After the war he lived with a sister of his mother who married Rev. James Smart who lived in Beaufort District, South Carolina. He had a brother and sister who died without children.

Sarah Arledge at the death of Nathaniel Thompson was the widow of Samuel Arledge. She was Sarah Goff and was a daughter of Elizabeth Davis or Elizabeth Thompson before Elizabeth married the Davis. She was living with Nathaniel Thompson when he died. She married Lee D. Arick
