THE RUFF FAMILY OF SOUTH CAROLINA

The South Carolina Ruffs can trace their ancestry back to three German brothers who arrived in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, from Amsterdam in the 1730s. They worked their way down the Appalachian mountains, eventually settling in South Carolina. The three brothers were

Johann Sebastian Ruff, probably the oldest of the three, who settled near the waters of Twelve Mile Creek south of the Saluda River, in what is now Lexington County. On old South Carolina maps, Sebastian Ruff's property was marked "Ruff's Hills." His son

changed the spelling to Roof.

George Ruff built his home near the Newberry - Lexington county line in what was at that time Ninety - Six District. His house was at the foot of Little Mountain, then called Ruff's Mountain. His descendents still reside in Newberry County. The earliest land grant

in South Carolina to a Ruff was made to George in 1751.

Daniel Ruff, the youngest brother, settled in Dobbs County, North Carolina. He and some of his sons were listed as Revolutionary soldiers from that county. The Daniel Ruff (1771 - 1829) who moved to South Carolina sometime after 1790 must have been a much younger son or even a grandson of the original brother Daniel who landed in Philadelphia in the 1730s. This Daniel Ruff is the earliest certain ancestor of the family; he settled in the Fairfield District.1

I. Daniel Ruff (2/28/1771 - 11/29/1829), who was said never to have been sick a day in his life. "He died at 14 minutes past twelve o'clock by choking on a piece of meat."

II Silas W. Ruff (6/11/1795 - 10/10/1876), who married Judith Weston Elkin (8/1/1807 - 9/12/1878) on March 1, 1827. She was the daughter of James Elkin and Sarah Pearson Elkin. See Raiford Family data. James was the son of David and Ann Elkin. Twelve children.

III David Wesley Ruff (12/12/1827 - 5/24/1862), who married Isabella Nelson ("Aunt Izzy" to ADC) on September 29, 1858. He died in Ashland Hospital in Virginia, leaving three minor children under the guardianship of Thomas

¹ A Ruff descendant, William R. Troxler of Winnsboro, SC, provided information on the three immigrant brothers. The data on children after that comes from wills and other records in the South Carolina Archives and from Bible records in the family.

The family sent ADC to live with her half-sister "Janie" Montgomery in Winston Salem, NC, and attend school so that she could escape the domineering Simmie.

He had red hair and beard and paid ADC five cents for every gray hair she would pluck. Red sometimes looked gray in the firelight! [Mary Virginia Rabb [Mamie] had Chappell ancestors. Robert Chappell (1732 - 1790) was the father of John Chappell (1771 - 1835), who married Sibyl Ruff (1792 - 1867) in 1816. They were the parents of Laban Fitzalan Chappell and Nancy Savilla Chappell (1824 - 1899). Charles Rabb (1781 - 1869) married Mary Harrison (1800 - 1876). Their son, Jonathan Harrison Rabb (1819 - 1884), married Nancy Savilla Chappell. They were the parents of Mary Virginia Rabb. A sister of Mamie Rabb, Elizabeth Rabb, is said to have married a Hammiter.} Six children.

III William Henry Ruff (6/21/1847 - 5/31/1933), who married Annice Hampton Stearns (died 12/5/1925) on July 6, 1878. "Aunty Ruff" was from Duluth, Minnesota, and met Uncle Billy when she was visiting relatives in South Carolina. There was some sort of family connection. ADC was especially

fond of "Aunty" and recalled liking Aunty's aunt, Sarah Sterns, who visited from California. [A sister or half-sister of Aunty, Visa Sterns, married — Patterson of Columbia and had two children, Annie Patterson and Ravenel Patterson. Ravenel Patterson married Norma Brinson. Their daughter, Margaret Patterson, married Robert Edmunds, son of Pierre and Rosa (Richard) Edmunds. RCS called the latter "Aunt" Rosa, as there were very close ties of friendship between the Richard sisters and ADC. RCS was named Margaret (a first name she never used) for Margaret Richard, a writer and invalid sister of Rosa Edmunds.] Uncle Billy was totally deaf, the result of exposure to loud cannon fire during the Civil War. Two children, both of whom were active in the UDC, DAR, and Colonial Dames and possessed family records.
