenville, South Carolina, about 90 miles from the Beaver Creek Baptist Church, that church was very important to my family. Granny Roberts who had moved from Fairfield County to Greenville, South Carolina in the 1920's maintained her Beaver Creek Baptist Church membership until her death. She sent money to the church and eagerly sought news of church happenings. When my family made one of our frequent trips to visit our Chester county relatives we always stopped at the old church. When I first heard that one of our direct ancestors had been the first preacher at the church I rejected the information as unsubstantiated rumors. Surely, if one of my direct ancestors had been such an important figure in the establishment of the church, my family would have preserved that information with pride. I stubbornly refused to include any information about Nicholas in my records for a number of years even when evidence of his existence and our relationship kept mounting.

I now know that my 5<sup>th</sup> great grandfather was Elder Nicholas Roberts and that he was a preacher at the Beaver Creek Baptist Church for close to 35 years, but I still can't understand how this information became lost to the oral history of my family.

### THE CICILY FLOYD MYTH

It's printed in books at the library and circulated all over the internet that Elder Nicholas

Roberts was married to Cicily Floyd, the daughter of Reuben Floyd and Mary Jordan. Initially I agreed with this myth based on documentation in a book entitled *Chester* County Marriages (1778-1879) Implied in Chester County Probate and Equity Records. This book states that Nicholas and Cecily Floyd were married as implied in the Court of Equity Bill 85 (1836). One day when I was plundering through the documents in the basement of the Chester Court House I found the original record. (It is also available on microfilm at the South Carolina Archives.) The Equity Court Documents deals with the resolution of a conflict over the disposition of Reuben Floyd's property after his death and the conflict over his wife Mary's re-marriage to William Terry, who abandoned her. The Equity Court record does not say anything about Nicholas being married to Cecily, but it does name Mary Floyd the wife of Nicholas Roberts as an heir of Reuben Floyd and the document named Cecily is a minor. Another Equity Court record in 1839 affirms that Cecily was, at that point, 18 years old and was married to a man named Barton (Looks like Barttie on the record) Pannell. After receiving a small settlement from Reuben's estate, Barton and Cecily moved from the area and settled in Howard County, Arkansas. They raised their children and died in Arkansas.

Transcription of a hand written document Court of Equity Chester County, South Carolina

Ex Parte

June Term 1839

Bartlet Pannel & Siciley Pannel his wife

To the honorable the chancellors of the said state. Humbly complaining show unto your honors that the father of the wife of your petitioner, Reuben Floyd, departed this life this \_\_\_\_ day \_\_\_\_year (left blank on the original document) having some real estates and a will was filed for partition and division of this same and the said lands was sold by order of this Honorable court and the avails of this sale of the lands have been received by the former or present commissioners and is lying there unproductive and your petitioners wife had a guardian in chief appointed for her to receive this small portion of said estate coming to her, her father having left several children. Your petitioner further shows unto your honor that he intermarried with Sicily Floyd, now Sicily Pannel the forth of June 1837 and she is now in her eighteenth year. Your petitioner applied to the former court to know whether he could get the small sum coming to his wife out of the proceeds of the said sale who informed him it could not be allowed until she comes of age. Your petitioner prays your honor to grant him an order to receive from the commissioner the sum now in his hands which he is entitled to in right of his wife.

Signed B Pannell

I do hereby consent that my husband, Barttie Pannell receive the amount of money coming to me from the estate of my Father Reuben Floyd which I wish the Court of Equity to order to be paid to him without any restrictions or conditions.

Cicely Pannel (her mark)

I do certify that the above named Cicely Pannel did this, on a private and separate examination, sign the above writing. 25 June 1839 James Hemphill

(This transcription accurately reflects the various spellings of Cicily's name.)

To further compound the confusion, the Nicholas in these records who is married to Mary Floyd is not Elder Nicholas Roberts instead it is Nicholas Roberts the son of John Roberts and the Grandson of Elder Nicholas Roberts.

\*\*\*

At some point Nicholas' wife died and in 1835, when he was an old man, he married **Mary Rogers**. This was Mary's second marriage. She had two daughters Nancy and Martha, from her first marriage.

The Reverend Mr. Ephram Fant married Nicholas Roberts and Mary Rogers at Beaver Creek Baptist Church.

In addition to being a preacher, Elder Nicholas was also a successful farmer. This was his main source of income since the church could not have paid him a living wage for his services. The main portion of the land he farmed was from a state land grant of 200 acres, which had been conveyed to him on April 3, 1786. The plat for the above grant had been certified on September 22, 1784. Nicholas also received a grant of 50 acres on May 27, 1811 in Fairfield District on Rachel's Branch of Pannell's Creek, a branch of the Little River.

Nicholas died in November 1, 1843. The <u>South Carolina Temperance Advocate</u> in its February 8, 1844 issue reported: "Died at his residence in Fairfield District in November 1843, after a lingering illness, Elder **Nicholas Roberts**, aged about 95 years, and pastor of Beaver Creek Church upwards of thirty-two years."

Sometime after his death, his wife Mary and her daughters moved to Mississippi. In the 1850 census of Tippah County, Mississippi Mary is listed as living with her daughter

Nancy who married a R. Carter. Mary's age is listed as 60 meaning she was born in 1790. In 1860, Mary Roberts (age 70) is living with Martha Halsey Tollison and William Tollison in Pontotoc County, Mississippi.

We do not know for certain where Nicholas is buried, but my cousin and friend, John Elbert Roberts III, believes he is buried in an abandoned grave yard about 100 yards off the Mt. Olive Church Road near the Hallselville community. The grave is marked with a fieldstone that is worn and unreadable. This site is near land owned by the Dove family. The land granted to Nicholas bordered land owned by Benjamin Dove.

On September 1, 1844 Beaver Creek Church passed the following resolution. "Resolved, that we mourn the loss of our venerable brother, Elder Nicholas Roberts, who was a faithful minister of the gospel for fifty-five years. Resolved further, that we tender to his afflicted family the expression of our heartfelt sympathies. (Membership of the Church at the time the resolution was passed was, 83 white and 28 black)

Nicholas did leave a will. Following is a transcription of the will.


Will of NICHOLAS ROBERTS. -- In the name of God Amen, I, Nicholas Roberts of Fairfield District in the State aforesaid being weak of body, but sound of mind and memory -- Do make and ordain this my last will and testament, in manner and form following and in the first place it is my will that all my just debts be paid by my Executors ---Secondly, I give and bequeath my beloved wife Mary all my estate real and personal of whatever kind, soever the same maybe, as a life estate consisting of the tract of land I now live on, my house and household furniture, my livestock of all kinds consisting of riding horse, cows, hogs and (can not readied The word starts with a C). My reason for making this bequest is that I have lived to a very old age am incapable of labouring for my living and am a dependent for my support and maintenance on my wife and her two daughters. It is therefore my will and desire that she shall have the whole of my estate real and personal and I do hereby give and bequeath the same to her as long as she shall live -- Thirdly it is my will and desire that after my wife's death, or is again married, that then the whole of my estate real and personal property be sold by my Executors and the moneys arising from said sale be equally divided between my children and the two daughters of my said wife shear and shear alike as tenants in common. And if any of my children be dead their children to receive the shear, their father or mother would be entitled to if living under this my will. And I do nominate constitute and appoint my friends Mardicai Holsey and Henry Lotson my Executors to this my last will and testament, disannulling all former wills by me heretofore made, Declaring this to my last. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirteenth day of July 1839. Signed sealed and declared in presence of us -- Elijah Shirly. Jacob Coleman

We have to wonder why Old Nicholas didn't name any of his natural children in his will. At the time the will was signed, I believe Nicholas' sons William was dead, but what of his other children. He also bequeathed his natural children the same share of his estate as his stepchildren. We have to assume that his natural children objected to this provision and probably objected to his marriage to Mary Rogers and her inheritance of his estate.


If there was controversy over the marriage of Nicholas and Mary that may explain the year long delay after Nicholas' death before Beaver Creek Church passed a resolution of recognition for Nicholas' contributions to the Church.

### Nicholas' first land grant

This is a copy of the plat for the first land grant Nicholas received on April 3, 1786. His land is bounded by Benjamin Dove and William Pannell. These families would intermarry with our family. His other neighbors are C.L. Hopkins and Israel Seamore. I recently discovered that Israel Seamore was a minister.



In October 1833 Jacob Stone applied for benefits from his service in the Revolutionary War. To attest to his good character he submitted the names on Rev. Nicholas Roberts and Malachi Mobley. From this document we are able to see the signature of our ancestor.



### More information on Beaver Creek Baptist Church.

I have a history of Beaver Creek Baptist Church. It was written by Charles C. Adams and read at the Church's Sesquicentennial celebration September 21, 1947. Mr. Adams discusses the lack of historical information about the early days of the church. The history of the founding of the church had been lost. There was no mention of Rev. Nicholas Roberts in the 1947 history.

There was an earlier history of the church written; however that history has disappeared as have many of the old church records. One theory is that the unknown author of that history took the old church records and never returned them. The loss of the earlier written history and the early church records is a tragedy to those of us interested in our family's history and it is equally tragic to those who want to know more about the little church on the "Red Hill" near the Chester-Fairfield border.

There were a group a Pennsylvania Dutch who came into the area and they formed Baptist Churches in the area. One was a Seventh Day Baptist on Broad River and the other was a Tunker Baptist church founded near Beaver Creek. The history is confused regarding these two congregations and there is a possibility that they merged. There is also a theory that our Beaver Creek Baptist Church broke off from these congregations. The Seventh Day Baptist were called Sabbatarians, they held their worship services on Saturday. The Tunker Baptist, practiced baptism by dunking three times. George Martin and Israel Seymore are early ministers to these congregations. Israel Seymore owned land adjacent to Elder Nicholas Roberts.

### MISSISSIPPI AND ARKANSAS

Most of our history books talk about the Great Migration into our state. In the 1700's, great numbers of settlers came into South Carolina. The state, like many of the other original states, eagerly sought immigrants with promises of free land. South Carolina even hired recruiters to go to places like Ireland and entice settlers. South Carolina also attempted to lure settlers from northern states by offering free or cheap land to anyone willing to relocate and establish a farm. Settlers poured into the state many coming on what was called the Great Philadelphia Wagon trail, a branch of which ran through what would become Chester and Fairfield counties. Chester, South Carolina even took its name because so many people from Chester County, Pennsylvania came into the area.

When Elder Nicholas Roberts' children were coming of age however free land in South Carolina was getting more difficult to obtain. Usually the oldest male child inherited all of his father's land. This left the younger siblings with the prospects of either purchasing or renting land. Unfortunately, the land that was available to them was undesirable. Farming practices during this country's early history did not include crop rotation or fertilization. Instead when land became barren the landowner just moved production to a different piece of land.

In addition cotton and many other crops grew better in Alabama and Mississippi. The land was more fertile. It was easier to cultivate and it produced greater yields at less cost. This was especially true of the Mississippi Delta area.

The influx of Scottish – Irish into the area also, made the available land situation more serious. Initially these new arrivals were not awarded land grants. Later this restriction eased slightly and they could apply, but the grants were not as easy to obtain as previously. That didn't deter these settlers who were industrious and hard working. They began buying land as soon as they could afford to do so.

When the newer states like Mississippi, Alabama and Arkansas began offering free or cheap land to entice settlers, the land hungry younger children quickly responded. They left South Carolina, and the other original colony states, in large numbers. When these settlers found life in their new home satisfactory, they sent letters back to their family and friends telling the virtues of their new state and encouraging them to join them. This enticed even more people to move away and South Carolina lost its young citizens in huge numbers.

Our ancestors ended up all over the country; however a large number of them went to Mississippi and the Arkansas. In fact so many settlers from Fairfield County went to Union county Mississippi that one of the sections of the county took the name Fairfield. Much of the information we have about our families comes from letters those early relatives wrote or Bible records they made.

### The possible Brothers of NICHOLAS ROBERTS

Some researchers believe that our Nichols Roberts came to this area with his brothers William (yes, another William), Lewis or Louis, John, Archibald and possibly Zachariah. We cannot yet prove what relationship existed between these supposed brothers, but I do believe they were related.

From census records we can find evidence for all of these 'brothers,' except for Nicholas. Who came to the area later than the others.

The earliest public record for any Roberts' in Chester or Fairfield is for a William Roberts. In January 1756 this William petitioned the court that his Mother (names Jane) obtained a Warrant for the Survey of 200 acres of land in Craven County and that she had executed the Warrant on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of February 1754 and returned the plat to the Surveyor General's office. In 1756 William' Mother, Jane, must be dead because William claimed in court that it was her desire and Intention that the property be resigned to William. The Surveyor General stated: "I certify that a Plat of 200 acres of land in Craven County surveyed Feb'ry the 27<sup>th</sup> by

John Liviston, D.S. and entered July 2d 1754 for Jane Roberts is not in in Surveyor Generals Office, but out of date." Certified 6 January 1756. The court granted Williams claim

From this we learn that William's father died sometime before 1754, otherwise the Warrant would have been in his name instead of Jane's. Is it possible that this Jane Roberts is the Mother of our Nicholas, too.

In 1788 Lewis Roberts was issued a Letter of Administration for William Roberts, deceased.

I have not been able to chart the descendants of these early Roberts with the exception of Archibald.

