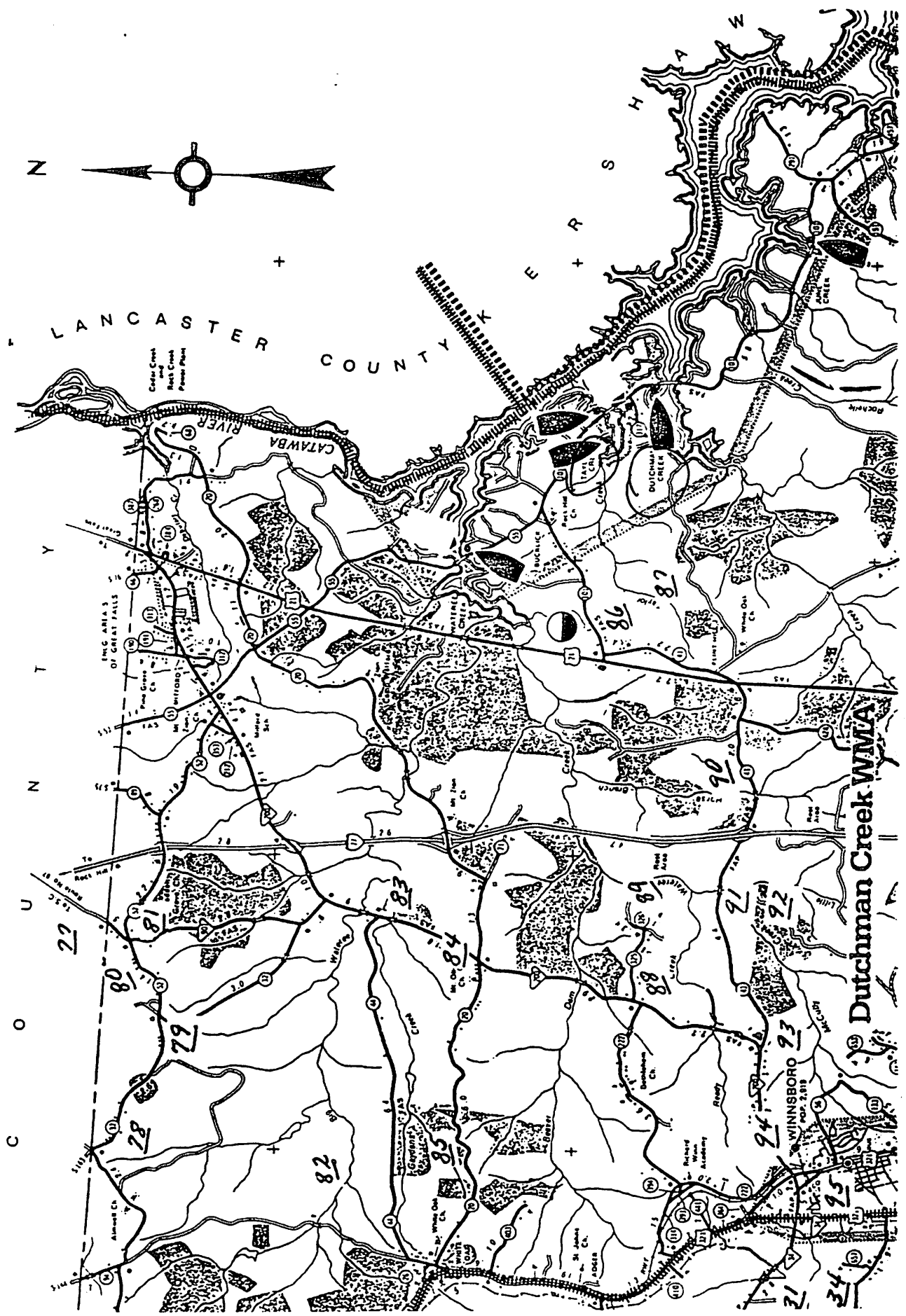

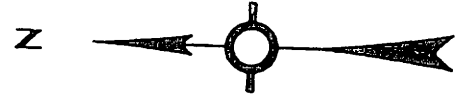

To the memory of Captain James Rochelle son of James and Margaret
Rochelle, who was born June 15, 1789 and departed this life April 6,
1837 age 47 years 9 months and 21 days. To where this silent marble
weeps a father friend and husband sleeps. A heart within whose peaceful
cell affection virtue, loved to dwell.

Nor Pain, nor grief, nor anxious fear invade the bonds, no mortal
woes can reach the silent sleeper here and angels watch his soft
repose.

Dear Mrs. Brooke. On behalf of Mrs. Martin of Alabama
. . . I found a monument to a Capt. Rochelle and wife, near
the farm of an old negro named John B. Harrison, who lives near
the Durham place. He said the place was called Rochelle Hill.

"My sister told me that a Rochelle married a Harrison and moved
out West.

One of my brothers said that (years ago) (he visited an old
graveyard) between Dutchman's and Rochelle Creeks, when they
came to a graveyard with a wall around it. There was a tall, *B. K. R.*
square granite monument eight or ten feet high to Gen. Rochelle.
(Later we learned that it couldn't have been "General") (H.B.R.)

I sent a photographer to make pictures of the stone, but none
was left in the graveyard. The graves were "cleaned up" about
twenty years ago, during the depression, an old negro told me.

"a friend once said that he had heard of gravestones being taken
from isolated graveyards in Chester Co., and I know of one taken
near Monticello."
