NOTE BY ROBERT HILL Sr: Yes, William Woodward fought in the Revolution and served one session in the U.S. Congress.

1. MOSES HILL, the ancestor of Mrs. Nicholson, was born in 1758. He died in Fairfield County (S.C.) 7-1-1821...His wife was SAVILLA RODEN, who was born in 1759 and died in Alabama, 23 July 1844...Their children:

NOTE BY ROBERT R. HILL: Later research shows the following additional data for the above children:

- a. Thomas Hill b. 1780, m. ca 1805 to Jemima Woodward, and died between January and May of 1824 in Fairfield Co., S.C. (my 3rd great grandfather).
- b. James Hill b. 21 Nov 1782, m. 10th June 1806 to Susannah Glenn, d. 27 October 1854 in Union Co., S.C.
- c. Sarah Hill, b. ca. 1785. m. Rev. John Pearson, they moved to Green Co., Ala ca. Apr. or May 1831. She d. ca. 1831-1835.
- d. Littleton Hill, born ca. 1788-1790, never married, said to have died in late teens (after 1810?) He is named in remains of Moses Hill's bible. Buried by his father in Fairfield Co., S.C. (near Buckhead in Old Yongue Cemetery in unmarked grave).
- f. Elizabeth Harrison Hill, b. 29th January 1793, m. Stephen Terry on 4th July 1809, they moved to DeKalb Co., Ga., she died there 3rd December 1838.
- g. Moses Berry Hill, b. 1795, m. Mary Bowles Glenn, d. 14th October 1824 in Chester Co., S.C. (Buried at Carlisle S.C. in Union Co.)
- h. Harriet Windham Hill, b. 5th March 1802, m. ca. 1818-1819 to Edward Picket Mobley, (lived life entirely in Fairfield Co.), d. on 30th April 1857.
- i. George Washington Hill, b. in September 1803, m. Sarah A. Moore, moved to Green Co., Ala with widowed mother and sister Rebecca, he d. there on 8th September 1857.
- j. Rebecca Carlisle Hill, b. 20th December 1807. m. Dr. John Trezevant DeGraffenreid on 25th March 1828, They moved to Green Co., Ala, along with her widowed mother and brother George ca. 1831, she d. there on 11th August 1842.

This ends the notes by Robert R. Hill Sr and the data was a result of years of investigation by Mrs. Jeannette B. Christopher, of Carlisle, S.C. (descendent of James Hill) and myself (descendent of Thomas Hill).