### Descendants of Archibald Roberts

1 May 1794. Archibald purchased 59 acres from Jacob Barker and his wife Catherine. John Robards (Roberts) was a witness to the transaction

**NICHOLAS<sup>1</sup> ROBERTS** was born about 1747 in Fairfield County, South Carolina. He died on November 1, 1843 in Fairfield County, South Carolina. We do not know who his first wife was, and there is a possibility that he was married to a second unknown lady, but in his old age, he married **MARY ROGERS**. Nicholas and Mary were married in 1835.

I believe Mary was born into the Halsell (Halsey, Holsey) family. Her first marriage was to a Mr. Rogers. Mary was born about 1790. I believe she died in Mississippi. In the 1850 census of Tippah County, Mississippi, Mary is listed at age 60 living with her daughter and son-in-law R. Carter. In 1860, Mary Roberts (age 70) was living with her daughter Martha and son-in-law William Tollison in Pontotoc County, Mississippi. They are listed as William and Martha Halsey Tollison.

Children of NICHOLAS ROBERTS and his unknown first wife:

- WILLIAM<sup>2</sup> ROBERTS "Dogwood Bill" was born about 1773 in Fairfield County, South Carolina. He died about 1836-1838 in South Carolina. He married SARAH ELIZABETH LEE. She was the daughter of ISHAM LEE.
- ii. **JOHN ROBERTS** was born about 1780 in Fairfield County, South Carolina. He married a lady named **MALONE**.

## Descendants of William Roberts, a son of Elder Nicholas Roberts, and his wife Elizabeth Lee

Our Roberts ancestors had a particular fondness for naming their male children William or John. This is very confusing to us today and it was somewhat confusing to them, so to distinguish among the different William Roberts' they used nicknames. Nicholas' son William was called 'Dogwood Bill.' Nicholas' grandson William was called 'Bill Sprout'. Nicholas' great grandson William was called 'Little Bill Sprout.' Folklore says that Elder Nicholas' son William Roberts gained his nickname "Dogwood Bill" due to his love of the dogwood tree.

**1. WILLIAM "Dogwood Bill" ROBERTS** (*NICHOLAS*<sup>2</sup>, *ROBERTS*<sup>1</sup>) was born about 1773 in Fairfield County, South Carolina, and died about 1836 in South Carolina. He married **SARAH ELIZABETH LEE**, daughter of **ISHAM LEE**, **SR**.. She was born 1785 in South Carolina.

John Elbert Roberts III believes that William Roberts, Sr. is buried at Beaver Creek Baptist Church in a grave marked with a large natural headstone and a smaller footstone. The only information on the headstone is a date. The date is very worn. You can tell there are numerals on the stone but it is close to impossible to say with any accuracy what they are.

We are fortunate that this William and his family left a few public records. From a deed recorded 25 May 1808 we verify Elizabeth (nee Lee) Roberts, wife of W. Roberts, Sr. when she relinquished her Rights of Dower.

On another deed recorded 25 May 1808 (Chester County, South Carolina) Penelope Lee, Milly Lee, John Lee, Wm. Roberts, Martha Hartin Relinquished their rights in the estate of Thomas Lee to Isham Lee. (I believe this Isham Lee to be Elizabeth Lee Roberts' brother.)

In Fairfield County Deed Book PP, Page 65 (1842) there is a deed for a tract of land on Pannell Creek, a tributary of Little River that mentions William Roberts, Lewis E.D. Roberts, Elizabeth Roberts Sr., and Elizabeth Roberts, Jr. I believe this is part of the estate of William ("Dogwood Bill") Roberts and that the people mentioned are two of his sons William (Bill Sprout) Roberts and Lewis Edward Dekalb Roberts, William's wife Elizabeth and another Elizabeth Roberts. It is difficult to place this Elizabeth Roberts, named Elizabeth Roberts, Jr. on the deed. William's daughter Elizabeth was already married to James Elihugh Wages based on the ages of their children but I have not found another Elizabeth to fit the time line.

It has been reported that Sarah Elizabeth moved to Mississippi after William's death. There is an Elizabeth Roberts listed in the 1870 census for Potomac County, Mississippi, New Albany, living in the household headed by Elizabeth Wages 52 who was born in South Carolina. She is herself as a farmer with property valued at \$1,000 and \$550 for personal property. She had the following people in her household: William Wages- 13 years old and born in Mississippi: James Wages - 11 years old and born in Mississippi: and Elizabeth Roberts - 64 years old and born in South Carolina. This Elizabeth's age makes it unlikely that she is our Elizabeth Roberts

There was also an Elizabeth Roberts living in Fairfield County with the David Roberts family. In 1850 this Elizabeth listed her age as 72. This Elizabeth is close to the age our Elizabeth would be, but at this point we can't identify this David Roberts and we do not know if he is connected with our family.

## I am listing John L. Roberts out of order. He was unmarried and had no known children but he has an interesting story.

**JOHN L. ROBERTS** (Son of William and Sarah Elizabeth Roberts) was born 1795 in South Carolina and he died 27 December1841 in Kemper County, Mississippi. John never married. He migrated to Kemper County Mississippi and managed to gather enough wealth to have a number of slaves.

The 1840 Census of Kemper County, Mississippi list John L Roberts as living alone and being between 30-40 years old. That would put his birth date between 1800 -1810. We show his birth date to be 1795, but being loose with facts was common when a federal government census taker was involved. The census also list that he owned four slaves;

two males aged between 24-35, one male between 36-55 and one female between 10-24 years old.

### The Murder of John L. Roberts

His slaves reportedly murdered John L. Roberts on December 27, 1841. The following letter from H.W. Roberts to Lewis Roberts tells of this event. Later Leroy Roberts would recount the murder of a 'Pully' Roberts by his slaves. I believe John L. Roberts to be the 'Pully' Roberts in the 1914 letter from Leroy Roberts to James A. Roberts. (A transcription of the 1914 letter from Leroy Roberts to James A. Roberts is recorded in a later part of this history. See Table of Contents.)

What follows is a transcription of a letter from H.W. Roberts to Lewis Roberts relating the story of this murder.

Lewis Roberts South Carolina, Fairfield District, Crosby P. O.

Wahlak, Ms

Postmarked and cancelled Feb 9th

State of Mississippi, Kemper County, January. 27th, 1842

Dear Uncle and Aunt,

I take my pen in hand to inform you of one of the most horrible circumstances ever perpetrated by human cruelty, it is of the murder of Uncle John L. Roberts, whose fate we lament as a relative dear to us all, but it becomes us to submit with reverance to the decrees of Almighty Provider. That dreadful occurrence took place on the night of the 27th of December last, only two days after I had left for home, it was on a Saturday. I left his house and on the succeeding Monday Night that he was slain by his Negroes, while asleep, the particulars of that horrible affair I have not space to relate now. Suffice it to say he was slain in the most barbarous manner by his own Negroes, who after they had beaten him, in the most cruel manner, with clubs, to death they hauled him about one mile and a half, took him out and carryed him about one hundred yards, threw him down beside a tree, took his braines & rubbed them on the tree to make the neighbors think he had been killed by his mare, he lay here near a week before he was found, the neighbors wrote to me as soon as they found, but having directed the letter to a wrong office I never received it, but merely heard of it by common rumor, which has been very

recently. The Negroes have been arrested and sent to prison, but long before I got intimation of the murder. I want you to come if you can, for the affairs are in a bad situation. Almost before he got cold, his creditors began to rush in for their dues. The Sheriff of this County has levied on every thing which is to be sold on the first Monday in February next to satisfy an execution of about 800 dollars. And as there is nothing allowed by the State for criminals, they will be a total loss. Their trial will come on in April, unless they get a grant to a petition, sent on by them, praying that a special Court may be called and try them forthwith.

I have been to see them since I came up, and heard their confessions. It appears that it had been in contemplation for about a year, first by poison, which failed, and then they resolved to murder him. I, recently, was conducted to the place where he was thrown! Saw, with melting heart, the place where he lay! His head had been beaten all in pieces, and a great many of them, with some of his hair were still to be found. After pausing and sobbing, I gathered up all I could find, and put them in his grave!

If he never answered your letter, it was in consequence of his ill health, for since August he has been severly afflicted in a strange manner, during the greater part of which time, he was near on the point of death. To be continued.

Our cousin, Tommy Bryant, believes H.W. Roberts to be Hezekiah W. Roberts who shows up on census records. There is a H.W. Roberts listed in the 1850 census for Lauderdale County Mississippi. Lauderdale County is adjacent to Kemper County. This H.W. was 28 years old in 1850. He lists his occupation as a merchant. Living with him are Thomas Roberts 22, also born in South Carolina and John or Joseph Roberts 21. Thomas and John/Joseph list their occupation as clerking. We know H.W. is closely related to us, but we have not yet discovered how he connects with our family.

The earliest record I have found of John in Kemper County is on the 1837 tax list. He is also listed on the 1839 tax list and in 1842 his estate is listed on the tax list.

**2. WILLIAM "Bill Sprout" ROBERTS** (*WILLIAM*<sup>3</sup>, *NICHOLAS*<sup>2</sup>, *ROBERTS*<sup>1</sup>) was born about 1791 in South Carolina. He married **MARY "POLLY" WAGES**. She was born about 1792 in South Carolina.

The Wages and Roberts families were closely connected. Many of them intermarried. This Mary Wages, who married William "Bill Sprout" Roberts is one of the many Wages (Wagers) that intermarried with members of our family. I have been unable to identify her parents.

During this generation, William Roberts' sister Elizabeth would marry

George Washington Wages and William's brother Lewis Edward Dekalb Roberts would marry Sarah Gainey Wages.

I am convinced Mary 'Polly' Wages is related to George Washington Wages and Sarah Gainey Wages, but I have been unable to make any connections or to find any additional information about her.

### Trading with a Negro

A William Roberts was arrested 9 May 1846 for trading with a Negro. Since there were a number of William Roberts, three of whom are my direct ancestors, the first question is which William Roberts are we talking about. I believe "Dogwood Bill" was dead by 1846. That would leave William Roberts, known as "Bill Sprout', and his son William Roberts, known as "Little Bill Sprout." The court papers repeatedly refer to William Roberts, Senior. The use of Senior or Junior in old court records was used to distinguish between people with the same name. It does not always imply a relationship. Since the legal documents made such an effort to distinguish between tow people with the name William Roberts, there is little doubt that the older William known as "Bill Sprout" was our relative who got in trouble with the law by trading with the slave.

William traded shoes with Joe, a slave belonging to Mr. Francis Land. John Halsell and Samuel Brice posted bond for William. John Halsell must have been John H. Halsell, Jane Halsell's brother. Jane Halsell had recently married William's son "Little Bill Sprout." There is a close relationship between Francis Land and his family and ours. Francis was married to Elizabeth Halsell, the daughter of John Halsell and Margaret Waggoner and the Aunt of Jane Halsell, the wife of William 'Little Bill Sprout' Roberts.

Following are transcripts of the court documents:

### Notes for WILLIAM ROBERTS:

This William was called "Bill Sprout"

William Roberts was arrested 9 May 1846 for trading with a Negro.

Since there were a number of William Roberts, three of whom are my direct ancestors, the first question is which William Roberts are we talking about. I believe "Dogwood Bill" was dead by 1846. That would leave William Roberts know as "Bill Sprout' and his son William Roberts known as "Little Bill Sprout." The court papers repeatedly refer to William Roberts, Senior. The use of Senior or Junior in old court records was used to distinguish between people with the same name. It does not always imply a relationship. However in this case it appears as if Bill Sprout was our relative who traded with the slave.

William traded shoes with Joe a slave of Mr. Frances Land. John Halsell and Samuel Brice posted bond. John Halsell was probably John H Halsell son of Peter and Sarah Combest Halsell. Jane Halsell had recently married William's son "Little Bill Sprout." Following are transcripts I made of the court documents. Whereas Elarey H. Land makes complaints on oath unto me, Wm.. Thomas Magistrate. that on the night of the fourth of May inst William Roberts Snor(Senior) did by (buy) corn from a Negro man contrary to the laws of South Carolina. Sworn before me the 5th day of May 1846.

Land or from and under the hand of any person having the care and management of said slave; against the form of the Act of General Assembly, in such case made and provided, and against the peace and dignity of the same State aforesaid and the Jurors aforesaid, on their oaths aforesaid, do further present, that the said William Roberts on the Forth day of May in the same year aforesaid, with force and arms at Chester Court House in the district of Chester aforesaid, did deal, trade and traffic with a certain slave of Frances Land named Joe by buying and purchasing from said slave a quantity of Indian corn and selling to said slave one pair of shoes the said slave then and there not having a permit so to deal, trade or traffic, from or under the hand of the said F. Land or from and under the hand of any person having the care and management of the said Slave, against the form of the Act of the General Assembly in such case made and provided, and against the peace and dignity

Summary of Document On June 6, 1846 Cephas Bolick, Special Constable was commissioned to bring the following before the court to provide testimony. Wm.. Hedgepath, Cephas Bolick, Charles Parrott, Samuel Brice, John Thompson, (scratched through name), Jesse Simpson, John Halsell, F.H. Land.

William Roberts was found guilty November 3 1846 He appeared to have been fined \$93.15

On the 1850 Census of Chester County, South Carolina his occupation is listed as None This is a fascinating story that raises some questions in my mind:

1. Was Bill Sprout trying to obtain food for his family or raw materials for the manufacture of whisky?

(Most of his children were grown so it is unlikely that Bill Sprout needed the food. He probably wanted the corn to make whisky and generate cash.)

