I was unable to find any will or administration for Rhoden or Roden or any of the variations of the spellings, in the Charleston records. I examined more than 100 books of Probate records and not a single entry. I will admit that with the system used in Charleston, that it will be very easy to miss an administration. The wills are much easier and mre simple to find.

The deed books are from 1680 up to now After 1800 there is a master Index...before 1800 there is a master Index for some of the sets of books. There are over 400 books and they are piled to the ceiling (14 foot high) and step ladders have to be used to secure the books towards the top. It is a task that is hard. I did find your Savilla Roden as a witness, but I was unable to find the name of her father....THREE RODEN Deeds follow. and they were all the Roden data I was able to find.

- Lazarus Moore & dower by wife, Barah Moore, 1 Dec. 1778 a deed to William Roden of the arish of St. Mark in Craven County, and consideration 300 & and of my original grant on Sandy River dated 24 Nov. 1787 to Lazarus Moore../Wit. Thomas Roden, John Roden & Dorothea Moore..Amos Tims J.P.
- execute a deed for the Lazarus Moore land grant (See #53) to Charles Humphreys./Wit. James & Amy Tims & John Humphreys before Amos Tims J.P.

- Savilla Roden was not married by 14 May 1778 for she acted as a witness to both deeds made by Thomas Roden to the NANCE men, Peter and Richard... I wonder if she was a daughter of Thomas Roden? Yes She was
- Amos Time with dower by his wife, Frances Time, 13 Nov. 1778, a deed to James Timms./Wit. Robert Sanders, Joseph Time & Austin Montray.
- There seems some indication that there may have been some sort of relationship between the Nance, the Time and the Roden families, as well as with the [sbell family, However I found no direct proof of such.
- The week before I went to Charleston, a client came by for me in her car and we spent the day at work in Edgefield. I had no time for any work save on the client's lines...HOWEVER I did find some six or more early Rhoden administrations and all by 1830...I had no time to check any of them...I also found many Hill administrations in Edgefield.
- 60 CALDWELL... In Charleston, no 'aldwell data of any use to you was found.... In fact there is but little on Caldwell in the Charleston files up to 1785... what little that was there gave no genealogy.... However the Court of Equity, I did not attempt to check.

- THOMAS RODEN with dower by Mary Roden...4-8-1786 in Chester a deed to William Head for 62 L sterling..100a on eastern side of John Moberly's land...being a part of the 800a grtd. to John Brown in 1772 and transferred to Thomas Roden.

 James Rodin aged 26-45...wife aged 26-45....girl inder age 10.

 This James was nearer 26 than 45 and wife nearer 26 than 16.
- Thomas Roden was one of the earliest Rodens in Chester Co. and may have died there in 1809. He probably came with his brothers, Zodak, John Sr. William Roden Comments by Nicolson.

 - John Roden over age 45..... wife seems not to show in this census.
 - 1 male aged 16-26 & likely a married son or son in law.
