Longtown in Fairfield Co. and near the Kershaw Co. line and almost in sight of the Wateree River, was named for the early LONG family who first settled there. It was once an important point and was at the head of the river boating on the Wateree River and hence a trading point of some interest... Longtown was settle by many of the first families of S.C...ADAMSON...BELTON...JONES...STARK...MICKLE...HARRISON...ROCHELLE...and PEAY was the most prominent of the Longtown families...Nicholas PEAY had the finest house in S.C. before the Civil War...Nicholas PEAY and many other Peays are buried in the Longtown Baptist Church Yard Longtown Baptist church was an early church and established before the Rev. and first as a Union Church in which the Presbyterians used it two Sundays a month and the Baptists used it the other two Sundays...Later a division was made and the Pres. went up the road a mile or two and estab. the Longtown Pres. church after 1800 and gave the old site to the Baptists.. The old Baptist church building has been torn down and nothing remains save the grave yard which has some very handsome tombs...Most of the PEAY family of the earlier generation

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are buried there...Tombstones(not all)