2. What happened to Joe the slave who traded the Indian corn to Bill Sprout for shoes? (Due to the climate in the area just before the Civil War and the fear white South Carolinians had of slaves revolting. The stealing of corn would have been seen as a show of independence and it would have been considered a serious offense. Since Joe traded for shoes it seems likely that the Land family would have considered him a runaway risk. Joe was probably harshly punished.)

### The Will of William S.P. Stone

Our petitioner shows that about the 18th day of April A.D. 1856 William Stone, late of said County, departed this life, intestate, as petitioner is informed and believes, leaving in said County, where his last domicil and last residence was, an estate consisting of personal property, debts due him and about the value four thousand dollars, and a tract of 601 acres of land. That the personal property so left consists of horses, cattle and other stock, household furniture and farming utensils. That said decedent left as his heirs, Elizabeth Wages, wife of John W. Wages, Sarah Pannell, wife of William Pannell, Emeline Stone, Caroline Stone and Milly Stone, all of whom are of mature age, and John Stone who is a minor, and none others,- That all of said heirs reside in said County of Pontotoc; That heirs and next of kin, desire to waive and relinquish their prior right to administrator, and that petitioner shall be appointed administrator of said estate, as is evidence by the paper herewith filed and made a part of this petition, marked " Exhibit A", Signed by said John W. Wages, William Pannell and the other heirs

Petitioner believes and represents that the interest of said estate requires someone should be appointed administrator of said estate, and your petitioner being willing to accept said trust, prays your honor to grant unto him letters of administration on said estate- that all necessary orders may be made in premises- your petitioner offering to enter into bond with securities as your honor may require & c. W.D. Sloan

### 4. LEWIS (LOUIS) EDWARD DEKALB<sup>4</sup> ROBERTS (WILLIAM<sup>3</sup>, NICHOLAS<sup>2</sup>,

*ROBERTS*<sup>1</sup>) was born 29 Mar 1810 in South Carolina, and died 07 May 1859 in Mississippi. He married **SARAH GAINEY WAGES** 14 Apr 1836 in Richland County, South Carolina, daughter of **MOSES WAGES** and **REBECCA CRAWLEY**. She was born 20 Oct 1814 in South Carolina, and died 11 Apr 1908 in Mississippi. Lewis and Sarah Wages Roberts are buried in the Stone Family Cemetery in Union County, Mississippi. It appears that Lewis and his family moved to Mississippi about 1846 and that Lewis became involved in the community. By 1859 Lewis was serving as the Secretary of the Mt. Giliad Baptist Church near Blue Springs, Mississippi.

The story that follows originated from our cousin Tommy Bryant. He is relating a story personally told to him by one of our cousins, Sheriff John Jolly (Sheriff was Mr. Jolly's given name. He was not a sheriff.)

In 1859, Lewis Edward Dekalb Roberts' daughter, Sarah Elizabeth, married Samuel G. McCraw. For some reason, Lewis did not approve of the marriage and did not care for Sam McCraw. Lewis seems to have been very vocal in his criticism of Sam and one of his comments angered one of Sam's nephews, a young man named Jim Holiday. As a result of Lewis' criticism a verbal interchange between Lewis and Jim Holiday erupted, during which Jim expressed his plans to get revenge against Lewis.

On 7 May 1859, Lewis was traveling to the Mt. Gilead Baptist Church. Near the church Jim Holiday lay in ambush and when he passed, Jim shot and killed Lewis. Lewis was buried in Stone Cemetery, in Union County.

Sheriff John Holly said, "Lewis was not fond of Sam, and said so. One day, a nephew of Sam's, a 16-year-old boy named Jim Holiday, mentioned the sore spot to Lewis, and spoke well of Sam. Apparently, tempers flared, and Lewis rebuked Jim. Later, on the witness stand, Jim said no harsh words were exchanged; Lewis merely told him 'Get out of here, or I'll slap you down!' However, Jim was humiliated, and couldn't forget it. He knew Lewis would be traveling from his home to Mt. Gilead Baptist Church the next Saturday for church business. That day, on the road to the church, off the Blue Springs-Wallerville Road, Jim lay down behind a log, and when Lewis passed by, shot and killed Lewis. He was later tried, convicted, and hanged.

"The young boy, after his conviction and death sentence, requested a pine box casket, so he could go 'through Hell a'poppin'. He was buried face down, with a rock over his head, in a north-south direction, instead of the usual east-west, since he had always been 'cross wise to the world'." (Story told to me (Tommy Bryant) by Sheriff John Jolly, 1981)

There is no court record of this in Pontotoc County, but the story has been told and retold through the Roberts, McCraw, Jolly, and Holiday families, and must be true. Coupled with the absence of both a legal record and an identifiable cemetery grave for him, this might indicate Jim Holiday was dealt vigilante justice.

Lewis purchased land in Union County Mississippi. His first purchase was for 159 60/100 acres. A land patent was issued on October 9, 1845. A second land patent was issued for 160 14/100 on December 15, 1847.

This letter is to son in law Lewis Edward DeKalb Roberts from Moses Wages. The origin and destination of the letter is not known. Sarah is Moses' daughter and Lewis' wife; the grandson is John Lee Roberts, born 25 January 1837. The location and owner of the original letter is not known; this came from a copy owned by Bobbie Jolly Rorie, of Union County, Mississippi, about 1981. (It must have been while the families were still in Fairfield County, South Carolina.)

Feb 21st 1837

Sir

Wish you to hall my cotten to Columbia. Not to start for a few weeks except you here of the cotten market rising. I shall not like to sell at the price that I have here. I understand that cotten ante worth more than forteen cents which I should not like to take that for my cotten. I want you to have a cerain acount of the price of cotten before you start with mine. I inten to hold back my cotten till the last of March except cotten rises to some thing like sixteen or seventeen. When you hall I wish you to bring me 25 lb shuger and the cheepest sack of salt you can get and five gallon of molase as to my house. I'd know what to say to you yet as to the gray mare. Shall not want her to go because I shall keep her up here. One reson that I don't want her to go I think she is infold. Tell Sarah to take good care of my little gransun and when I come down I will fetch him a present. You be shore not to let Wesley know when you go. If he goes with you don't you let him have one dollar of the money you get for the cotten, no more.

# What happened to all the William Roberts'?

There are many mysteries surrounding all of our William Roberts ancestors. The first William Roberts (Dogwood Bill) seems to have died early and left few records of his life.

His son William Roberts (Bill Sprout) married Mary Wages. "Bill Sprout" is our ancestor who was arrested for trading with a slave. "Bill Sprout" is listed in the 1850 census of Chester County as being 59 years old and having no occupation. This is unusual since most people listed their occupation as 'farmer' or 'laborer.' In all probability "Bill Sprout" was sick or disabled in 1850. He does not appear on the 1860 census. This leads me to believe that he died between 1850 and 1860.

"Bill Sprout's" son William was called "Little Bill Sprout." He married Jane Halsell. "Little Bill Sprout" was listed with Jane and their children in the 1850 census of Chester County. He reported that he was 23 years old and that he was a farmer. Jane Halsell Roberts reported her age as 28 years old. "Little Bill Sprout" does not appear on the 1860 census. Did he die between the censuses or did he abandon his family?

I have been unable to establish the history of this Sarah Wages.

#### MAYBE A CLUE?

We have a hint that William "Little Bill Sprout" Roberts may have had a middle initial of "T." In a publication call *The Working Christian* there is an announcement that on 10 June 1880 at the residence of W.T. Roberts of Chester County, Rev. J.D. Mahon married W.G. Orr of Fairfield County to Miss Abi Roberts. "Little Bill Sprout" had a daughter Abigail. Additionally, Little Bill Sprout's sister Elizabeth married John Orr and they had a son named Wade G. Orr. If this announcement refers to our ancestors then we know a middle initial for our William "Little Bill Sprout" Roberts. Abigail Roberts and Wade Orr would be 1<sup>st</sup> cousins.

#### THE MURDER OF HESAKIAH ROBERTS

There are many stories about our family, but there is one in particular I have been trying to verify for many years. John Elbert Roberts, II told me the first version of the story at a family reunion and challenged me to research it. The story was part of the family legend and John Elbert was interested in verifying it. Later Agnes Roberts Banks confirmed that she too had heard the story and added some details.

It seems that at some point something happened between two of our relatives. One was named Kiah (short for Hezikiah) and the other was named Lee. In the course of settling the dispute Lee shot, and reportedly killed, Kiah. It does not appear that Lee went to jail for the murder. It may have been that there was some justification for the event or the murder might have gotten lost in the confusion around the Civil War or perhaps the law enforcement officials never connected Lee with the shooting. However, Lee did leave the county and the state. As he left, he reportedly said he would never again set his feet in the dirt of either South Carolina or Chester County. His parting words indicate that he was angry with many people, including members of his family, who must have judged him more harshly than the legal system.

Although I have never found any records of this event, our Cousin John Howell, a direct descendent of Hezikiah, confirms that Hezikiah was killed in approximately 1865. He was shot and killed in his house. The assailant shot from outside the house through a window killing Hezekiah. John reports that the assailant was a relative.

Recently some of the family gathered at the home of John Elbert Roberts III. Kirk and Pres (Gary Preston) Roberts were talking about this incident. The story they remember involves a dispute between Hezikiah and a close relative named Lee. Lee was probably a cousin, but he was younger than Hezikiah. We do not know if Lee was his first name or middle name or nickname. One day when members of the family were together, the dispute escalated and in anger Hezikiah threw a brick at Lee. The brick missed its

intended target, but it did hit Lee's father, who died from his injury. Naturally this further intensified the dispute and Lee vowed that one day he would kill Hezikiah in retribution. It was some years later when Lee kept his promise and shot Hezikiah. Supposedly Lee was sentenced to serve in the confederate Army for his offense. This part of the story is doubtful since Hezikiah was killed in 1865 and the war would have been over before Lee could have been sentencedied

There are a number of mysteries surrounding this incident. First, who is the Lee Roberts who killed Hezikiah? There is a Lee Roberts who is the son of William Roberts and Elizabeth Lee Roberts. He would be Hezikiah's uncle. I have not yet found a younger Lee.

In all probability the answer to this mystery rest in an old letter hidden away in one of our relative's cedar chest.

There is a H. Roberts listed in the 1860 census of Fairfield County. His wife is listed a Cynthia. They have one child a girl named Polly A.(Mary). Living with this family is a Polly Roberts aged 65. I believe this to be Hezikiah. Cynthia I believe to be Sintellia misspelled by the census taker. The 65 year old Polly I believe to be Hezikiah's mother Polly Wages Roberts.

The murder of Hezekiah occurred in Richland County. Court records for the period are at the state archives, but they have not yet been catalogued.

A story from our cousin Tommy Bryant

In 1980, I spoke with her tenth child, Sheriff John Jolly, himself at that time close to ninety. He said he remembered his mother talking about the time the Yankees came through Blue Springs, and how they hid their only mule, and what little cotton they had, in their house. Luckily, the Yankees did not search their home. I remember thinking to myself at the time, "How often can a person in 1980 meet someone just one generation removed from the Civil War?" Sheriff (his given name, not a title) was a retired rural mail carrier and postmaster of the Blue Springs Post Office, and knew every person and every road in the area. He took me out to the Stone Cemetery, which was so over grown,

we had to crawl into it on our hands and knees. He was one of my main sources for the early history of the Roberts, McCraw, Jolly, and Bryant data.

### The Letter from Leroy Roberts to James A. Roberts

The letter was written to James Roberts (James Ausborn Roberts, son of Moses Wiseman Roberts and Nancy Jane Young). Agnes Roberts the wife of Walter Roberts, who was the son of James Ausborn Roberts, found the letter in an old trunk. It was published in THE BULLETIN, a publication of the Chester District Genealogical Society. The letter gives us much information about our family, and it tells us a lot about Leroy Roberts.

(NOTE: Within the letter Betty Gary's notations are in parentheses and underlined.)

Burleson, Tnn. January. 15, 1914

Mr. James A. Roberts *New Albany, Miss.* 

Cousin James:

I write in answer to your letter received a few days ago. Was glad to hear from you and to hear your well. This leaves me well. I will try to give you more information about your uncles and aunts than you seem to know. Grandfather Roberts had 9 children. Moses, your father, was the oldest. John, William (my father), James, Hesakiah, Millie, Polly, Betsy, and Emily, the youngest. All are dead now.

Aunt Betsy's family and aunt Emily's are back in South Carolina, in Chester Co. I will tell who all married, the girls in order: Aunt Miller married John Roberts. Polly married Jason Wages. They left S. C. when I was quite small. Bettie married John Orr. Emily married Vincent Peay. The boys married, 1st your father married Nancy Young, as you know. I do not know who John married, as it might be he married in Georgia. If I ever saw him I do not remember. William, my father, married Jane Halsell. James married a Bailey. They had only one child, a girl. Heszkiah married a Shannon. Their 3 children are in S. C. near Columbia, in Richland County.

Yes, our grandfather's name was William. Also our g-grandfather was called "Dogwood Bill". Our grandfather was called Bill Sprout - off of the Dogwood. My father was called "Young Bill Sprout". There was another Bill called Santa Anna, who I think, is Nick Bradshaw's grandfather. As I have heard he was murdered. We had a great uncle murdered by his own negroes in Miss., before the war. He was called Pully Roberts. He was never married. I have seen the Negro woman who told on the rest of the Negroes who killed him. They hanged 5 of them. He was sick and they took advantage of that and killed him. He was a very large stout man.

Now I will tell you something of myself and my father and mother. They were married the first of the year 1844.(<u>BLG: this was Moses Robert's</u> <u>brother, Wm.</u>) I was born December 17th 1844, so you see I am past 69 years old. There were 6 of us. Our names in order: Myself, Leroy, Bombest called Bess, Peter and Wade. The girls were Abigail and Elizabeth. All are dead except me and Wade. I married a Weir of Fairfield Co. S. C., in the year 1871. She died in 1881 and left me with 3 children. 2 boys and a girl. My baby was only 3 months old He lived until he was over 2 and died. The other two is living yet. After my baby died I broke up house keeping, rented my place out and went to south Fla. Stayed there 27 months, came back to S. C. and farmed. I sold fruit trees for 3 years. Have traveled some, run a market house. Tried boarding house and various other things. I saw that my place was running down so I sold it and came here and am living with my son, as I never married a 2nd time. My daughter is married. She lives in Ga. My son went to the army in the Spanish American war. He came from Cuba to Tnn. He has 5 children. 4 boys and a girl. We have bought land here. This is a fine farming country, especially up and down the Hatchie river. I have been out here 8 years. I was in Lee's army in Va. Came through with but one wound. Was in most of the battles fought around Richmond and in Petersburg in Maryland, and 2 battles in N. C. I was taken prisoner near Appomattox and carried up in N. Y. Got home in July 1865, after the surrender. So you see I have a great deal to be thankful for. Our grandmother's name, before she married, was Polly Wages. Our g-grandmother was a Lee. I will stop now as I don't want to go back to Adam and Eve. I am going to write to Nick Bradshaw, as I would like to trace him a little further. Also, I will write to your brother, John. I owe Moose a letter as he has written to me a few times. I shall have to close as my fingers have begun to take the cramps and I am trying to write by a flickering light. Let me know if any of Ben Roberts's family is out there. I have heard that aunt Millie's son, Allen married Dickson Robert's widow. Ben's boy's names are Dickson, Wesley, and Greek? (could not make out his name), Thomas and Eddied The girls: Rebecca, Nancy, Irene and maybe some younger ones. I would like to hear from them. My youngest brother is 3 years older than you are. I think you are mistaken in the year uncle Moose left S. C., as I can remember being at his house when he was getting ready to leave there. It must have been 1846 or 47. I was very small, yet I remember one of the children carried me on their back and ran with me. It is like a faint dream to me, but my mother has told me that was where we were. I owned a place near there since I was married. If your mother was living I could describe it so she would know, for her father's old house stood near for many years afterwards. Write and ask any questions about our ancestors and I will be glad to answer same.

Leroy served in the 12<sup>th</sup> Infantry, Company E and in the 23<sup>rd</sup> Infantry, Company F. Leroy was captured on April 11, 1865 and held prisoner in Hart's Island, New York Harbor. He was released on June 16, 1865. Leroy signed an Oath of Allegiance to the United States on June 16, 1865. His military record lists him as having a fair complexion, light hair and blue eyes. Leroy was five feet one inch tall.

I cannot identify Nick Bradshaw or the William Roberts who was called 'Santa Anna.' I

am puzzled that Leroy did not mention the murder of his brother Hezikiah.



# Catherine Sarah Roberts or Sarah Catherine Roberts?

What was her real name? Her obituary referred to her Catherine Sarah Roberts, but Wade Oscar, her husband and his family referred to her as Sarah Catherine. Wade's will list his wife, Sarah Catherine Roberts, as executor. I'm going with the information from her obituary.

In his will Wade names 10 children. Eunice Taylor, Mary Jane Kimmie, Martha Elizabeth Dove, Samuel BORN



Wade Oscar Roberts and Catherine Sarah Roberts Roberts. I don't believe their stern appearance is indicative of their personalities. They must have been cheerful and loving people to have parented such a remarkable group of people.

**Roberts**, **James Wade Roberts**, **Lula BORN Allen**, **Evelyn Green**, **Estelle Wilson**, **Marion D. Roberts** and **John Elbert Roberts**. The will directs that \$1.00 be given to **William H. Roberts** and **Margaret C. Roberts** the children of a predeceased son P.O.(Peter Oscar) The will specified that the \$1.00 was not an indication of his love and affection but because their father's estate had taken care of them. Wade Oscar also directed that his son, John Elbert, be paid \$500.00 as repayment for a loan his son gave him at the conclusion of the World War. The will was signed with a signature on 23 July 1924.

Both Wade Oscar and Catherine Sarah Roberts Roberts are buried in the Beaver Creek Baptist Church cemetery in Fairfield County, South Carolina.

Kirk and Halsell Roberts remember their Granny Kat, who lived with their family in her old age. She always referred to all of her grandchildren by the name Doosey regardless of whom she was talking. This frequently caused a problem for the children, who didn't always know who she was calling, but they all knew to move when she called. Granny Kat was to be obeyed.

Catherine also knew and practiced folk remedies. Kirk and Halsell remember once when she was displeased with the appearance of the pears growing on the old pear tree at the front of their property, she ordered a quart of turpentine which she divided into smaller bottles and hung those from the tree. The following year the pears were flawless.

On another occasion a cat had spread fleas into the upstairs of the old home place, she ordered that limbs and leaves from a black walnut tree be laid on the floor. In less than a week all the fleas were gone.

Catherine Sarah Roberts died on November 17, 1944. Prior to her death her grandsons Kirk and Halsell Roberts remember one evening when she came walking from the house. She made her way all over the farm, inspecting everything as she went. She looked in each corncrib, barn smoke house and shed. After completing her inspection she smiled to show her pleasure and said that "with the Lord's help John Elbert brought in a fine crop." She returned to the house and that was the last time either Kirk or Halsell remember her leaving the house.

On the day she died Kirk and Halsell were going fishing when their father Elbert overtook them driving his old Desoto and told them to return home because their grandmother had died.

Maggie's husband, Monroe Rakestraw, died in 1918. Her second husband, Nathan Bramlett, turned out to be a poor choice. My grandmother (Maggie's daughter, Clytee) could not stand the sight of Bramlett. Apparently, he was a mean-spirited individual, who mistreated both Maggie and her son, Jack. My grandmother interceded on behalf of her younger brother (Jack) telling her mother, ". . . he'll not lay a hand on Jack." According to Darrell Rakestraw (Jack's son), his father came to live with my grandparents (Clytee and Arnold Turner) at age 13 for a brief period of time. Jack next went to live with his sister, Minnie, and then his older brother, Virgil (in Arkansas). It was in Arkansas that Jack met and married Esther Whitley. Maggie left the odious Bramlett, but they were never divorced. I'm sure family members breathed a sigh of relief and said, "Good riddance!" (Note: There is NO mention of Bramlett in Maggie's obituary.) After Bramlett's death, Maggie married Hubert Bell, a widower and, from all accounts, a good man. Hubert's first wife, Emma Rakestraw, was the sister of Maggie's first husband, Monroe Gainum Rakestraw.



James and Martha Lee Clark married at the Beaver Creek Church Parsonage. **Rev. E.D. Wells** conducted the service on December 25 1912. The wedding witnesses were Mr. and Mrs. R.D. Vandiford (Martha's sister and brother-in-law) and Lula Roberts and Elbert Roberts (James' brother and sister)

James Wade Roberts and Martha Lee Clark Roberts lived the early years of their marriage in a house on 103 acres on the Fairfield/Chester border. Many people call their old home place the 'Clark Place.' Just before they left the area Granny Roberts was given this land by her father, Talton Elam Clark. On January 20, 1916 he conveyed to Martha L. Roberts 102 1/4 acres of land he had inherited with his wife Maggie P. Robinson Clark from the estate of John E. Robinson. On February 9, 1916 John E. Robinson, J.F. Clark and Mary C. Vandiford released to J.W. Roberts the rights to the above land.

While they lived at their old home place, my grandfather tried to grow many different crops, but he was never successful with them. That may be part of the reason he left the area. I have always wondered why my family moved to Greenville. I do know that the booming Textile industry sent recruiters into the rural areas of South Carolina, North Carolina and Tennessee in an effort to get new workers, but since my Grandfather didn't work in textiles until later in his life, I never believed a textile job was an enticement to move. Margie Lee Roberts believes that my Grandfather came to Greenville lured by the prospects of going into business with his brother-in-law, who had already relocated to Greenville County

My grandfather was a stern man, but unlike his brother John Elbert, my grandfather was known to lose his temper when disciplining children. I only saw my Grandfather a couple of times. In the early 1940's he left my Grandmother and their children and moved in with a lady named Bertha Allen. My family would go to the house they shared but we, as children, were never allowed to go into their house, only my father could do that. We usually were restricted to the car to wait. Only once do I remember being allowed out of the car when my dad visited his father. Then we were allowed to play in the yard under the watchful care of my mother.

I have no memory of every talking with my Grandfather and I do not remember ever seeing Ms. Allen.

I remember Grandfather Roberts as being somewhat aloof when he joined us for trips from Greenville to Chester. He didn't say much to any of his grandchildren during the trip. I do remember Aunt Jessie (Jessie Wages Roberts) telling my grandfather that he was always welcome in her house, but 'that woman' was not.

My Grandmother spent most of her adult life trying to understand why her husband abandoned her and his children; why her oldest daughter Margie Lee Roberts was afflicted with a debilitating mental illness and why alcoholism consumed her sons Arthur and Talton. Through it all she remained supportive and inspirational and she never lost her faith or her belief that there was a design and a plan that justified the misfortunes she endured.

I recently learned that towards the end of my Grandfather's life, Ms. Allen found his care to be too demanding and called my father for help. My father took my grandfather to the hospital. Before my Grandfather died my father took my Grandmother to his hospital room and gave them some private time together. We will never know what they said in that hospital room, but I hope they found the courage to forgive each other. I never heard my grandmother say anything negative about her husband or Ms. Allen.

Once when I was a boy, my father loaded our family into our car and with Granny Roberts and Aunt Marge we headed to the mountains to see the aftereffects of a massive forest fire. As we rode along my father flipped a cigarette from the car and I scolded him, since the radio had said a careless smoker caused the fire. My sweet mild-mannered grandmother turned to me and in a stern commanding voice, that stopped me cold with its authority said, "William, you are never to talk to you father like that." That was one of the most effective disciplinary actions I ever received. No one ever wanted to disappoint my Granny Roberts.

Most people called him Rob. Uncle Rob and his wife, Jennie, lived close to my family when I was born and during my early years. They spent a great deal of time with me and I accompanied them on outings, day trips and even visits to Laurens, South Carolina where Jennie's parents lived.

I have many pictures of me as a toddler with my Aunt Jennie Cathcart Roberts. However, Rob and Jennie separated and divorced before I became old enough to have any memories of her. I do however have some vivid memories of Uncle Rob. Rob was the oldest child in his family, but he became addicted to alcohol early in his life and spent most of his adult years in a struggle maintaining both a job and his health. Through it all, however, he cared about me and he took a personal interest in what I did. He taught me how to play solitaire and showed me where he kept his playing cards so I could get them on those Sunday afternoon when my family was visiting and I became bored. When I started driving, it was Uncle Rob who explained why you shouldn't change from reverse to first gear and use the transmission to stop the car's backwards movement. When I started wearing ties it was Uncle Rob who taught me how to tie a four in hand and a Windsor knot. ii. INFANT ROBERTS, born 05 Jul 1915, Chester County; died Jul 1915, Chester County.
Infant Roberts died shortly after birth. He is buried in a family graveyard on the 102 1/4 acre tract of land Talton Elam Clark conveyed to Martha Lee Clark Roberts. My brother, TC; my cousin, Karen Foster; and I visited this graveyard and recorded the readable markers. Most are from the Estes

Family. There is no visible marker for Infant Roberts.

As a boy, my family would take my Grandmother (Martha Lee Clark Roberts) to Chester. My father forced his car up the long deeply trenched path of a road to the old home place and my Grandmother, regardless of her health, would trek through the briars to the old burying ground. The grave of her infant son was unmarked even then, but she knew where the grave was and she always stood for a moment at his grave.

Aunt Marge spent most of her life a prisoner of schizophrenia, but for me she was a most favorite person. This is the eulogy I gave at her memorial service.

#### Margie Lee Roberts, A Eulogy

#### September 15, 1917 - February 20, 2002

On a day like today, it is easy to imagine Margie heading out to work in her yard. She'd be wearing one of her old housedresses and a button up sweater with a scarf tied around her neck. On her hands would be a pair of gloves with the fingers neatly cut out so she could feel the dirt and handle her tools better. She'd be starting one of her yard projects. Today it might be digging a new drainage ditch or maybe burying all the leaves that had fallen in the neighborhood. There was no project that was too big once she decided it needed to be done.

Her ability to make things grow was almost magical. Prunings from her garden quickly turned into rooted plants. Old seed she had saved for years and years in recycled jars sprang to life when she planted them in the ground. She knew every thing that grew in her yard from the smallest piece of candy tuff to the showy flowering almonds and bearded iris. She could tell you where each plant came from and who had given it to her. She knew the genealogy of her flowers and plants as surely as she knew the genealogy of her family.

What better way to honor Margie Roberts than for her friends and family to stand outside together on such a beautiful day?

Thank you for coming today and joining us as we mourn the loss of a truly unique and wonderful woman, Margie Lee Roberts.

Margie was born September 15, 1917 in rural Fairfield County near the Chester County border. In those days people didn't go to the hospital to have babies, so Margie was born with no medical assistance and only her mother's care and experience to deliver her safely into the world. She was born in a house with no electricity and no running water. When she was about three years old, her family moved to Greenville, South Carolina. The move gave her father a better opportunity to make a living for the family, but it also meant that the family got electricity, running water and plumbing.

Margie was the second child of Martha Lee Clark and James Wade Roberts. She had an older brother James Arthur; four younger brothers, the twins Charles Franklin and William Morrison, then Talton Clark and Eugene White; and one younger sister Mary Halsel.

Margie went to Greenville High School. After graduating, she started a career and eventually, she became a successful Interior Decorator whose services were used to furnish some of the most prestigious homes in the county. As a young woman she was active and adventurous. She went to USO dances at the Sears Shelter and enjoyed the Saturday night square dances at River Falls. Frequently, she took her little car on day trips into the mountains and once she even went on a road trip to New Orleans with her cousin Maggie Harris.

I have so many fond memories of my Aunt Marge. When I was a pre-school boy Marge would load me into her Plymouth Coupe and take me to all kinds of places. My first pony ride was in Cleveland Park with Aunt Marge looking on. Sunday afternoons she would take me to the old Greenville Zoo in the upper corner of Cleveland Park. It wasn't much of a zoo - a buffalo, a stinky old lion, some monkeys crammed into a small cage and a family of prairie dogs - but she made it fun for me. As I got older, she taught me to play canasta. We would spend long afternoons playing cards in the living room or in the back yard under a tree. And I remember the evenings when my family would visit at Granny Roberts' house. Aunt Marge would come into the room fresh from the bath with the fragrance of Cashmere Bouquet soap filling the air around her.

But things changed and Margie became ill. I was too young to realize what was happening as Margie withdrew, but her mother, her brothers and her sister were dramatically and personally impacted. They suffered from their inability to protect her from the attack of the demons whose voices would stay in her head for the remainder of her life.

We can only imagine the great battles this remarkable lady fought with the voices

in her head. Those cruel and unrelenting voices dominated most of her adult life. They stole her life when she was a beautiful, intelligent and talented young woman with an unlimited future. As she slipped deeper and deeper into the mire of her disease, sometimes it was difficult to talk with her. Sometimes, in fact, it was difficult even to be with her. But when she did gain some control over the voices, her basic intelligence and love was so apparent that the bad times became trivial in comparison.

Margie wanted to understand life. She knew she was not like other people and she was determined to find a reason for the difference. Sometimes she thought that numbers and their relationship could provide an explanation. Sometimes she believed that her uniqueness was a factor of not being married. She did know that neither the voices in her head nor the lessons her mother taught her were enough to explain the conflicts happening around her.

Margie's biggest challenges came when members of her family, the people she loved most, did things she believed to be wrong. Her love for us would never allow her to reject us but she had difficulty resolving the conflict between the fantasy life in her head with the reality that was happening to her family.

Towards the end of her life she began winning more and more of the battles with her demons. Recently, she told Maddie and me that the voices had started singing sweet music to her and that they sometimes made her feel comfortable. It wasn't a complete victory, the voices continued to haunt her till the end but it gives me comfort knowing that she never became so weak or so discouraged that she allowed them a complete victory.

Now that she is gone the voices that haunted her are gone too but I believe those of us who will remember her will find the silence to be almost unbearable. Our lives will not be the same without her.

Regardless of the mess we made of our individual lives or how far away we wandered, we always knew that when we got it together and came home again, Margie would be there, that she would still love us and that she would have a small package, tightly wrapped in ancient paper and neatly tied with recycled twine or old worn ribbon waiting for us.

Elbert's nickname was 'Dick,' but I can't remember anyone in the family calling him

anything other than Elbert or more likely 'Sir.'

Jessie's mother Agnes' maiden name was Roberts. Her mother was Josephine Roberts and we believe that her grandmother was Nancy Roberts. We have no evidence regarding her father or grandfather. Some researchers believe that Agnes's father was a Beam.

Jessie Marie Wages Roberts' obituary states that she was the daughter of James Caldwell and Agnes Roberts Wages. She was survived by 5 sons: J.E. Roberts, Jr., Gary P. Roberts, Kirk L. Roberts, J. Wade Roberts and E. Halsell Roberts - three daughters Mrs. J.E. Wright, Mrs. McHenry Banks, Mrs. Larry Stevenson. She also was survived by one sister Mrs. Sadie W. Edwards of Inman.

#### The famous Roberts' Watermelon.

(Kirk Roberts shared this story with me.)

Dr. Lewis was a prominent physician in Chester, South Carolina, while visiting in Louisiana, he purchased a watermelon from a street vendor. He was so impressed with the melon that he saved the seeds. Upon his return he shared some of the seed with Carpenter Wages. Carpenter, in turn shared some of the seeds with his brother-in-law John Elbert Roberts.

At the time, John Elbert was growing a variety of melon named "Cuban King." John Elbert already had established a favorable reputation for his ability to grow excellent melons. (John Elbert's maternal grandfather, Elbert "Birdie" Roberts also had been noted for growing melons.)

John Elbert planted the seeds Carpenter had given him and he too was impressed with the quality of the melons produced. He set aside the biggest melons as seed melons for the following year's crop. In time these became the only melons he grew. He continued the practice of selecting the biggest melons as seed melons and continued to improve the crop.

The typical Roberts' watermelon weights between 25-30 pounds. It has a rind that is light green, almost a washed out lime color, with a few slightly darker irregular green strips. The melon has a thin rind that is easily scared. The thin rind also is easily split and cannot support melons stacked on top of each other for transport. This limits the marketability of the melon to nearby markets. The thin rind also cannot support the extra weight of the melons and larger ones are usually misshapen. The melon has an extra large heart area. Its flesh is a pale red it has a large amount of juice but it is not as sweet as other varieties.

We city Roberts always planned a trip to Chester when the melons were ripe. We planned the haul to be certain that all the City relatives could have a Roberts' melon. I remember once when I was still a boy, but old enough to have a driver's license, I went to Chester with my father and Uncle Rob(James Arthur Roberts). While we loaded the station wagon with melons and corn, my dad, Uncle Rob and Elbert concentrated on consuming vodka. After supper, I was the only one sober enough to drive back to Greenville. My father and Uncle Rob quickly passed out in the back seat and I started home on highway 9 with a station wagon so overloaded that the front tires didn't have enough contact with the road to allow me to steer the car properly.

I was terrified and there was no help from my dad or uncle. So I stopped on the side of the road and as the 18-wheelers whizzed by I opened the back to the wagon and threw watermelons into the ditch. Not everyone got a melon that year, but I got us home safely.

#### **One Summer with Elbert and Jessie**

There are many tales about Elbert and Jessie Wages Roberts. Everyone who knew them is eager to share a warm memory of them.

My memory involves a week I spent with them and their son Troy. I was between 12 and 14 years old and it was in late summer because the bitter weed was in bloom and the milk cows had eaten it, causing their milk to taste awful. We drank it anyway. My visit occurred when the family still lived in the 'old house.' There was electricity in the house but it was the old style cord wrapped double wire system that could support only a few light bulbs that dangled from the ceiling. Jessie still cooked on her famous wood stove and there was no plumbing so water was drawn from the old hand dug well. The bathroom facility was an outhouse down a path behind the front barn.

I now think my visit was a scheme devised by my father and Uncle Elbert after they had drank too many bottles of Vodka. My father was always convinced that I had too much 'book learning' and not enough 'common sense' to make it in the world. He was always trying to give me survival skills for the cruelties and inequities he had seen during his life. I can almost picture him and Elbert determining that real life experiences on the farm and under the supervision of Elbert and Jessie would help me. They were right.

I remember many things about that visit but most of all I remember Aunt Jessie. She was a stern woman, who somehow always made you feel loved and protected. You could trust her. Jessie was the taskmaster for my week of farm education. She got me up early and sent me out to help Troy with his chores. She also gave me a chore of my own. It became my job to churn the soured cream into country butter. They had two types of churn. The traditional wooden churn and old crank churn. I became convinced that both were devices created, not so much to make butter as to torture visiting city boys. The memories of continuously and endlessly churning are stronger than the memories of actually making butter.

For a young boy from the city Uncle Elbert was an awesome and scary character. He gave orders and demanded immediate obedience. He refused to tolerate a disrespectful child. Everyone called him 'sir' and no one sassed Elbert. Elbert was attentive to me during that week. He asked me lots of questions and we talked about all kinds of things. He would take me with him on some of his chores and show me how things were done on a farm. I respected Elbert and learned from him, but I knew you could be his friend only after he deemed you to be an adult.

#### **ROBERTS' HASH**

No account of this family would be complete without a discussion of Hash.

I am not certain which of our ancestors first produced the meat delicacy known as Roberts Hash, but it was Uncle Elbert (John Elbert Roberts, Sr.) who made hash an integral part of our family's history. As the story goes the hash was initially a dish to feed the family. It was usually made from venison and initially it was a way to make the tough gamey meat edible and to keep it usable longer. However during the early history of his marriage Elbert found that people enjoyed the unique taste of the hash and were willing to pay for it. In the fall of the year Elbert would cook batches of hash, seal it in bottles and take it to waiting customer over the county. The money generated by the sell of Roberts Hash bought the family some of the necessities it would otherwise not have hadied

By the time I came along Roberts Hash was no longer used to generate cash, but it had become a stable at reunions and family gatherings. Once when I was a very young boy, my father took me with him to a family gathering in Chester. My father claimed that we went early so he could help make the hash, but in reality he just wanted some extra time to visit with Elbert and sip a little vodka with his friends. By this time Elbert was older and had turned the making of hash over to his sons, Kirk and Pres. Elbert however had not relinquished his supervisory responsibilities and it was Elbert whose tastes determined if the mixture needed more salt or pepper and it was only Elbert who could declare the dish acceptable and ready to serve.

The hash was made in a large iron pot. Kirk Roberts, who was relieved by Pres Roberts, tended it. The cook's main duty was to continuously stir the mixture with an old boat oar to keep it from sticking on the bottom of the pot. The old boat oar was stored from year to year for this exclusive use. The preparation process required frequent sampling. To sample the hash the oar would serve as a spoon. Some of the hot hash would be lifted out of the pot and held on the oar to cool then the oar would be passed among all the men. This group of 'helpers' nodded their approval, but they rarely commented on the taste of the Hash. That was Elbert's job and no one dared to take it from him.

At family gatherings many of the city Roberts' would make a big deal about refusing to eat deer meat. So before it was served, the hash was divided into two batches one was claimed to be venison and one beef. Those city folks are easy to fool.

#### The Recipe

Take a quantity of meat (originally it was venison, but most frequently today it is a chuck roast. When I make hash, I use a combination of Beef, Pork and Chicken)
Place the meat in a pan and cover with water
Add one medium sized onion for every three-pound of meat.
Add salt and pepper. Bring the mixture to a boil and cook until the meat is tender.
Remove the cooked meat from heat.
When it is cool remove the fat, bones and grizzles (reserve the water in which the meat was cooked)
Place the meat through a grinder or chop it with a food processor.
Grind or process more onions with the meat.
Return the chopped meat and onions to the pot and continue cooking.
Add salt and pepper if needed.
Prior to serving add one stick of butter (not margarine) for each three pounds of meat.

#### **Troy Roberts' Death**

It was raining Saturday night April 12, 1959. Troy Roberts was driving and Thomas Killough (Sonny) Ford was his passenger. They were on the Old York Highway near Lowrey's Community Center around 11:00 PM. Troy was being pursued by police and driving fast. He lost control of the car and ran it off the road. It flipped over and came to rest on the shoulder of the road. Both boys were thrown from the car. Sonny was killed instantly and Troy died soon after at the Chester Hospital. City policemen L. Tyre Lee and Robert D. McKay and County Officer Arthur Doster were on the scene immediately. Coroner George H. Moore empanelled a jury and held an inquest into the accident.

When word reached Greenville that my cousin Troy had been fatally injured in an automobile accident, my father immediately called me and told me to get ready to go the Chester. I was usually the driver on our Chester trips but this time my father drove. Usually when he was sober, my father was quite and pensive, but on this trip he was sober, agitated and nervous. He kept asking me for the definition of fatal injury, desperately searching for a sliver of hope that somehow Troy might have survived the accident.

The happy home Elbert and Jessie made was not so happy that day. There was nothing a young boy could do to ease the family's grief, so I wondered the farm remembering the times I had spent with Troy while my father tried to comfort his relatives and friends.

A few days later, we returned to Chester for the funeral. It was held at the Beaver Creek Baptist Church. I sat in a pew built by one of my relatives, Granny Roberts' Grandfather John Clark, and only half listened to a preacher I didn't know. I remember standing by Troy's grave reciting the Lord's Prayer with the mourners and for the first time in my life feeling alone and out of place in Chester

#### The MURDER OF MARION DOUGLAS ROBERTS

Two bullets were fired from a .38 caliber gun into the trucks left door. One bullet crashed through MD's chest and the other hit is leg. Sheriff Powers came on the scene shortly after the shooting.

#### Stories about my Dad

My dad, Talton Clark Roberts, quit high school before graduating and undertook an obligation to help his family meet their expenses. While it cannot be proven, I am convinced that equally important to him was a desire to gain some financial independence, which was a goal that would be important all his life.

Although he dropped out of school, he firmly believed in learning. Even after becoming a successful and respected manager of a welding equipment supply company; he continued to carry a dictionary and to check his spelling on each report he sent to his home office. He was convinced that poor spelling revealed either stupidity; an inability to learn, or ignorance; an unwillingness to learn. My dad was neither. He was eager and willing to learn anything that might help him.

He also believed that he had a responsibility to teach his children what he had learned. He wanted us to have an advantage in life and to ease our transition into the harsh world of adult responsibility, so he taught us about the kinds of people who would cheat you and the ones who would support you. He also taught us the value of telling the

truth and protecting your reputation, of keeping a good credit record and being a responsible citizen. He also gave us valuable lessons about charity and caring about people and most importantly he taught us to be tolerant of our friends' flaws.

When I announced my intention to attend the University of South Carolina, He was not very enthusiastic. To his way of thinking, getting a job and learning to be a man was a much more worthwhile goal for me than getting university 'book learning.' He believed a high school education was vitally important. High school taught the basic skills you needed to prosper in the real world. Higher education however, was another matter. In his experience a college education only filled your mind with useless information and in the process forced you to forget to use of common sense.

To affirm his opposition to my attending the University, he refused to buy me a meal ticket. He felt it was too expensive and wasteful. He stated an expectation that I could be frugal enough to get by on \$12.00 a week. If I had more, he believed, I would spend it foolishly. I have to reluctantly admit that there is a possibility he might have been right about my spending money foolishly, however no amount of frugality could make a meager \$12.00 a week cover food, entertainment and personal grooming needs. I remember getting frequent letters from my Grandmother with \$10.00 or even \$20.00 enclosed. Getting those letters was a highlight for me and more than once the letter came when I was flat broke. It was only after both my Grandmother and my dad died that I discovered my father had given money to my Grandmother and asked her to send it to me. He didn't want me to know he was an old softy after all.

During my first year at USC, three students committed suicide. The third of these unfortunate students had lived in my dorm. About a week after his death, as I was leaving my dorm, I noticed a Chevrolet station wagon parked in the far corner of the dorm parking lot. The car caught my attention because it was the same ugly green color as the one my father drove. I walked down towards the car and recognized my dad calmly sitting behind the wheel of the vehicle. I got into the car and asked him what he was doing in Columbia. He just shrugged his shoulders and asked me if I had time to ride around with him. It was only a slight stretch of the truth to say that I had plenty of time. I was due at a Chemistry class but it was too late in the semester for me to pull a decent grade in the class so missing it wouldn't really hurt.

As we pulled out of the drive, my dad asked if I knew the young man who had recently died in my dormitory. I told him no and then he wanted to see the buildings from which the other two students had jumped. He had been drinking enough to loosen his inhibitions, so after the inspection we just chatted as he drove us around Columbia. Later we went to a local cafeteria for lunch before he drove back to my dorm. As he prepared to leave he warned me about letting things bother me too much and he affirmed that I could call him if anything ever really upset me. He gave me some extra money as he left. The old softy had made the trip to Columbia just to confirm that I was safe and not in any danger of hurting myself.

My dad also taught me an extremely important lesson about accepting personal responsibility for your actions. I have always tried to live by his lesson. One evening when he was driving home tired and sleepy and under the influence of too much alcohol he clipped three mail boxes with the side mirror on his car. The following afternoon, he

told me to drive for him. As we rode by each of the mailboxes I stopped and he placed an envelope containing a twenty-dollar bill in each of the damaged mailboxes. He had written a note with his name and phone number on each envelope. He told me that the box owners shouldn't have to pay for damages he caused. At that time a replacement mailbox cost less than \$5.00.

Everyone loved my dad when he was sober and most people liked him when he was drinking moderately. That was when he was gregarious and fun to be around. His terrible weakness for alcohol however, made him inconsiderate and difficult when he was drinking heavily.

His love for booze would kill him before I became mature enough to understand the life he lived or appreciate all of the lessons he taught me. What a tragedy!

### A Eulogy for my Mother, Mary Alice Jones Roberts Crow.

# MARY ROBERTS CROW

#### May 14, 1925 – December 10, 2007

Thank you for joining us today as we remember the remarkable life of Mary Alice Crow. She was, like all of us, a mixture of strengths and flaws. As we remember her accomplishments, it is with love and respect that I also remember some of the difficulties she lived through.

Her birth name was Mary Alice Jones but somewhere in her early years, she picked up the nickname "Mutt." Many people might have been offended by such a nickname, but the name never seemed bother her. She knew that the people who used it did so with affection. There are many relatives, including her sister, Leona, and close friends who will always remember my mother as "Mutt."

She was born in Taylors, South Carolina, as the second child of Roy Clyde and Etta Skinner Jones. Her mother was an emotionally fragile but gentle and kind woman. Her father, however, was a deeply and tragically flawed man. During her infancy and early years my mother; her sister, Leona Doris; and their mother moved in with her Grandparents George and Carrie Howell Skinner and their sons William and Don. She claimed that she felt affection and security while living with her grandparents. It was a feeling she did not have after her parents reconciled.

When most children her age were talking, my mother did not or could not speak. Her family became concerned that she might be a slow learner or have a serious learning problem. Later, when she did start speaking, forming words did not come easy for her and all of her life she had difficulty articulating and pronouncing certain words. She overcame this problem by becoming a reader and she instilled the love of reading in her children. In a time when fewer and fewer people read for pleasure that is an awesome accomplishment.

In her mid-teen years, she met, Talton Roberts. After a short courtship, he rescued her and they were married in 1941. He was nineteen years old and ill prepared to financially or emotionally support a seventeen year old girl who did not understand the complex world she was entering and there early years were a struggle.

My Dad came from a large family that welcomed my mother. She eagerly joined the Roberts family and developed friendship with all my dad's siblings. It was my paternal grandmother, however, with whom, she developed a unique relationship. She always referred to her as Mother Roberts. She frequently said she loved her Mother Roberts as much as she loved her own mother.

My parents had a troubled marriage. I believe they loved each other, but my mother carried too much emotional baggage into their marriage and my father had difficulty dealing with wounded personality. They never found it easy to show their affection for each other. My father sought relief by drinking too much. It would be a tragic decision. His alcoholism did not help him deal with his relationship but it did take his life when he was way too young.

In her later years, my mother met and married David Winfield Crow. Their relationship would define her later life and I am so thankful that they found each other. The two of them were able to express their affection for each other and my mother eagerly told everyone who would listen how much she loved Dave. The two of them had some precious years when they traveled extensively. They went to car races and spent time at the beach and the mountains. Their relationship was mutually beneficial. Dave appreciated having someone to take care of him and my mother flourished giving him that care.

As a younger woman, my mother was remarkably beautiful and all of her adult life her appearance was vitally important to her. She refused to leave her home, even on a quick errand, until she was convinced that she looked as good as she could. Although, she was rarely able to buy the kind of expensive clothes she loved, she always bought high-end elegant and stylish clothes, which were always immaculately altered and meticulously cared for. Her hair was always professionally styled and she maintained her fingernails in freshly manicured condition. It wasn't just her personal appearance; she also kept her house 'white glove clean.' You would never find dust bunnies hiding in the corners of her closets or lurking under the beds in her house.

As her health declined it was these things she held most firmly and fought to maintain. When she could not longer take herself to doctor appointments, T.C. or I would take her. When it was my turn, I would arrive at her house to find her waiting with her makeup perfectly applied, her hair neatly styled and wearing a stylish suit with a fresh blouse. By the time we returned, she had spent all of her energy and it was a struggle for her to get out of her 'visiting clothes' and into her elegant 'lounging clothes.' She would be completely exhausted for the remainder of the day, but for her, that utter exhaustion was better than allowing her doctor see her any other way.

One of the saddest days of her later years was when she finally had to accept that she could no longer keep her regular weekly appointment to have her hair styled by her niece, Doris Leigh.

I loved my mother and love her still. Not with a saccharine, sentimental love, but with a love that is strong enough to exist in spite of her flaws. Some of our more mature relatives call that loving someone – warts and all.

Although, my mother was a caring woman, she had strong opinions and frequently she shared her opinions with little regard for the impact they might have on other people.

The world never lived up to her expectations and she maintained a vision for how all of us should live our lives. She was always ready to let us know when our hair was too long or we were putting on too many pounds or when we didn't complete a task to her standards. Yet, we always knew that if we ever needed her help or support, she could allow herself to ignore our shortcoming long enough to help and support us through whatever crisis we had gotten ourselves into.

One of the great tragedies of her life is that she was denied the quiet and quick death she wanted. Instead she had a long period of declining health and physical weakness. Her family owes a great debt to Angeline Pickett who did so much more than take care of our mother. She stayed with her during that difficult period when her memory was fleeting and her anger at her declining health was at its greatest. May we all be blessed enough to have a friend like Angeline. We also owe a debt to the people at Open Arms Hospice and the McCall Hospice House. They gave her loving care during her last days and her family is grateful for all they did.

Towards the end of her life, our mother gave some specific instructions to my wife, Madeline. She was afraid that she might not have enough time to tell a long list of people that she loved them. She made Madeline promise to let anyone she missed telling personally know that she loved them. I'm proud that my mother made this sincere effort to let people know how she truly felt and that before she left us, she attempted to mend any hurt feelings she might have created.

There is a time when all of us need the affection and security of our parents. My mother felt she missed out on that time in her life, but she still had the strength to give affection and security to her children. We always knew she loved us even when we got our church clothes dirty or we skinned the knee of our new pair of pants or when our school grades didn't come up to her expectations.

There are many ways to measure my mother's life. If we measure her monetary wealth, she would come up short. But if we measure her accomplishments and the obstacles she overcame she was a wealthy woman.

It is here that my brother, sister and I acknowledge the debt we owe our mother. She gave each of us a deep knowledge of rightness and a moral code that allowed us to experience the world with all its beauty and its tragedy and to embrace the wonderful diversity it offers.

There is a phrase from the musical Les Miserable. It is significant to me and I want to share it with you.

"And remember, the truth that once was spoken.

To love another person is to see the face of God."

It may not be literally true, but I think there may be enough truth in those words to help us in the years to come when we will live without her physical presence.

When I think of Jonathon I remember both the cute chubby little boy constantly seeking our acceptance as well as the vigorous young man seeking his own unique identity that he became.

Jonathon enjoyed joking and kidding around. He also enjoyed competing with his family and friends. Just to set the record straight even as a young boy he could shoot a pistol more accurately than I could and he ran circles around me when we raced radio controlled cars.

Sometimes Jonathon's joking and kidding could be too harsh and sometimes his competitiveness could be too intense, but we always knew that beneath the bluster and bravado was a kind and caring young man. We felt comfortable around Jonathan, because in his too short life he learned to accept, respect and even love each of us in spite of our own flaws and shortcomings.

When someone is taken from us too soon, we carry that person with us into our future. When you leave this place know that from time to time you will think of Jonathan. When good things happen, you will feel a touch of sadness that he is not here to share your joy. And when tragedy strikes you will think of him and feel relief that he will not have to experience your pain.

He was not with us long enough. There was so much more he needed to learn and so many more life experiences he needed to understand. But he was here long enough to know the ecstasy of love and to be hurt by love; and he was here long enough to become a companion and support for his mother; and he was here long enough to become his father's friend; and he was here long enough so that all of us who knew and loved him will never forget him.

The land was noted to be part of the land originally granted to Nicholas Roberts 3 April 1786. The deed was recorded 2 November 1835.

Fairfield County Deed Book MM Page 20 records that Nicholas Roberts sold his son John Roberts a tract of land containing 52 ½ acres for \$105.00. The deed was recorded 2 November 1835. It is rare that a deed specifies the relationship of the parties as clearly as this one does.

In 1830, Benjamin Malone and John Roberts, heirs of Thomas Malone, relinquished their rights and interest to Robert Malone.

One day I plan to go back to the Fairfield County Court House to see if I can find a renunciation of Dower which might give use the name of John's wife.

#### THE BERRY ROBERTS MYSTERY

Berry Roberts (may have been Greenberry) was clearly in Fairfield County in 1850. He is listed on the census with his spouse Mary and their children. Most researchers believe that this Berry is the son of John Roberts and the Grandson of Elder Nicholas Roberts. I accept this, but there is a big gap between Berry's birth in 1800 and the other children of John Roberts. This may indicate that John was married twice. To date I have been

unsuccessful in uncovering information about Berry and his family.

There is another Berry Roberts in the area. Some family lore states that this Berry was the son of Lewis Roberts. This Berry married Sallie Lyles and moved from the area between 1840 and 1850. Eventually he and his family ended in Kemper County Mississippi. This is the same county where John L. Roberts lived before his slaves murdered him. Berry is rumored to have moved with a cousin named David Roberts who married Sallie Lyle's sister. I have not found this David in the records yet. The David Roberts listed on the 1850 Census obviously didn't go the Mississippi with Berry and Sallie.

The following are a few examples of Nicholas in the public records. Elihugh Wages and wife Sarah Wages sold 15 acres to Walter, Thomas and Richard Cabean on September 18, 1855 witnessed by John Brice and Nicholas Roberts.

Nicholas Roberts, Jr. sold to the same Cabean Brothers 37 acres for \$462.50 on September 11, 1854. Witnesses by John Brice and Elizabeth Wages, Dower signed by Mary Roberts.

From a deed recorded in 1855, we learn that Nicholas Roberts (Jr) sold to Walter, Thomas and Richard Cabean for the sum of \$537.50 that tract of land where he now lives, containing 64 Acres, being the tract purchased of William Tollison and his Wife Martha; Nancy Rodgers; John Roberts; William Wages and his Wife; Elihue Wages and his Wife; they being five of the heirs at law of the said Nicholas Roberts, Senr, late of Fairfield District in the Real Estate of the said Nicholas Roberts deceased. Said lands lying on Pannels Branch of Little River, waters of Broad River, bounding lands of Benjamin Roberts, Henry Castles, Richard Dove and the said Nicholas Roberts. Signed the 11th of September, 1855 by Nicholas Roberts.

Witnessed by John Brice and Elighugh Wages

Recorded in Book UU, Page 570

Sworn to before Daniel Kirkland, Magistrate by John Brice on February 5, 1856 (Note: Nancy Rodgers is the daughter of Mary Roberts, the widow of the Elder Nicholas Roberts. William Tollison is William Madison Tollison, who married Martha Halsey (Halsell), Mary Rogers Roberts daughter. John Roberts is the Elder Nicholas Roberts son. I believe William Wages married an unknown daughter of Elder Nicholas Roberts. Elihue Wages is John Elihugh Wages who married Sarah Roberts, a daughter of Nicholas Roberts.)

### **Moving to Arkansas**

Our Cousin, Ken Roberts, related this story about Nicholas. Nicholas' sons Reuben Roberts, Samuel Roberts and Nicholas J. Roberts and his son-in-law Bill Miller served in the Confederate Army during the Civil War. All were wounded except Nicholas J., but all survived the war. Shortly after the war, the family decided to relocate to Arkansas. Nicholas and his wife Mary with their children and Grandchildren reportedly assembled 11 covered wagons and loaded them for the journey. Somewhere along the way, Nicholas, the father, became ill. The entire group abandoned the trip and turned back to South Carolina to care for Nicholas. Nicholas died after they returned to South Carolina. Two years later the family group left again for Arkansas. This time they made the trip and all became residents of Arkansas. Reportedly they worked hard and succeeded in farming and retailing.

Nicholas J. Roberts served in the 5<sup>th</sup> Regiment, Company G of the South Carolina Volunteer Infantry of the Army of Northern Virginia. He obtained the rank of Third Corporal. Toward the end of the war, the 5<sup>th</sup> Regiment, Company G was near all the major battles but they were only engaged in small skirmishes. They suffered few casualties. Nicholas J was present at Appomattox when Robert E. Lee surrendered the Army of Northern Virginia to General Grant.

Reuben F. Roberts and Samuel Roberts served in the 17<sup>th</sup> Infantry, company F. During the battles of Groveton and Manassas (2<sup>nd</sup> Manassas or Bull Run) on August 29 and 30, 1862, Reuben was wounded in the breast and Samuel was wounded in the shoulder. Both wound were considered serious but slight. They too were at Appomattox.

We know that in his will Nicholas did not leave anything directly to his children until the death of his wife. We have to assume that he gave them land prior to his death.

While we can reasonably surmise that Sarah was Nicholas' daughter. We are stuck however with many questions about her spouse.

I believe that Elihugh Wages may have been John Elihugh Wages or Elihugh John Wages. I also believe that this Sarah and her husband had at least one child who they named Elihugh and that this Elihugh also married a lady named Sarah.

The son, Elihugh served in the 6<sup>th</sup> South Carolina Reserves, Company A during the Civil War.

On the 1880 census for Chester County. Elihu is living in Blackstock Community. He is a widower with three daughters, Sarah(38), Nancy(25) and Martha(23) and one son. Elihu(21) living with him.

Members of the Roberts and Wages(Wagers) family intermarried many times, however, it is difficult to tie the Wages(Wagers) individuals to each other. So far I cannot find any additional information on this John Elihugh Wages. There is an Elihugh Wages who died in the early 1900's and is buried in Bethlehem Methodist Church. I believe this Elihugh to be a son, grandson or other relative of Elihugh Wages. The name Elihugh carries forward as a middle name for many of our relatives.

The first mystery is Lewis's middle name. I cannot find any source data for the initials E.P. It is possible that his middle name was Edward or a similar name that could have been written or misread as E.P. It is equally possible that he had two middle names. At least one researcher believes that his name was Lewis Edward Dekalb. Lewis's brother William named his son Lewis Edward Dekalb Roberts. Some people think he named him after his brother. The name Lewis is frequently spelled Louis. It is hard to know the preferred spelling since many of our ancestors were not well educated and the few records that exist, were written by census takers or other government workers who used their preferred spelling not necessarily our ancestors preferred spelling.

Lewis and Rhoda are rumored to have had three additional children. If this is true I do not know their names yet. The two children I do know about left Fairfield County and relocated to Mississippi.

In August 1822, Lewis' will was probated. John Crosby, William Davis and William Halsey sign the administration bond. Elisha Mayfield, Edward Halsey, Rick Elam, Martin Elam and William Davis appraised his estate.

Our cousin, Rev. William Roberts, reports that Lewis's wife, Rhoda Dove, was the daughter of Benjamin Dove, Jr. and the granddaughter of Benjamin Dove, Sr., who was renowned as an Indian fighter during the Cherokee uprisings. She was also the granddaughter of Dennis and Hannah Crosby, early pioneers on the Broad River in Chester County, South Carolina.

Today we would struggle to take a road trip from South Carolina to Mississippi in an automobile with 12 children. Benjamin and Mary made it in a horse or mule drawn wagon.

## The Descendents of Elbert "Birdie" Roberts

This side of the family has been an enigma to me. There are many researchers looking into this family's history, but we still don't know a lot about them and I know no stories to personalize them. I got my initial information about this family from Aunt Lula, (Lula Roberts Allen), the daughter of Catherine Sarah Roberts and the granddaughter of Elbert 'Birdie Roberts. However, when I was talking with Aunt Lula my main interest was in the history of Wade Oscar Roberts and his family, so we didn't talk about this side of our family much.

The most striking difference in these two families is literacy. Getting an education in post civil war South Carolina was a challenge. When economic survival is your primary goal, reading and writing are secondary. Yet somehow, the family of Wade Oscar and Catherine Sarah Roberts at least learned to read and write while the "Birdie" Roberts children didn't. We do know schooling was available and we have records from schools in the Armenia Section of the county, but it would be the grand children of Elbert and Mary Ann who would attend these schools.

Elbert and his family lived in the Baton Rouge Community of Chester County - not that far from the family started by Nicholas Roberts, but there were few roads connecting the two sections. I do not have any information on Elbert's parents. However, on the census Elbert reported that his parents were born in South Carolina. Elbert's son John was born in Union County so it is possible that the family was originally from that area, but there is no data to support this assumption.

Elbert did have at least one brother, Moses. Moses lived in the Baton Rouge community too. While I am not following Moses' family in his history, I do want to list some information about him. Moses was born in 1825 and he died on April 1, 1896. He married a lady named Sarah. (I do not know where Moses and Sarah are buried) Their children were: Obediah Roberts (Both Elbert and Moses named a son Obediah. This Obediah was born January 13, 1854, died July 16, 1896. He married Emily Grant); Alice Roberts (born 1856); John Moses Roberts (born 1859); Winnie Love Roberts (born January 18, 1861, died February 18, 1907. She married Jesse Simpson Clark.)

Elbert served as a private in the state troops CSA as a member of the South Carolina Confederate Reserves, 6th Regiment, Company B. He enlisted on November 18, 1862 and served from December 31, 1862 to February 16, 1863. He also served in the 5th Regiment Company A. Elbert enlisted August 1, 1863 in Chester. He was enlisted by John Hardin for a period of 6 months but he only served from August 1 - November 11, 1863.

Elbert and his brother Moses were both in the 5<sup>th</sup> Regiment (State Troops) Company A. There was also an Isaac Roberts in the same regiment. Elbert and Isaac were also in the South Carolina Confederate Reserves, 6th Regiment, Company B together. Then Isaac served with Moses in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion Reserve troops. I believe this Isaac was related

and possibly a brother, but I cannot prove the relationship.

On the 1840 Census of Chester County there is a Moses Roberts. In his household are a male under 5 years old and a male for 20-30. Females in this household are on under 5 and one from 20-30. This would put Moses birth date between 1820 -1830.

We do have some information about the family of Mary Ann Long Roberts. Her parents were William Long and Sarah Estes Long. We do not have any additional information on William yet but the father of Sarah Estes was Erasmus Estes. We cannot prove the identity of Erasmus's wife, but we can trace Erasmus's ancestors back to Nicholas Estes who was born in 1495 in England.

From the 1850 Census of Chester County:

This is "Birdie" Elbert Roberts and Mary Ann Long Roberts, the parents of Catherine Sarah Roberts. We do know that the mother of Mary Ann Long was Sarah Estes Long, so I assume that Sarah Long is Mary Ann's mother. I have to also assume that William Long has died before 1850. I assume that Erasmus Estes is Sarah Estes Long's father and Mary Ann Long's grandfather. I have not yet uncovered any information regarding William Long. Erasmus Estes was the son of Thomas Estes and Hannah Allen. Thomas and Hannah moved their family from Spotsylvania, Virginia to Chester, South Carolina around 1785. I believe some of the children of Thomas and Hannah Estes were the first owners or occupants of a piece of property referred to as "The Old Clark Place" near the Chester/Fairfield border. My Grandparents lived on this property when they were first married. This land is still in our family's possession.

On the 1860 Census for Chester County Elbert is listed as being 25 years old and a farmer. He listed his real estate's value as \$410.00 and he valued his personal property at \$100. He reported that he could not read or write.

I cannot identify the Addie listed as a Grand Daughter. If the age listed for her is correct; she was born about 1868. Some researchers believe this indicates that Elbert was married prior to marrying Mary Ann Long. I doubt this theory, but I don't have a better one to replace it other than a census error or that she was a close relative who Elbert called a grand daughter.

Elbert did receive a pension for his service in the Civil War. He is listed as an invalid on the pension reports.

Elbert did leave a will. His will list Mary Anne Roberts as his wife and Obe as his son. Obe was executor. The will was signed with a (X) mark on 10 January 1911 in the presence of Walter Simpson, J.H. Lee and F.H. Dodds. Mary Ann Long Roberts also left a will with Obe as the executor.

In September 1916, Laura Roberts Quinton sued her brother Obediah Roberts claiming that he converted the cash from their parents' estate to his own use. The total amount of money estimated to have been involved in the estate was less than \$2,000.00. In those days, just as today, families fought over trivial matters.

As a boy, in all of the time I visited in Chester and Fairfield I never met any of my relatives from this side of the family. In fact, with the exception of a couple of people I communicate with over the internet, I still know no one from this side of our family. I remember "The other Roberts" being mentioned occasionally, but there seems to have been little interaction between the two families. I still wonder why?

Gary Preston and Dellia Booulware Roberts built a replica of this house on the original site.

# THEY FIT SOMEWHERE

There were other Roberts families in Chester and Fairfield counties between 1700 and the great migration from the area that occurred prior to the Civil War. There is little doubt that many, if not most, of these families are related to ours, but so far no one has found the connection.

Many of these families are mentioned in the Appendix to this history; however there are some families that need special mention:

# **Descendants of Berry Roberts and Sallie Lyles Roberts**

We don't know where Berry and Sallie Lyles Roberts fit into our ancestry, but there is little doubt that they are our relatives.

Meredith M. Roberts served in Jeff Davis Legion Co. 'C'. Meredith Meadows Roberts was born in Chester, South Carolina, December 14,1824. His family moved to Mississippi in the 1840's and were living in Kemper County at the time of his enlistment into the Confederate Army. He enlisted August 17, 1861 at Iuka, Mississippi. He spent most of his time during the war in Maryland and Virginia and ended the war in South Carolina. Most of his time in service was spent working with the horses in some capacity, foraging, working or treating the ones no longer able to be used. After the war he stayed in South Carolina. He met his first wife and settled in Pickens County, South Carolina. After her death he married again and later moved to Dalton. Georgia where he lived until his death December 31, 1902.

Meredith's daughter Sarah was my grandmother. Sally and her husband John BORN Stephens had 2 daughters and then waited a while and started over. I'm butting my head against the wall on Berry's father. It might be Lewis Roberts from Chester, South Carolina but nothing has been proved.

# **Miscellaneous Information**

# **EARLY ROBERTS**

Many of the earliest settlers to our state were named Roberts.

In 1670 Edward Roberts arrived in Charleston from Barbados

John Roberts came on May 13, 1697.

Thomas Roberts came from Scotland before 1682. This Thomas was a part owner of Lord Cordross' ship *Steven*.

Other very early Roberts's settlers came to this country as indentured servants. These were poverty-stricken people who wanted the opportunities that this country offered so badly that they agreed to perform servant labor for anyone who would pay their passage. (During this period, land in South Carolina rented for one half penny per acre for five years.) This was a strong incentive to the poor of England who could never hope for such an opportunity. In 1730 the state offered to rent 50 acres free for 10 years to anyone immigrating who would farm the land. This was part of the state's program to lure more Protestants to the state.

Edward Roberts arrived in August 6, 1722 with an indenture to work for 5 years.

Another Edward Roberts arrived on November 1, 1725 indentured for 5 years.

John Roberts came on May 5, 1721 agreeing to work for a period of 5 years.

Some early Roberts' also arrived on 'prison boats.' These settlers were people who had violated some law and were either sentenced to be transported to the Colonies or they were convicted criminals who received a pardon on the condition that they would leave the England and immigrate to the colonies.

Charles Roberts was pardoned for his crime and arrived in America in December 1683. Another Charles Roberts was sentenced to emigrate and arrived in December 1771. John Roberts stole some clothing at St Giles Cripplegate in 1768. For this crime he was sentenced to come to America.

William Roberts was found guilty of an undisclosed crime and sentenced to be transported to this country in September 1731.

Another William Roberts was sentenced to America in February 1733.

Page 161

Yet another William was sent away from England in December 1734.

Not all of the prisoners were men.

Elinor Roberts (Robards) was granted a pardon on the condition that she leave England. She went first to Barbados, and then she came to South Carolina.

In September 1731, Elizabeth Roberts was sentenced to a life in the colonies. She arrived in September 1731.

In November 1753 Eleanor Roberts was convicted of a crime. She arrived in December 1753.

# **BLACK BART ROBERTS**

The most successful pirate of all times called himself Black Bart. During his short career as a pirate he captured or sunk more than 400 ships and collected over 50 million pounds of loot. He was widely known and feared for his ruthlessness and boldness as well as his handsome appearance and elegant clothes.

He was born John Roberts in Wales about 1682. He took to the sea as a young man and was third mate on the British slave ship *Princess* when it was captured in June 1719 by Howell Davis, a noted pirate of the time. Roberts joined Davis' crew and adopted the name Bartholomew Roberts. A month and a half later, Davis was killed in an ambush during an attack on Principe off the Guinea coast and Roberts became captain of the ship. His first act as a pirate captain was to level the town of Principe in retribution. Soon after, he boldly sailed into port in Brazil and captured a Portuguese ship at anchor. He left with over 80,000 pounds of gold coins before the warships assigned to guard the ship could catch him.

By 1720 he had captured over 100 ships. That was the year he became a major plague to slave shippers. Black Bart gained great profit from selling some of the slaves he captured, but some of them he allowed to join his crew.

The terrible reign of Black Bart Roberts ended on February 10, 1722, when Challoner Ogle the Captain of the warship *HMS Swallow* caught up with Black Bart's fleet. During the battle that followed, Roberts was hit by grape shoot in the throat and killed. His crew threw him overboard so his body could not be captured. The crew was taken ashore in West Africa where the largest pirate trial in history was conducted. On March 28, 1722, fifty-four crewmembers were hanged, 37 were imprisoned, and 70 black crewmembers were sold into slavery.

# EARLY ROBERTS IN CHESTER AND FAIRFIELD AREAS

There were many Roberts who lived in both Chester and Fairfield counties in the early formative years of this area of South Carolina. I cannot connect each of them to our relatives, but in all probability they were all related.

A William Roberts had a 200-acre land grant laid out for him on the Sandy River in 7/11/1769. William Roberts also had a 50-acre grant on the Sandy River on 7/12/1771 and a 200-acre grant on 11/23/1775. Archibald Roberts had 300 Acres on the Sandy River in 10/16/1784. One of the earliest Roberts court records in Chester County was a **William Roberts** who on June 5 1777 served as an appraiser for the estate of **Edward** Nix. We know little else about this William.

There are many other early Roberts who pepper the early records. In the early 1700's, Shadrack Roberts and his family on a journey from North Carolina to Georgia, spent time in Chester where at least one of there children, David Roberts, was born. Shadrack died in Georgia but his family kept moving and eventually ended up in Alabama.

Two early Roberts in Union County were Walter and Thomas. They were Quakers who came from Pennsylvania. Both received large land grants, which were sold off as their descendants moved out to other areas.

In Laurens County Oba (I assume that is short for Obediah) Roberts(1769-1827) and Margaret Ewing(1776-1859) had the following children: Unity Roberts, Telpe C. Roberts, Jane Roberts, John Ewing Roberts, Franklin F. Roberts and Oran Milo Roberts(1815-1898).

While I have not researched this family and know nothing of their other children, their son Oran Milo Roberts migrated to Alabama where he graduated from the University of Alabama and married Frances Wycliff Edwards. The couple then migrated to Texas where Oran had a distinguished career in law and politics. Oran was a member of the Texas Secession Committee and a supporter of Texas' vote to Secede from the Union and join the Confederacy. He raised, and was Colonel of, the 11th Texas Infantry, Ector's Brigade, Walker's Division, CSA. He was elected the first post-reconstruction Governor of Texas in 1878, took office in 1879, was re-elected in 1880 and left office at the beginning of 1883 when the new governor took office. Before leaving he signed the bill creating the university school fund, which created the University of Texas. He served as the University's first dean of the newly created University of Texas School of Law. He died at his Texas home on May 19, 1898.

Also in Laurens County, on February 16 1801 James Roberts died and his estate settlement list a number of Roberts with interest in the estate. The buyers were: John Fullare, Peter Roberts, James Hamilton, James Roberts, A. Rodgers, Isham Fullare, William Runnals, James A. Williams, Isaac Michel, Timothy Dunaho, Zeb Mathis, George Roberts, John Wiseman, Johnston Ball(Bell), Benjaman Drumman, Joseph Roberts, William George, Archbald McCoy, Dannel Whitehead, Edmond Roberts, John Morris, Mary Roberts, Isaac Welchel, Patrick Rodgers, Samuel Whitehead, Moses Madden. Richard Shackelford & William Bailey executors.

**Zachariah Roberts** was married to **Mary Hitchcock**, the daughter of **John Hitchcock**. Source – Will of **John Hitchcock** 1/23/1785- Chester County Deed 2/2/1754 – Chester County Indenture of Lease and Release 1/6/1789. From the Chester County Deed Book "T" we know that they had at least two children, a son Edward and a Daughter Sally, who married Robert Jones. With both of their parents dead the children sold the land Mary had inherited from Zachariah to Allen DeGraffenreid

**Lewis Roberts** was the administrator of William Roberts' estate. This normally indicates a close relationship. I suspect they were brothers. Source – Administrator of William's estate 4/6/1790.

**William Roberts** was married to **Elizabeth Lee.** Source – Chester County Quit Claim February 1810. (This is our William Roberts, the son of Nicholas, who was called "Dogwood Bill."

**Lewis Roberts** was married to Ellen. Source – Chester County Deed December 1824. I don't know where this Lewis fits into our family's history

**Alexander Roberts** was married to **Permely Loveless Estes**. She was the daughter of **John** and **Sarah Estes**. Source – Chester County Will Book A-1, Page 79 – Probated April 1849.

**John Roberts** (son of Elder Nicholas Roberts) was married to Miss Malone. She was the daughter of **Thomas Malone** Source – Fairfield County Deed Book HH, Page 219 – 1830

Green BORN Roberts was married to Lucy Taylor. She was the widow of John Taylor. Source – Fairfield County Deed January 14, 1830

In addition to old records we have census reports, which can fill in a few more gaps in our knowledge of the early ancestors. The first census of the United States was conducted in 1790. That census recorded the Head of Household by name with some information about the number of people in the household.

- The number of free white males over 16 years old
- The number of free white males under 16 years old
- The number of free white females of any age
- The number of all other persons
- The number of slaves

The 1790 census for the Chester District list three Roberts.

**Archibald Roberts**, whose household included a male over 16; 3 males under 16; and 4 females.

**Lewis Roberts**, whose household included a male over 16; 2 males under 16; and 2 females.

**William Roberts**, whose household included a male over 16; 3 males under 16; and 2 females

There were four Roberts recorded on the 1790 census for Fairfield District.

**Nicholas Roberts**, whose household included 2 males over 16; 2 males under 16 and; 4 females.

**Aaron Roberts** whose household included 2 males over 16; 1 male under 16 and; 4 females.

**Richard Roberts** whose household included 1 male over 16; 1 male under 16 and 2 females.

Another **Richard Roberts** whose household included 1 male over 16; 2 males under 16 and; 1 female.

1800 CENSUS CHESTER COUNTY

**Archibald Roberts** – The males in this household were: one male less than 10 years old; one male between 10-16; and one male over 45. The females in this household were: two under 10 years old; one between 10-16; and one over 45 years old.

**Isaac Roberts** with one male less than 10 years old and one male from 16-26. The females in the household were two under 10 years old and one between 16-26 years old.

**Luis Roberts**(probably should be either Louis or Lewis). – The males in this household were two less than 10 years old; one male between 10-16; and one male between 26-45. The females in this household were two under 10 years old; one between 10-16; and one between 26-45 years old.

**Thomas Roberts** -- The males in this household were one less than 10 years old; and one between 26-45. The females in this household were two under 10 years old; one between 10-16; and one between 26-45 years old.

William Roberts -- The males in this household were two less than 10 years old; and

one between 26-45. The females in this household were one under 10 years old; and one between 26-45 years old.

**William Roberts** -- The males in this household were three less than 10 years old; three between 10-16; one between 26-45; and one over 45 year old. The females in this household were one under 10 years old; one between 10-16; and one over 45 years old.

The1810 census of Fairfield list 6 Roberts William Roberts, Lewis Roberts, Nicholas Roberts, John Roberts, Benjamin Roberts and Aaron Roberts.

The neighbors of Nicholas Roberts as implied from their order on the 1810 census were Magry (probably Mabrey) Freeman, Sarah Stone, John Roberts, Jane Thompson, Robert Thompson, Benjamin Dove, Anderson Pannell, John Kirkpatrick, Thomas Halsey.

The neighbors of William Roberts as implied from their order on the 1810 census were: Jonathan Pannell, Luke Pannell, Ephraim Lyles, Elizabeth Pannell, Isom (Isham) Lee, Lewis Roberts

The Chester County 1820 Census list Benjamin Roberts with three males under 10, one from 10-15 and one 26-40. Females are 2 under 10 and one 26-45. David Roberts with two males under 10, 1 from 16-26 and 2 over 45. Females are one 16-26. Kezh (possibly Hesikiah) with one male 16-18 and one male 16-26 Head of Household and one female over 45. Samuel with two males under 10 and on male 26-45. Females include one under 10 and one 26-45.

There is also a listing for a Mrs. Roberts in the 1820 Census with one male under 10 and one male 16-26. For females it is one 10-16. This is a strange listing which may be a misprint in the records or a transcription error.

Starting with the 1850 census all persons in the household were enumerated by name, age, sex and place of birth. Unfortunately, the census takers for Chester and Fairfield were sloppy writers and both censuses are difficult to readied

All of the data I have gathered allows us to make many assumptions but it allows us to prove few of them. I suspect that **Nicholas** Roberts came to this area with some close relatives, probably brothers. Their names were probably **Archibald Roberts**, **Lewis Roberts**, **William Roberts**, **John Roberts** and **Zacharia Roberts**. This is only an assumption. The proof is out there somewhere waiting for one of us to find it.

# Mary Roberts and Joshua Davis

The public record also allows us a few glimpses into the personal life of our early Roberts. Usually what gets recorded in court records is not our best behavior, but there is no shame to us from our ancestor's behavior. It does however help us understand their humanity.

There was a young lady named **Mary Roberts** who became pregnant and bore a son out of wedlock. She named her son John. The father of Mary's child was **Joshua Davis** the son of **Jeremiah Davis** and **Frances Davis**. Joshua married **Hannah Colvin**. At this point I do not know if the marriage was before or after his liaison with **Mary Roberts**.

I cannot identify Mary Roberts but the Davis and Roberts families were closely related. **Isaac Roberts**, son of **Archibald Roberts** married Joshua's sister **Elizabeth Davis**. The estate papers of both Jeremiah Davis and Joshua Davis list many of our relatives as either appraisers or estate purchasers. So Mary Roberts is, in all probability, our ancestor.

Joshua did not voluntarily support either Mary or their child. Mary must have relied upon

charity to support herself and her child and, as was the custom in those days, the state filed suit against **Joshua Davis** in 1813 to reclaim the state money expended and to force Joshua to support both his paramour and their child. Joshua pleaded guilty and admitted his paternity but he still didn't pay what the court ordered.

At some point Mary became convinced to relocate, so she and her son John moved to Alabama where a large number of Roberts' and Davis' had already emigrated. For some reason Mary was under the care of **William Halsey** (Halsell) himself the father of a child out of wedlock with Mary Jane Davis.

Later when Joshua Davis died back in Chester County, Mary filed suit against his estate for the money Joshua had not paid for the support of the child. She prevailed and the money owed to her was paid out of his estate, additionally, her son John was recognized as an heir and he received a share of the estate.

Unfortunately, we have lost track of both Mary and her son. I would like to have their genealogy included in this history and hope one day we can discover what happened to them.
